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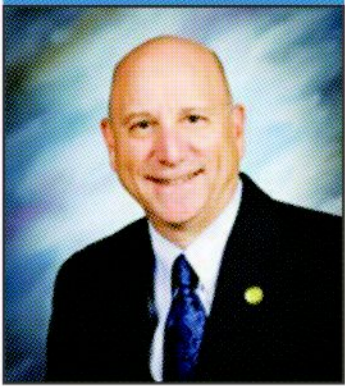

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Gladstone Street Hosts Annual Career Day

AZUSA - Gladstone Street Elementary School students got a glimpse inside the life of Wayne Kalama, a Disney animator and Azusa Unified School District student support assistant, who showed off a 3-D replica of the "Pirates of the Caribbean" Black Pearl ship he created for a Disney pop-up book during Gladstone Street's second annual Career Day on March 25.

"Bringing in professionals to talk about what it takes to build a career really resonates with the students," Gladstone Street Principal Arthur Hinojosa said. "It's entertaining and informative, and provides our kids an extra incentive to bolster their reading, writing and mathematics skills, so that they too can pursue their dream job."

Gladstone Street kindergarteners through fifth-graders participated in the career day, which featured 18 professionals who spoke in classrooms, or, if their line of work involved a vehicle, on the campus field.

helped me immensely in my career," Nike merchandizing coordinator Tiffany Hendrix told a group of Gladstone Street students.

Professionals gave 25-minute presentations discussing what type of schooling and training they received, what they like most about their job and provided interesting facts about their profession. They

finished with a question-and-answer period.

"We encourage our students to be aware that it is never too

early to think about their future, and they can start researching various career paths while still in elementary

school," Azusa Unified Superintendent Dr. Linda Kaminski said. "Gladstone Street does an excellent job of bringing in professionals that capture the imagination of their students."

Huff Formally Introduces Measure to Combat Drugged Driving



SACRAMENTO - Senator Bob Huff (R-San Dimas) unveiled legislation during a news conference held April 5th at the State Capitol, which is designed to crack down on the growing problem of drugged drivers on California roads. SB 1462 will allow law enforcement officers to use oral fluid drug screening tests when there is probable cause that a driver is impaired and the driver has failed sobriety field tests.

Senator Huff's legislation is sponsored by the California Police Chiefs Association, California Narcotic Officers Association and We Save Lives, an international coalition that is committed to saving lives by preventing crashes and crimes from the 3 Ds: Drunk, Drugged, and Distracted driving.

"Drugged driving is quickly becoming a serious public health and safety problem that is under-reported, under-enforced and under-recognized," said Senator Huff. "We lack the same kind of deterrents for drugged driving as we do for drunk driving, yet highway safety hazards and fatalities are increasing with widespread prescription and illicit drug abuse across all demographics."

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) in 2014 found the number of drivers with the presence of drugs in their system has been dramatically increasing:

- From 16.3 percent of drivers on weekend nights in 2007, to 20 percent in 2014.
- In California alone, drivers

killed in crashes that tested positive for drugs increased from 27.8 percent in 2009 to 39.6 percent in 2013.

"The NHTSA estimates that more than a half million Americans are injured in DUI-D crashes each year, and that DUI-D collisions cost the U.S. economy more than \$60 billion annually."

SB 1462 will allow law enforcement to use oral fluid roadside tests as a screening device to detect drivers with drugs in their system when there is probable cause that an officer suspects suspicious or reckless driving and the driver has already failed field sobriety tests.

"Police departments in

Bakersfield, Fullerton, Los Angeles and Sacramento tested oral swabs during 2013 and 2014, with assistance from the California Office of Traffic Safety and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration," said Senator Huff. "They do not replace blood tests, which deliver more conclusive detail about the exact concentration of legal and illegal substances in a person's blood. However, oral swabs are the only way to quickly and accurately test for the presence of six of the most common drugs of abuse."

SB 1462 faces its first policy committee hearing on April 19th in the Senate Public Safety Committee.

The West Covina Medical Center is located at 725 S. Orange Avenue, West Covina. For further information regarding any services you may call the hospital at (626) 338-8481.

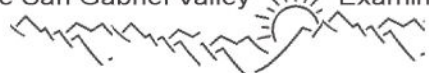

Take 10 Minutes To Stop Leaks



EPA reminds consumers to detect leaks and stop them in their tracks before they add 10 percent to your water bill.

Want to stop wasting water—and money—at home? Become a leak detective! According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the average American household has leaks that waste more than 10,000 gallons of water every year, or the amount of water needed to wash 270 loads of laundry.

But if you have 10 minutes, these clues can help you detect and fix leaks throughout your home:

- Check your utility bill. During the winter, if a family of four is using more than 12,000 gallons of water per month, it could be the clue to a leak.
- Read your water meter. Check your water meter-often

near the curb in front of your home or in the basement-during a period when no water is being used. If the reading is not exactly the same after two or three hours, you could have a leak.

- Take a 10-minute toilet test. Put a few drops of food coloring into the tank at the back of your toilet and let it sit for 10 minutes. If color shows up in the bowl, you have a leak. Make sure to flush after to avoid staining, and consider replacing your old toilet flapper if it is torn or worn.

While you're waiting for your toilet test, here are other places to investigate for leaks around the home:

- In the bathroom, tighten

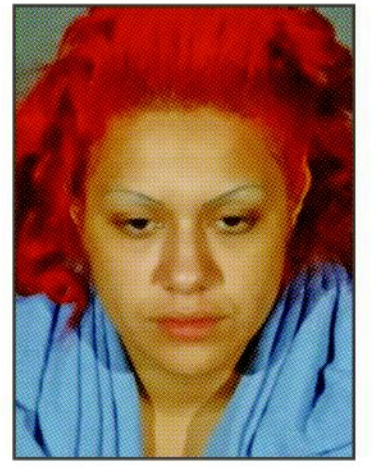
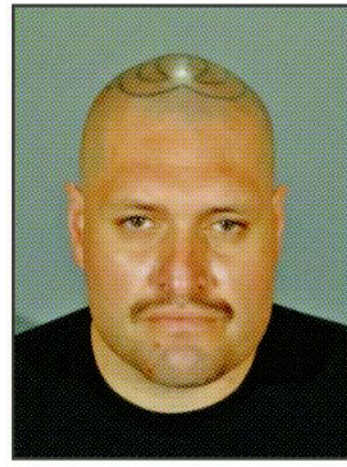
showerhead connections with a wrench or use a little pipe tape to stop those stray sprays and drips that are draining your water bill. To save even more, twist WaterSense labeled faucet aerators on your bathroom sink faucets, which can save the average family 700 gallons of water per year and enough energy to run a hair dryer 10 minutes per day!

- In the kitchen, check beneath the sink for puddles under pipes. Don't forget the laundry or utility room!

- Outside, check that your hose connections are tight and your sprinkler system is in good working order. An irrigation system that has a leak 1/32nd of an inch in diameter (about the thickness of a dime) can waste about 6,300 gallons of water per month!

Gang Members Busted in Covina, Guns, Stolen Car and Drugs Recovered

COVINA - On Friday, April 8, at approximately 11:45 PM, Covina Police Officers were doing extra patrol in an area that has shown a recent spike in criminal activity. While in the area, officers initiated a traffic stop of a suspicious vehicle with no license plates in the area of the 1000 W. Cypress. During the traffic stop, officers determined the three occupants of the vehicle were all documented gang members and were coming from an area associated with narcotic sales.

A records check of the "vehicle identification number" showed the vehicle had been reported stolen out of Las Vegas. As officers continued their investigation, they noticed the

vehicle had an apparent bullet hole in the driver's door and the driver, Ricardo Castillo, 35 year old resident of Baldwin Park who appeared to have an identifying tattoo on top of his head, later admitted that the car had been shot at in the City of Baldwin Park approximately 8 days ago.

The front passenger in the vehicle, Mary Leos, a 26 years old resident of Baldwin Park, was found to have a no bail warrants and was in possession of stolen property.

The rear passenger in the vehicle, Marco Villaneda, a 35 year old resident of West Covina, was found to be in possession of approximately 2 ounces of methamphetamine and a loaded hand gun.

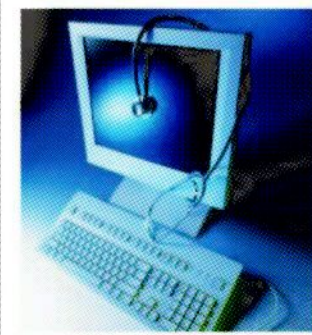
Richard Castillo was arrested for auto theft, possession of a loaded firearm, driving with a suspended license. Marco Villaneda was arrested for stolen vehicle, possession of drugs, felon in possession of a weapon and bail was set at \$35,000.

Mary Leos was arrested for auto theft, possession of stolen property, felony warrants, she is being held without bail.

All three are career criminal with long records.

It appears that the bail may have been set low for two of the criminals because it is likely that they may have been able to provide information on other gang members in the area. The two male suspects have bailed out of jail.

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The Fed's 2% Inflation Forecast Is Not Credible

Inflation (Merriam-Webster): A continuing rise in the general price level usually attributed to an increase in the volume of money and credit relative to available goods and services.

Inflation rates are picking up, both headline and core, from last year's extraordinarily low levels. But will they continue to rise all the way to and through 2%, as the Fed expects, or will they stop rising and fall back, as they did in 2010 and 2014? Given the Fed's inability to forecast inflation—they've been calling for 2% in 2 years since 2009—and their decision to now make policy based on their broken forecast, it's interesting to consider what's behind the Fed's forecast which ultimately determines their monetary policy. For those outside the Fed, we have the luxury of admitting we don't know where inflation comes from.

Or that we kind of know, but understand it is increasingly complicated, global, and unpredictable. For example, we used to believe inflation would rise if the Fed ran a printing press and flooded the economy with currency, but the Bank of Japan is doing exactly that—printing almost 1 trillion yen worth of 10,000 yen notes a year to fund its bond purchase program—and inflation is running at 0.2%. As for the cash, it apparently sparked a run on safes rather than a rise in prices.

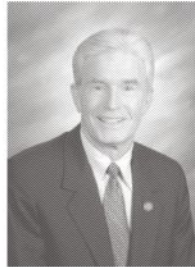
Even the Fed admits inflation is more complicated than it once thought. Yellen recently widened the list of factors contributing to inflation to four, with the two new ones at the bottom.

1. Inflation expectations
2. Labor slack
3. Oil prices
4. The dollar and international demand

The Fed tends to talk about the first two as if they are permanent and dismiss the last two as transitory and outside their control. Actually, inflation expectations are the only one of these four factors that has ever been unchanged through a business cycle. The rest all fluctuate, with movement in oil tending to change directions the fastest, followed by labor slack and the dollar.

And yet, even if something can be produced inexpensively, the price won't stay low for long if

demand outstrips supply. Flood an economy with cheap imports and inflation may eventually rise if money and credit are growing fast enough to allow demand to outpace supply. True inflation, fueled by too much cash and credit in the system, is broad based.

The inflation of the 1970s is a good example. When high oil prices caused a recession in 1973, the Fed responded by lowering rates, encouraging credit and growing money supply. Soon, just about everything was rising in price. If the Fed had held the line on money growth, as Volcker later did, surging gas prices would be offset to some extent by other prices falling, as households would be forced to choose where to spend their limited resources and suppliers would have to cut prices to maintain sales. As a result, inflation might have returned to its prior rate after the initial shock.

The same could be true of disinflation or deflation. When the price of one good or service falls, it frees up household resources, allowing other prices to rise. Tumbling energy prices, then, could be accompanied by an increase in inflation elsewhere. There really isn't much evidence of that, however.

A CLOSER LOOK

For over a year, one Fed official has made the common-sense argument that when oil prices stop falling and the dollar stops rising (stronger dollar = cheaper imports) the inflation rate will rise. In the past couple of months, we have seen it in action. The headline PCE inflation rate rose from a low of 0.3% to 0.4% primarily because gasoline prices are not falling as they were a year ago. A smaller gasoline drop pulls headline inflation down less from the core than a big drop, and recent price increases may help generate inflation.

MESSAGE FROM THE

MARKETS

According to Chair Yellen, the Fed raised rates in December for four reasons:

1. Inflation expectations were stable (they were not, but the Fed says they were)
2. The labor market was close to full employment
3. Job growth was expected to further tighten the labor market
4. The Fed feared systemic risks if rates stayed near zero for too long

In a Wednesday night speech in New York, St. Louis Fed President James Bullard explained the urgency to tighten is diminished because inflation expectations have fallen and the risk of asset bubbles has presumably diminished.

But what if inflation doesn't necessarily come from the four things on the Fed's list? After all, these four are the inputs to the Fed's model that has predicted 2% inflation in two years since 2009. What if money and credit create inflation by allowing demand to outstrip productive capacity, and what if—in this globally integrated world—it's global money and credit growth that matters?

A St. Louis Fed paper has pointed to several components that are considered contributors: Copper is down 60%. Steel is down more than 50%. Coal is down more than oil. Global equities have cratered and global shipping costs are at a 40-yr low. Supply exceeds demand in a huge variety of goods and services.

To worry about inflation in this environment is nuts. Nevertheless, inflation is going to tick up for another several months as the effect of oil price weakness and dollar strength continue to fade. It isn't likely to get to 2%, certainly not on a sustained basis, but movement in that direction will bolster the Fed's confidence in its forecast even as the rest of Wall Street is increasingly skeptical. As a result, the Fed is likely to continue raising rates this year. Each increase raises the risk of recession before 2018, and ironically each increase raises the risk of much lower inflation and interest rates down the road.

Financial - Ask Julia

My husband and I have to choose between saving for retirement and having life insurance because we cannot afford both. What do you suggest?

You really can have both! Nowadays, insurance companies are offering life insurance policies with cash-value accumulation potential that can be used while you are living! The tax advantages are incredible, too.

My investment broker says I should have a more diversified investment portfolio - small cap, mid-cap, large-cap, bonds. Is this right? What should I do?

Diversification is important in order to help protect yourself against losses. I'd encourage you to go beyond a diversified investment portfolio. Consider an investment strategy with a more diversified product portfolio. You probably already have a checking account for everyday expenses. You might have a savings account, CD, or money-market account for occasional, or emergency, expenses. But, do you have an IRA, or a Roth IRA? Do you have life insurance with living benefits like a cash value account?

How are Social Security benefits calculated, and is it better to start collecting at the youngest retirement age, or wait?

Your 35 highest-paid years in the workforce are used to calculate your Social Security benefits. There could be as much as an 8-percent annual increase in the amount you could receive for

each year that you wait, up to age 70. Some take their chances that they will live long beyond what the chart for their life expectancy indicates, so they choose to start collecting earlier.

Are there any exceptions to taking money from my tax-deferred retirement account before I'm 59 1/2 without having to pay that 10% federal income tax penalty?

Although you will still have to pay taxes on money taken from your tax-deferred retirement account, there are exceptions that negate the 10% penalty. If it's an employee-sponsored plan, you might be able to access funds if: you borrow some, you become disabled, you get substantially equal payments, you leave that employer, you need funds for medical care, you obtain a Qualified Domestic Relations Order, or, you die (your beneficiary receives taxable funds). If your tax-deferred retirement account is an IRA, you might be able to access

funds if: you become disabled, you get substantially equal payments, you have unreimbursed medical expenses in excess of 10 percent of your adjusted gross income, for health insurance premiums if you are unemployed, or if you die (again, your beneficiary receives taxable funds).

I have a small business with 12 employees. I cannot afford to "match" the employee's contributions. Is there a good retirement plan for us?

Yes, and it's possible to make it look like you are "matching." By having each employee invest in an IRA within a specific type of annuity, the insurance company backing the annuity is willing to give a percentage bonus on money put into that annuity for a specific number of years. There are guidelines and limitations, but this might be just what you're looking for as a small business. It's easy, too, without the usual 401k-type paperwork and fees.

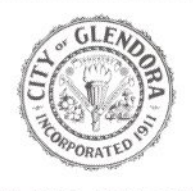

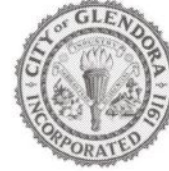

PUBLIC HEARING MEETING LOCATION AND DATE

The City of Glendora is requesting public review and comment on its Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program Annual Action Plan for FY 2016-2017. The draft report was available for a 30-day review period from March 22, 2016 through April 21, 2016. The Glendora City Council conducted a public hearing to review the draft plan at 7:00 P.M., at its March 22, 2016 City Council meeting. A second public hearing will be held on April 26, 2016 to approve submittal of the Plans to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

In compliance with the American with Disabilities Act, if you need special assistance to participate in the meeting, please contact the City of Glendora's City Clerk's Office at (626) 914-8210. Notification 48 hours prior to the April 26, 2016 City Council meeting will enable the City to make reasonable arrangements to ensure accessibility to the meeting.

BACKGROUND

Consolidated Plan: Every five years, the CDBG program requires the City to adopt a "Consolidated Plan," which establishes the goals and objectives of the City's CDBG program. During the development of this FY 2013-2018 Consolidated Plan, which forms the basis for establishing objectives and outcomes in the Strategic Plan and five (5) subsequent Annual Action Plans, the following priority needs and objectives were established:

- 1. Affordable Housing:** Promote, preserve, and assist in the development of affordable housing for low- and moderate-income residents, special needs groups, those at-risk of homelessness, and disproportionately impacted residents.
- 2. Fair Housing:** Promote fair and equal housing choice for all persons, promote housing that is accessible to and usable by persons with disabilities, and comply with the non-discrimination requirements of the various Fair Housing laws.
- 3. Infrastructure and Public Facilities:** Improve and expand infrastructure and public facilities that benefit low- and moderate-income neighborhoods and residents.
- 4. Economic and Human Development:** Provide for the economic development needs of low- and moderate-income persons and neighborhood target areas.
- 5. Administration and Planning:** Provide for administration and planning activities to develop housing and community development strategies and programs needed to carry out actions that address identified needs in the Consolidated Plan.

These established Priority Needs form the basis for allocating investments geographically within the jurisdiction during the five-year period and are a result of various community outreach efforts and consultation meetings developed under the Citizen Participation process.

Only eligible activities that received a High priority level in the FY 2013-2018 Consolidated Plan, will be funded during the five-year period.
Annual Action Plan: The Annual Action Plan is part of the Five-Year Consolidated Plan and serves as the City's application for funding from HUD. The City of Glendora will receive an allocation of \$251,468 of CDBG funds in fiscal year 2016-2017. In addition, approximately \$60,000 of program income will be available. The Glendora City Council will approve the final plan after the 30-day comment period at the April 26, 2016 meeting for the adoption of the Plan. This funding may be allocated to the following types of eligible projects:

- 1. Acquisition:** by purchase, long-term lease, and donation of real property for an eligible public purpose.
- 2. Disposition:** of real property acquired under the CDBG Program.
- 3. Construction and Rehabilitation:** of certain publicly owned facilities, such as (a) senior citizen centers; (b) parks and playgrounds; (c) community centers; (d) fire protection facilities and equipment; (e) sidewalks and street improvements; (f) water and sewer systems.
- 4. Rehabilitation of publicly and privately owned housing:** for low- and moderate-income households.
- 5. Public Services:** which are new or expanding, and directed toward meeting employment, crime prevention, child care, drug abuse prevention, homeless assistance, or other community service needs.
- 6. Removal of Architectural Barriers:** that restricts the mobility and accessibility of elderly or handicapped persons to publicly owned and privately owned buildings, facilities, and improvements.
- 7. Special Economic Development Activities:** that provide grants, loan guarantees and other forms of necessary or appropriate support to private "for profit" businesses to provide increasing employment opportunities and other public benefit.

While funding amounts are somewhat flexible, there are statutory limitations that restrict the amount of funding for Planning and Administration costs to not more than 20 percent of the annual grant allocation and limit public services to 15 percent of the annual grant allocation.

Based on the limited amount of resources available to the City, statutory restrictions, and the Priority Needs determined to have a high priority level, staff recommendations for the 2016-2017 CDBG One-Year Annual Action Plan are as follows:

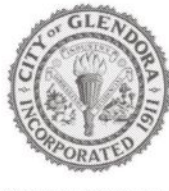

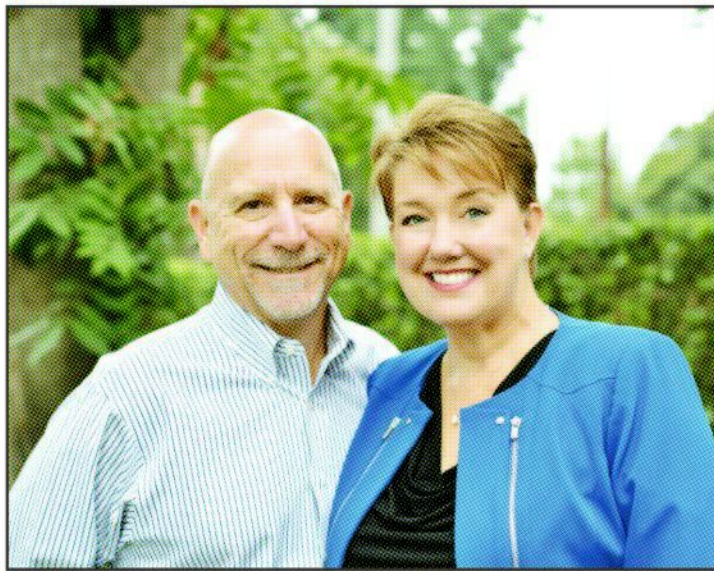
Glendora's Mayor Gene Murabito

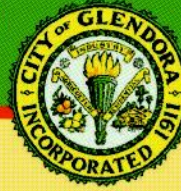
ning curriculum is aligned to Common Core State Standards and Next Generation Science Standards.

- Community Bike Ride** - 8:30am to 10am - This annual bike ride is back with a new route designed to showcase Glendora's charming residential neighborhoods to its majestic mountain areas. The ride is approximately six miles, and intended for individuals at least 12 years of age. Recycling proceeds will benefit community programs, services, and park facilities in Glendora. Location: City parking lot, enter on Vista Bonita.
- The Grand Eco-Tour of Glendora** - 10am to 2pm - Take an informative shuttle tour through the City of Glendora and discover its many ecologically significant points of interest. 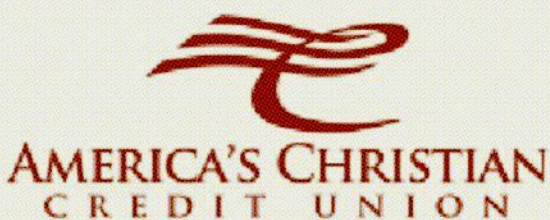
