CITY OF INDUSTRY - Monrovia Cub Scout Pack 66 had the privilege to visit and tour the state-of-the-art waste collection and recycling service plant that provides services to the City of Monrovia. Pack 66 Bear Den Leader Julie Bank organized this special tour for her Cubs. Pack 66 is fortunate to have such amazing leaders who reach out to the local communities to ensure that the Cub Scouts are enriched in knowledge and experiences. Accompanying the Den is Bear Den Leader Andrew Gentile and Wolf Den Leader Christine Caudillo.

The tour of the Athens facility was made extra special with the Executive Vice President, Gary M. Clifford II personally guiding the future leaders of our country through the plant, educating them on the latest technology in recycling and waste management. Accompanying the tour were elected City of Monrovia officials and City of Monrovia Library management. Pack 66 was in for a special treat on this tour.

Mr. Clifford educated the Cub Scouts on recycling sorting and just how much work it really is to sort your trash. The Cubs were memorized at all the materials that can be considered recyclable and just how Athens sorts the materials. The Cubs were allowed into the operations room

where Athens makes the magic happen. The control chairs looked like video game control simulators with control sticks on either arm rest and large monitors in front to operate the cranes to move the large waste that is deposited on the plant floor. On any given day, there can be over 5,500 tons of trash to be sorted and recycled.

The Cubs were escorted to the plant floor to see the finished product once the recyclables are bailed and ready for shipment to

the local dump or to the companies that have purchased the materials for reuse.

At the end of the tour each Cub Scout and Boy Scout were given a token to remember the tour, a miniature replica of the

Athens garbage trucks. Each scout on this tour learned so much about how recycling can help the environment and were able to complete their latest achievement.

this tour are: Bears Stefin B., Ammon H., WeBelos Matthew P., Wolves Elan G., Eric T., Gavin G., Nicholas L., Lions Josh P., Julian G. and Boy Scout Degas Peters from Duarte Troop 185. 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
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Arcadia Unified Named to College Board's Prestigious AP District Honor Roll

ARCADIA - The Arcadia Unified School District is one of just 22 school districts in California being honored by the College Board with placement on the 7th Annual AP® District Honor Roll. To receive this national recognition, the Arcadia Unified School District had to, since 2014, increase the number of students participating in AP courses while also increasing or maintaining the percentage of students earning AP Exam scores of 3 or higher. Reaching these impressive milestones demonstrates that Arcadia Unified is successfully identifying motivated and academically prepared students who are ready for AP courses.

"Three years ago we made a drastic change to our Advanced Placement program at Arcadia High School by allowing all students to enroll in AP and Honors courses," said Arcadia Unified School District Superintendent Dr. David Vannasdal. "This is a great validation of that transition, and we

have opened up many more opportunities for success for our students. I'm very proud of the work of our AP teachers and staff, along with the astonishing pass rate of our students."

Arcadia High School has a very robust AP and Honors program which offers students 20 AP courses along with eight Honors courses. Since transitioning to this "open access" format in the 2014-2015 school year, Arcadia High School has seen a significant increase in the number of students who are enrolling in AP and Honors courses, and the pass rate on the AP Exams has also increased. In 2016, 2,266 AP Exams were taken by 1,182 students with a remarkable 83.9% pass rate.

National data from 2016 show that among African American, Hispanic, and Native American students with a high degree of readiness for AP, only about half are participating. The Arcadia Unified School District is committed to expanding the availability of AP courses among prepared and motivated students of all backgrounds.

"Congratulations to all the teachers and administrators in the Arcadia Unified School District who have worked so tirelessly to both expand access to AP and also to help students succeed on the AP Exams," said Trevor Packer, the College Board's head of AP and Instruction. "These teachers and administrators are delivering real opportunity at Arcadia High and classrooms, and students are rising to the challenge."

In 2016, more than 4,000 colleges and universities around the world received AP scores for college credit, advanced

placement, or both, and/or consideration in the admission process.

Inclusion on the 7th Annual AP District Honor Roll is based on a review of three years of AP data, from 2014 to 2016, looking across 37 AP Exams, including world language and culture. The following criteria were used.

Districts must:

- Increase participation/access to AP by at least 4% in large districts, at least 6% in medium districts, and at least 11% in small districts;
- Increase or maintain the percentage of exams taken by black/African American, Hispanic/Latino, and American Indian/Alaska Native students who scored 3+ on at least one AP Exam; and
- Improve or maintain performance levels when comparing the 2016 percentage of students scoring a 3 or higher to the 2014 percentage, unless the district has already attained a performance level at which more than 70% of its AP students earn a 3 or higher.

When these outcomes have been achieved among an AP student population in which 30% or more are underrepresented minority students (black/African American, Hispanic/Latino, and American Indian/Alaska Native) and/or 30% or more are low-income students (students who qualify for free or reduced-price lunch), a symbol has been affixed to the district name to highlight this work.

Arcadia Unified is one of only two districts in Los Angeles County, Lynwood Unified School District is the other, to be named to the prestigious AP District Honor Roll. Arcadia Unified was also named to the AP District Honor Roll in 2010.

Baldwin Park Unified Board of Education Names 2016-17 Officers

BALDWIN PARK - The Governing Board of Education held its annual organization meeting on December 6, selecting Christina Lucero as president of the Board of Education for another term, marking her second consecutive year.

Teresa I. Vargas will join Lucero as clerk/vice president, succeeding Board Member Carlos Lopez, who served in the capacity for a one-year term. Board Member Santos Hernandez, Jr. continues in his second year as a member.

A brief reception was held

to honor outgoing Board Member Blanca Estela Rubio, who was elected in November to the California State Assembly and officially announced her resignation from the Board.

The Board will proceed with the process for a provisional appointment to select a new member by Feb. 13. The new member will complete the remainder of Rubio's term. A notice of vacancy will be posted by Dec. 19 along with a candidate application. Candidates will be screened and interviewed in January.

Christmas Tree Safety and Holiday Cooking Tips from the Monterey Park Fire Department

MONTEREY PARK - The Monterey Park Fire Department would like to remind everyone to be very careful during the holidays and practice fire safety with the use of Christmas lights, trees and while preparing the holiday dinner.

Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur they are more likely to be serious. In previous years, we have seen an increase in the use of turkey fryers. While they provide a delicious turkey, they also present a unique danger if not used safely. The Monterey Park Fire Department would like to share a few tips to ensure you have a safe and joyous holiday season.

Christmas Tree Safety

Picking the tree

- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.

Placing the tree

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is not

blocking an exit.

- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.
- Lighting the tree
- Use lights that have the label of an independent testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

After Christmas

- Get rid of the tree after Christmas. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home.
- From January 2 - 13, 2017, residents may put their tree out of pick up by Athens Disposal on their trash day. After that, residents may cut up the Christmas tree and place in the green waste container or call Athens at 626-336-3636.
- Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to

prevent hazards and make them last longer.

Turkey Fryer Safety

- Stay away from the house
- Set up the turkey fryer more than 10 feet away from your home and keep children and pets away. Never leave it unattended.
- Find flat ground
- The oil must be even and steady at all times to ensure safety. Place the fryer on a flat, level surface and carefully gauge the amount of oil needed.
- Use a thawed and dry turkey
- Make sure your holiday turkey is completely thawed and dry. Extra water will cause the oil to bubble furiously and spill over. If oil spills from the fryer onto the burner, it can cause a fire.
- Monitor the temp
- Use caution when touching the turkey fryer. The lid and handle can become very hot and could cause burns. Also be sure to keep track of the oil's temperature as many fryers do not have their own thermostats.
- Be prepared
- Have a fire extinguisher (multipurpose, dry-powder) ready at all times in the event that the oil ignites.

Baldwin Park Unified Taxpayers See First Savings from Bond Refinancing

BALDWIN PARK - Baldwin Park Unified property owners saw their first savings on December's tax bill from the District's refinancing of \$74.8 million in facility bonds, a decline in the tax rate of \$57.78 per \$100,000 in assessed valuation over 2015-16.

The savings, which take advantage of a drop in interest rates, add up to \$20.8 million over 21 years. The refinancing lowers the 2016-17 repayment costs for the bonds to \$105.10 per \$100,000 in assessed value. Rates can fluctuate year to year until the bonds are repaid in 2037.

"We are excited to be able to

return these savings to the community members who so generously approved the bond measures that have helped elevate the quality of our District facilities," Superintendent Froilan N. Mendoza said. "The District will continue to monitor market conditions as it seeks ways to save money for property owners."

The District's strong management, financial position and growing tax base are reflected in an upgrade of its credit rating by Standard and Poor's from an A to an A+. The credit rating firm reviewed Baldwin Park Unified's credit prior to the sale.

Baldwin Park community members have approved three school bond measures - \$15 million in 1996, \$46.6 million in 2002 and \$75.5 million in 2006.

Baldwin Park Unified also refinanced about \$3.9 million in lease revenue bonds backed by its general fund, generating direct savings to the District of approximately \$45,000 a year - which totals more than \$900,000 over the bonds' 20-year repayment period. The move improved the District's credit rating for lease revenue bonds from an A- to an A.

Green and Recycle Your Holiday Tree This Season

BALDWIN PARK - The season of giving is almost here and with it comes Christmas trees that families all around the globe will decorate with twinkling lights and ornaments. But after the festivities have come and gone and presents have been unwrapped, what happens to these trees? This year, Waste Management of San Gabriel Valley invites residents to recycle their trees through its curbside tree collection program.

Curbside tree collection for residents in the following cities/areas will take place on the following dates on customers' scheduled collection day:

Arcadia: Dec. 26-Jan. 11
 Baldwin Park: Dec. 30- Jan. 6
 Diamond Bar: Dec. 26-Jan. 15
 La Verne: Dec. 28-Jan. 5
 Pomona: Dec. 28-Jan. 14
 San Dimas: Jan. 3-Jan. 10.

When placing trees on the curb for collection, customers should follow these guidelines:

- Remove all decorations, including tinsel, lights, ornaments and tree stands, and place your

tree on the curb for recycling. Please do not block carts.

- Trees taller than six feet must be cut in half.

• Please note that flocked trees cannot be recycled. They will be collected by your trash collector.

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Unjustifiable Suing of Cities are Crimes in Itself

How many times have we seen families of criminals who died at the hands of police, sue the police because they had to kill the suspect. What is even more bizarre is when they sue the police for the death of their so-called loved one, even when the family didn't want to have anything to do with the deceased prior to his or her departure from this world.

We can go back to the North Hollywood bank robbery and the shooting on Feb. 28, 1997. Larry Phillips, Jr. and Emil Matasareanu robbed the bank and had a major shootout with police and were killed. However, before they were killed, they shot twelve police officers and eight civilians. Many of us older folk remember this like it was yesterday. After Emil Matasareanu was shot in the legs, paramedics didn't arrive for about 70 minutes. There was a number of reasons for the delay. They were not sure if he had a bomb, there was a possibility of a third shooter and lack of aid because the paramedics were already saturated with other injured officers and civilians.

The "miracle" of this whole event is that nobody died in the crossfire of this gun battle, however, many were critical and some never recovered fully from their injuries. Only the bad guys died.

So what happens after this? Emil Matasareanu's "mommy" sued the police for killing her son. Really??? The victims and the police should have sued his

mother for giving birth to this piece of trash. Furthermore, his mother wouldn't cooperate with police to recover money from other recent bank robberies which added up to about \$2 million in cash. Only a small amount was ever recovered.

According to reports, West Covina police was sued a few years ago when their "rejected" family member, Omar Garcia, attempted to break into cars at Target and was confronted by two police officers. The subject soon became combative and there was a fight. Reports stated that Omar gained control of one of the officer's batons and attempted to use it on the officers. Both officers were on the ground when the suspect was shot. Both officers were injured and hospitalized and the suspect died. However, the family's version of the events and the relationship of the suspect changed. They sued and got a sizable settlement. This was in November 2008.

Today we have the brother and sister of Gevork Alachadzhyan who stole a police car from a West Covina police officer on March 13 of this year. He led

officers on a televised chase throughout the San Gabriel Valley. He yelled profanities over the radio while driving crazy. Finally, officers were able to PIT the police car around 10:30pm in Glendale. He attempted to flee by accelerating the vehicle, burning rubber and crashing into another police vehicle that he was pushing backwards. Smoke covered the vehicle. Officers knew he had a shotgun in the vehicle and feared for the safety of others. They fired into the vehicle striking the suspect.

The brother and sister are suing; they state the police "negligently assessed the circumstances presented to them and violently confronted and proceeded to assault and batter, inflicting several gunshot wounds, which proved to be fatal." They also state that Alachadzhyan was unarmed and did not pose a threat to the officers.

Really? He had a shotgun in the car and tried to run down police officers, using the car as a weapon??? That's not armed or posing a threat? Get real people.

Basically, in my opinion, these people chose their own actions and their own way to die. Why should anyone be financially responsible for this as if is a justifiable police shooting? All of these people try to get free money as the result of their criminal relative's death. Most have been alienated by their families and were not wanted. They are dead because of their own behavior.

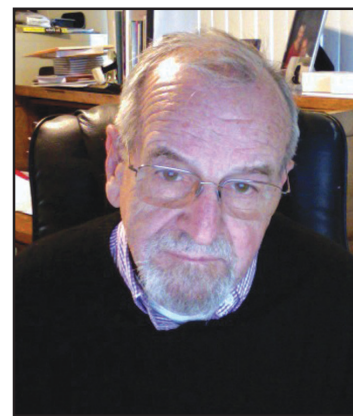
"That's Just the Way It Is!"

It will be a time to find, wrapped in swaddling cloths, hope for a new world order of peace, justice, equity and understanding across all sorts of divisive barriers. It will be a time to offer our honest commitment to one who was called "the prince

This child who become a man for others never asked us to believe things about him, but to follow him in lives of compassion, openness and affirmation. When the religion which was drawn from what he taught is reduced to doctrines about him and what follows are walls of separation, an arrogance which says we are right and all others are wrong and bound for eternal torture, and a super nationalism which puts us at odds with anyone who does not

look like us, speak with our language, and are struggling to be who they are in a world which wants them to be something else. And when that happens Christmas may be the "humbug" Scrooge thought it to be.

I believe God has offered the world a new way to live. And what is that new way? It can be found in simple language. So after reading the Christmas story in Luke 2 and Matthew 1 and 2, you may discover what a new world order might look like when these words of Jesus in Matthew 5 are taken seriously.

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are they who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.

Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers,

for they shall be called children of God.

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness,

for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

Have a blessed Christmas—and perhaps the best way to do that is to be a blessing in world terribly short of that life-changing commitment.

"Time Jockey" - California Grants

Rancho BeginningsFrom 1770 through 1848, the Mexican Land Grant system was one of the most important influences in California history. Originally established by the Spanish as part of their feudal system of land ownership, the California land grants allowed land to be distributed to a limited number of worthy owners. Although popularly known as "Spanish Grants", only 30 of the 800 plus land grants in California were granted by the Spanish government and all others were actually awarded under Mexican rule. Under the Mexican Land Grant system, any person could apply to the Governor for a land grant. An applicant needed to include his or her name, age, vocation, amount of land and why he should be awarded a land grant. Usually a hand drawn map was included with the application which provided enough detailed definitions of the land to document its location. The Governor consulted with local officials and based on the information included with the re-

quest would decide to award a request or not. If the grant was accepted, a favorable reply was sent by the governor to the applicant identifying the amount of land being awarded. Usually a grant was awarded for hundreds or thousands of acres which caused difficulties for future title claims. The Mexican government measured land parcels in leagues which was the distance a horse could travel in one hour. The American government used a measurement of square sections usually one square mile or 640 acres. While the American measurement was easier to survey, the Mexican measurement followed certain land characteristics like rivers, hills and canyons and thus created irregular land parcel boundaries.

In Los Angeles County, 60 land grants were awarded during the Spanish-Mexican land granting era. The largest land grants were the extension of land around the San Fernando Mission (116,858 acres) and the Simi land grant in Ventura (113,009 acres). The smallest land grants were

acres awarded to the two local mission churches San Fernando (77 acres) and San Gabriel (190 acres). The land grants were eventually named for their owner using the prefix of "rancho". Among the local land grants were Azusa de Dalton, renamed to Rancho Azusa de Dalton, which was a 4,431 acre parcel awarded to Henry Dalton. Dalton was a wealthy merchant who created a fleet of merchant ships to import and export goods to South America. San Jose was a 22,340 acre land grant awarded to Ygnacio Palomares and Ricard Vejar. Today, the Rancho San Jose grant includes the cities of Pomona, San Dimas, La Verne, Diamond Bar, Azusa, Covina, Walnut, Claremont and Glendora. The La Puente land grant was 11 leagues or 49,000 acres awarded to William Workman and John Rowland. Named Rancho La Puente, the size of the land grant was the maximum allowed under Mexican land laws and extended from the San Gabriel River to the 57 Freeway. There are 13 cities which today fall within the boundaries of this huge land grant and all but 40 acres were located in Los Angeles County. Throughout California, land grants were established during the Mexican governance era and were honored until the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo was signed in 1848 ceding most of California to the United States. The task of establishing ownership of Mexican land grants would prove to be the end of the rancho period as well as large acreage land owners in California.

Christ Healing - Still Possible Today

These are powerful statements and examples of Eddy's contributions, but probably her most profound contribution was discovering that Christ Jesus' healing method continues to be demonstrable today. She presented her findings in Science and Health, taught the healing method she had discovered, and healed many who came to her for help with health issues. A powerful component of these healing results was the voluntary and inspired sharing of healings that helped encourage others to find a higher, more spiritual view of themselves. Perhaps this is one aspect of what Eddy meant when she wrote in Science and Health, "...progress is the law of God." What she accomplished still offers healing answers for anyone looking not only for better health but also for their connection with God, divine Love.

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As Expected Fed Rate Hike - Markets Get Rattled

In the three hours after Wednesday's FOMC announcement, the entire yield curve from the 2yr Treasury to the 10yr Treasury increased 10bp in yield. They rose another 3bp overnight. The dollar rose 2.0% and stocks dropped a little less than 1%, all because the Fed - did exactly as expected. How is that even possible?

The answer clearly lies not in what the Fed did - this was a quarter point hike the world saw coming from a mile away - but in what the Fed said. The FOMC's increasingly complicated messaging got it in trouble again, pushing market interest rates to levels likely close to the highs for this move.

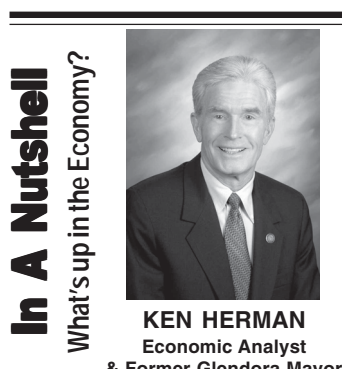
A Trumpian Tower of Worry

There are at least four credible explanations for the post-hike bond sell-off. Not surprisingly, three of the four center on Trump.

1. Traders missed an economic upturn. Investors were so focused on Trump and what he might do, they failed to notice the economy accelerated in the late third and early fourth quarter. Inflation turned up at the same time. When the Fed acknowledged both in the statement, it caught people off guard. Note, however, the statement also noted "market-based measures of anticipated inflation have moved up considerably." These inflation expectations are by definition already included in yields. The market has already priced in a considerable rise in inflation.

2. Traders fear the Fed will not pre-empt Trumpian inflation. It is entirely reasonable for Yellen to insist FOMC participants should not try to anticipate the economic impact of policies when they don't know what the policies are. By the same token, that implies the Fed cannot be preemptive if Trump's policies are inflationary.

3. Some Fed watchers caught Trump fever. Yellen downplayed the FOMC's need to anticipate Trump's fiscal policy, but the fact that some FOMC participants think the economy will need more rate hikes next year than they thought when Hillary Clinton was an 85% favorite in September suggests even the Fed is susceptible to at least some of the Trump-mania so enthralling to

equity investors. Even a couple of participants buying into expectations of faster growth and inflation gives traders' fears legitimacy.

4. The forecast rose. The Fed's rate forecast barely changed. GDP growth next year is expected to be a touch higher and the median fed fund forecast implies three rather than two rate hikes.

Context is Key

Last year, the median FOMC rate call for 2016 was four rate hikes, a prospect so far-fetched it was dismissed. After all, inflation was super-low and not rising, consumption was slowing and business investment was falling. Fed officials insisted four hikes were likely nonetheless.

In 2016, four rate hikes were only going to happen if the FOMC was willfully blind, and were only given credence after Fed officials insisted they would be. In 2017, the three hikes implied by the forecast seem more sensible, and therefore more likely. But to really make sense, inflation has to continue to pick up, which seems unlikely, especially with the dollar on a tear.

Bonds and Inflation Expectations

The bond market is getting way ahead of itself in reaction to the election. Yields are likely close to topping out, and the case for a drop in yields in 2017 is strong.

The market's long-term inflation expectations rose from just under 1.5% in early July to 2.15% in the days before the December FOMC meeting. The 65bp increase was in response to several factors, including higher oil prices, faster current inflation and Trump's economic policies. Inflation expectations rose 14bp the day after the election, by far the biggest one-day move, lifting the market's inflation expectations above the Fed's 2% target for the first time since last August. Between the rise in infla-

tion expectations and the rise in real yields, there is now 75-100bp of yield in 10-yr Treasuries to compensate for inflation stemming from stronger global demand and Trumpian economics plus the Fed response to these inflation pressures.

As for inflation, Wall Street's forecast is little changed in 2017. Probably the biggest surprise is how little energy inflation has changed, given the 45% rise in oil from its low. That's because Wall Street expects oil will end next year in the same \$45-55 range it is in now.

Wall Street expects the dollar will continue to rise next year, but not at the same pace as in the past month. One alternative scenario reflects the effect of a significantly stronger dollar, which would result in lower import prices, reducing the cost of goods. The other reflects an overheating economy, which would increase the cost of services.

If inflation deviates from Wall Street's forecast, it is more likely to be lower than higher, because there is a significant risk of dollar strength, in part because there is a significant risk of weakness in other currencies, and in part because the Fed is determined to raise rates at least twice. As for an overheating economy, it is possible, but not likely in 2017, because passing the kind of sugar-rush stimulus that would blow out the deficit will be nearly impossible and because Congress simply won't have time to put major stimulus in place.

Bottom Line: Significant rate increases typically occur in two parts. A rapid move accounting for 80-90% of the yield rise followed by a drawn out, more volatile phase. We are likely entering the second phase now the Fed rate hike is behind us. Wall Street's forecast 2.65% peak in 10-year notes still stands, as does the ensuing rally. The market has run too far, too fast. It may run just a little further, but yields are not likely to get much more attractive than they are now for some time to come.

Be kind to one another

Look for opportunities to be kind. It will make your Christmas and Holidays more pleasant, too. Be nice to cashiers, restaurant servers, public transportation drivers, flight attendants - all those who are working while you are shopping, traveling, or partying. My son gave his only sleeping bag to someone who looked destitute. The person was extremely thankful, my son felt really good, and I'm proud of him, too. Do you have a collection of sleeping bags, coats, umbrellas, rain gear, gloves, etc. that you could GIFT to someone living on the street? Sure, you won't get the tax deduction you'd get if you gave to a charity, but those without money cannot afford to buy from those stores that sell your donations. Christians, be the Good Samaritan.

Is there an investment that will pay me like a pension, starting now, so I have income for life?

Depending on your specific situation, you might have several options. If it turns out to be the best and right thing for you, you might consider an immediate annuity. You can get the same security as a monthly pension check, it's simple, and tax-efficient.

I have some money in stocks. I regularly contribute a set amount, and the same stocks are purchased. Should I sell my stocks and buy different ones?

I am not licensed to give you advice about stocks. I encourage my clients to invest where their money is safe (based on the

strength of the company). As Will Rogers said, "I'm not as concerned about the return ON my money as I am the return OF my money." That said, my clients did not lose a penny in the investments I recommended over the last 10 years; they gained.

I'm currently paying 5 3/4 interest rate on my old 30-year mortgage, which seems to be a high rate. I currently owe \$110,000, and I'm on a fixed income. Is it too late to get a lower rate without a lot of origination, etc., fees?

For a better answer, I'd need to know how many years you have left on your loan, and your current payment amount. For those who don't want to get into a long term mortgage, there are refinance loans available now that match the number of years you have left in your current loan. Refinancing does cost and it takes time to recover those costs. Another option might be a reverse mortgage. In general, I'd say you should be looking into a change of rate and payment.

My mom is 70, turning 70 1/2

in 2017. What's the deadline for her to take her Required Minimum Distributions?

Her deadline for taking her first RMD will be April 1, 2018. Thereafter, her deadline will be on December 31 each year. She can contact the companies her investment(s) are with and they'll tell her what her options are: monthly, semi-annually, or annually. She should also talk with her CPA

When we decided to buy a newly constructed home, the builder was emphatic, saying that we have to get our financing from his lending company to get the discounts and perks that we can apply to the closing costs or to upgrades. Is that true?

The bottom line is that builders can entice, wheedle, and woo buyers with great deals, but they cannot threaten them; that's illegal. If a buyer does feel threatened, they should first stand their ground, then complain to the builder and to the state and federal consumer affairs officials.

Your Warranty Is Safe!

Some dealership salespeople imply that when you buy a new vehicle from them, you must have it serviced by them. This is not true! I hear this from my customers all the time! Here is what you need to know:

There is a law (Magnuson-Moss Warranty Act) that an independent repair shop can service your car and you will not be jeopardizing your warranty in any way. This law has been around since 1975. Just like you would have to do if you got your vehicle serviced at the dealership, you need to keep records of services and have them done as recommended in your owner's manual. The good news is we make it easy for you. You always get a copy and we keep your vehicle's records as well. We can download a copy for you any time you need it.

Many consumers have gone to the dealership to take care of a warranty issue, however, and have been told their warranty is void because the vehicle has aftermarket parts on it. If they didn't inspect the vehicle to find out if the aftermarket parts cause the problem that is illegal. The mere presence of aftermarket parts on a vehicle cannot void a manufacturer warranty.

There are two types of warranties; expressed and implied. An expressed warranty is for a specific amount of time on certain parts. An implied warranty states that the manufactured product should meet certain standards. Aftermarket parts do not void either warranty. If you feel you have been wronged in this area contact the FTC (Federal Trade Commis-

sion) at 877.382.4357.

There are also two types of emission warranties; defect and performance. At the time of sale, the defect warranty insists that the manufacturer make a vehicle that will meet required emission levels. The performance warranty says the vehicle must maintain certain emission levels during its useful life cycle. Should the vehicle fail to meet these criteria the manufacturer must make the repairs free of charge even if an aftermarket part was the cause for the warranty claim. If that seems strange it is because the consumer is protected by the parts self-certification program that the EPA developed with SEMA (Specialty Equipment Market Association).

When an aftermarket part does fail, and is responsible for a warranty claim, the vehicle manufacturer must arrange a settlement with the consumer but the new vehicle warranty is not voided by this.

If you go to a dealership and they refuse to cover any defective manufactured items just because you have aftermarket parts on your vehicle, without bothering to find out if the aftermarket parts were at fault that is illegal!

The laws dealing with warranties are very simple. The only time a new vehicle warranty can be voided is if an installed aftermarket part has been proven to cause the problem. If you feel you have been denied a claim take a written explanation from the dealership. Check your owner's manual for instructions on what to do next. If you still don't receive satisfaction contact the EPA at 202.233.9040 or 202.326.9100.

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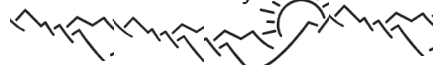

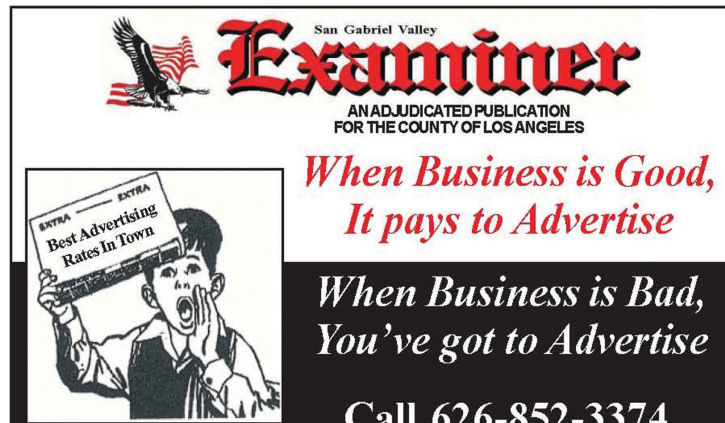

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


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FPH Auxiliary Installs 2017 Board of Directors

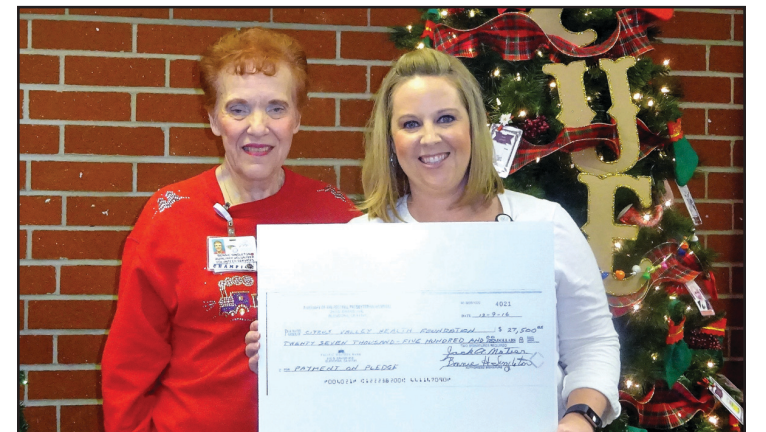

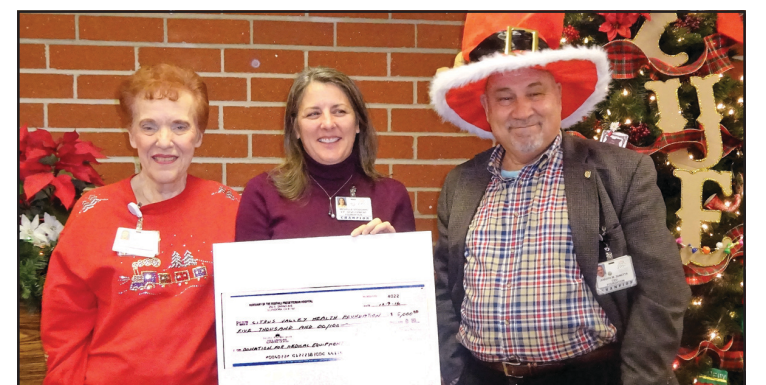
