Duarte Unified Hosts Inaugural Chain Reaction Contraption Contest

DUARTE - The name alone speaks to the creativity and innovation involved: Duarte Unified School District's Inaugural Chain Reaction Contraption Contest.

If that hasn't tickled your interest just a little, consider that teams of students ranging from elementary through middle school, are designing a contraption - for want of a better word - with the end result that it can make the most basic task seem convoluted: The end result is to Sharpen a Pencil.

If this sounds a little Rube Goldberg-ish for those of that era, well, it is. This is a Duarte USD version of the Rube Goldberg Challenge that has been popular over the years, without the national buy-in or cost.

"We've taken the idea that students can make a wild and crazy contraption to complete the most simple of tasks, sharpening a pencil," explained Dr. Michael Chavez, Director of Educational Services for Duarte USD.

Why make something simple so complex? Well, that's the nature of the challenge.

Teams of at least four students were tasked with designing something that fits in a 10 foot by 10 foot space, reaches no

larger than 8 feet high, takes a minimum of 15 steps to complete the task, runs for at least two minutes and no more than 8 minutes, and is portable.

Use of everyday items and recyclables is encouraged and rewarded on the scoring rubric; and grades are also given on a

Laugh Barometer, Theme, Artistry and Construction, and for the Absurd Complexity of the design.

Students are graded on their ability not only to construct the Contraption, but to work together (Team Chemistry), but also to

follow the mathematic equations require to construct a machine within certain parameters.

Designed much like a science fair, the competitions are currently being judged on the school campuses. A total of four schools, including two to five

teams per campus, entered the competition.

"This stemmed from an idea that came from our Committee for Innovation," explained Chavez. "This is a group of forward-looking teachers."

The devices, or Contraptions, involve concepts that include physics, motion and force, which are being discussed by the students. The competition exposes students to teamwork as well as the concepts of engineering a working device.

The benefits for those participating come on all levels, but mostly involve working together in a team atmosphere.

"We had a professor here from JPL and he talked about not just preparing student for college, but for playing well in the sandbox," continued Chavez. "This kind of out of the box thinking is what happens in everyday life. People on the job are asked to work together on teams to design something that works. We're giving them a chance to do that through this contest."

Results of the judging will be shared with the public and the Board of Education at a future meeting.

Baldwin Park Unified Bond Sale Saves Taxpayers \$20.8 Million

BALDWIN PARK - Baldwin Park Unified has refinanced \$74.8 million in facility bonds, including \$40.2 million in long-term debt, saving District property owners \$20.8 million in repayment costs over the next 21 years.

The refinancing takes advantage of lower interest rates for bond issues approved by voters for improving District facilities. The bonds will be repaid on their original maturity date, 2037. The move also refinanced facility bonds backed by Baldwin Park Unified's general fund, generating direct savings to the District.

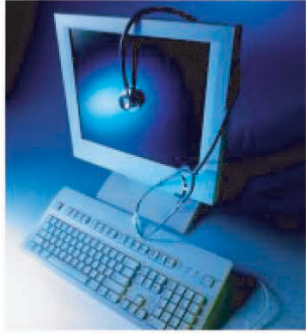
"We are very pleased with the result of the bond sale," Superintendent Froilan N. Mendoza said. "These actions

reflect the District's dedication to provide the best stewardship of funds entrusted to us by the community for the benefit of our students. We are saving money for taxpayers and reducing the burden on our general fund."

The District's strong management, financial position and growing tax base are reflected in an upgrade of its credit rating by Standard and Poor's to an A+ from an A. The credit rating firm reviewed Baldwin Park Unified's credit prior to the sale.

Baldwin Park community members have approved three school bond measures - \$15 million in 1996, \$46.6 million in 2002 and \$75.5 million in 2006.

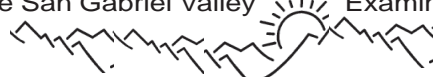

SoCalGas and the American Red Cross Donates Air Filtration Units to Azusa Residents to Recover from Recent Fires

AZUSA - SoCalGas has provided the American Red Cross with 915 air filtration units to be distributed free of charge in the cities of Azusa and Duarte. The units will help residents of both communities recover from the recent Fish and Reservoir Fires. The American Red Cross has delivered half of the units to Azusa Light & Water (City of Azusa's utility) for distribution to its residents who were impacted by the fires.

"We hope you distribute these filtration units to families affected by the fires, and who may be concerned about the air quality in the area. We are more than happy to help our neighbors, and support the communities of Azusa and Duarte, especially in difficult times as these," expressed SoCalGas CEO, Bret Lane in a letter to the American Red Cross.

"For over 145 years, SoCalGas has been committed to supporting our local communities and partners through volunteerism

and donations such as this," he added.

The air filtration units will be given out to Azusa residents on who meet the following criteria:

- Resident of City of Azusa
- Elderly (seniors age 50 and over)
- Fire evacuees
- Persons with medical and/or respiratory health problems
- Persons at the forest inter-dense and adjacent to the burn areas

On Saturday, July 9, the air filtration units will be distributed free of charge at Azusa Light & Water's Electric Yard located at 1020 W. 10th Street from 9:00 A.M. to noon or until supply is exhausted. Please bring a California Driver's license along with utility bill from Azusa Light & Water. Your name and address will be recorded for insurance and accounting purposes.

For pick-up, please stay in your car and line up on 10th Street facing east with the front of the line being at 1020 W. 10th Street. Should the line of cars

extend to Todd, then the line should be facing north on Todd, south of 10th Street.

Please be aware that the air filtration devices are large (35" x 22" x 11") and weigh 40 pounds. Residents will need assistance to carry the purifier unit from their vehicle into their homes.

"After a fire there is always the lingering smell of smoke, particulate matter and poor air quality," said Azusa Mayor, Joseph R. Rocha. "These air filtration units provided by SoCal Gas will go a long way in restoring a sense of normalcy to the residents of both our communities who were impacted and inconvenienced by the fires."

The air filtration units are manufactured by Aera Max and can be used year-round to safely remove 99.97% of harmful viruses, allergens, and particulates.

There is no equipment warranty expressed or implied by Azusa Light & Water on the filtration units.

Assemblyman Gatto's Parking Bill of Rights Passes Senate Committee

SACRAMENTO - Assemblyman Mike Gatto's (D-Los Angeles) fight for a more fair and affordable parking policy for California motorists received the approval of the Senate Transportation and Housing Committee by a 7-1 vote. The California Parking Bill of Rights will substantially reform how cities and other local governments manage and enforce parking laws, providing common-sense reforms and relief from unjust citations.

"When parking becomes a business for cities, the legislature must step in to protect drivers and their wallets," said Gatto. "Municipalities should be looking for ways to make

parking easier for their community, not ways to profit off of them."

The reforms included in AB 2586 will be:

- Prohibiting cities from hiring private companies to act as parking "bounty hunters."
- Requiring cities to promptly make spaces available to motorists after street-sweeping activities have concluded.
- Prohibiting cities from ticketing motorists who park at broken meters. The current law governing this (authored by Gatto in 2013) "sunset" (expires) at the end of 2016.

AB 2586 now heads to the Senate Appropriations Committee.

Judge Orders Hernandez to Stay Away from Councilwoman Rubio

WEST COVINA - State Assemblyman Roger Hernandez was ordered to stay away from Councilwoman Susan Rubio who is now his ex-wife. The judge on Friday, July 1, told Hernandez to stay 100 yards away from her for three years. This order is in place as part of a domestic violence restraining order issued against him by a Superior Court judge during the couple's divorce proceedings.

Judge Shelley Kaufman heard testimony from both sides and a number of witnesses.

The couple got married back in June 2013 and soon was plagued with issues including domestic violence. Rubio, obtained a temporary restraining order against Assemblyman



Assemblyman Roger Hernandez Hernandez in April after there was an incident outside the courthouse.

Rubio described more than a dozen incidents of domestic violence in which Hernandez allegedly choked, punched and assaulted her during their marriage.

They filed for divorce in December 2014 and it was final on Friday, July 1.

However, as part of the re-

straining order, Hernandez will be permitted within 15 feet of Rubio at public events because of their political status. Because of the restraining order, Hernandez will be prohibited from owning, purchasing or possessing a firearm or ammunition.

The restraining order will last until July 1, 2019.

Hernandez stated that Rubio was to blame for his apparent loss in the primary election for the 32nd Congressional District. However, the latest count has Hernandez officially certified as a candidate for the general election. He will face U.S. Rep. Grace Napolitano, who is seeking her 10th term in Congress. Hernandez used to work for Napolitano.

Duarte Launches Pilot Mandatory Street Sweeping Program

DUARTE - In response to concerns about street cleanliness and litter, the Duarte City Council voted at its May 10th meeting to launch a pilot street sweeping program effective July 1, 2016. The program involves a designated area of the City which will have signs posted to reflect mandatory parking restrictions which will be enforced by citation.

The pilot program, which launch on July 1, will be for a period of six months. The program involves the mandatory removal of vehicles on both sides of the street on street sweeping days to facilitate unobstructed access to curb and gutter by the sweeper. Street sweeping will occur on the second and fourth Wednesdays of every month. The area involved in the pilot program

is defined as Quadrant No. 2 which will be divided into north and south sections. The northern section of the quadrant includes the Duarte Mesa, every street above Freeborn St. with the outer boundary of Woodbluff Ave. The southern section of the quadrant is defined as Freeborn Street and all streets south of it, with the west boundary at Mt. Olive, the south boundary at Central Ave. and the easterly boundary consisting of Las Lomas Rd. to Royal Oaks and Fernley Drives.

The northern portion of the Quadrant 2 will be swept during the period of 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and the southern portion will be swept from 7:00 am to 11:00 am. Street signs indicating parking restrictions with days and

times will be posted in the pilot area during the month of June prior to the beginning of the program.

The program also features a thirty-day grace period where written warning notices will be left on windshields in order to both educate and familiarize affected residents with the program. Actual parking enforcement will commence August 1st. Citations will cost approximately \$45.00. Prior to the introduction of the program, staff will be involved in extensive public outreach. Staff will return to council in January of 2017 with pilot program findings.

Azusa Police Arrest One, Seek Two Other Suspects In Carjacking Pursuit

AZUSA - Early Saturday morning, July 2nd around 2:45 a.m., a man was by his pick-up truck when he was approached by 3 men with guns in the 1300 block of North Dalton Ave. These men ended up robbing the victim and then carjacked his truck after threading him with their handguns.

Soon after the three armed suspects drove off with the victim's truck, they were spotted by Azusa police in the 800 block of North San Gabriel Ave. They attempted to pull the vehicle over and execute a felony stop but the suspects refused to stop and a pursuit ensued. Officers chased the suspects through Azusa and



Arrested suspect Jesus Mora when the officers chased the vehicle to Fourth Street and Barbara, the truck spun out of control and hit a fence. All three armed suspects ran from the truck.

The police attempted to set up a containment area and called in

for assistance from other police agencies. One suspect was captured and two were able to get away and are still outstanding.

The man arrested was identified as Jesus Mora, 18, from La Puente. He was charged with armed robbery and carjacking. Other charges may follow. Bail was set at \$100,000 and it is unknown if there is an immigration hold on the suspect.

Investigators may be able to get lead on the other suspects with their investigation through fingerprints in the truck and other evidence.

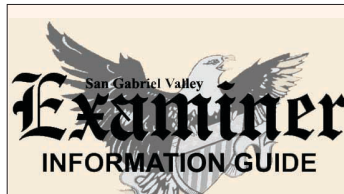
can't, but they are doing what they can to stay on top of the problems.

Safety in America: after Orlando

Two facts about the Orlando massacre stand out: The killer (may his name be forgotten) was an "authorized" gun owner, and the shootings occurred in a "safe" place.

The gun-control lobby was ready with its well-rehearsed script, but this was no lone deranged individual who bought a gun clandestinely at a gun show. He had been vetted by authorities and was licensed as a private security officer. The gun controllers do not advocate disarming their own bodyguards—or the many thousands who are certified, hired, or deputized by government agencies.

Obama bewailed the fact that the killer had targeted a place where people came to find "solidarity and empowerment," "to speak [our] minds and advocate for [our] civil rights," and, more importantly, "to dance, sing, and live." The vision of a "gay bar" as a "safe space" was shattered.

"Safe spaces" are springing up across America, for example on college campuses, for groups who feel victimized—to protect them from "microaggressions," societal disapproval, or ideas that "trigger" discomfort. Perhaps Pulse was safe in that regard. And patrons were somewhat protected, by Florida law, from a gun carried by a drunken brawler. Places that serve alcohol are fake gun-free zones. Statistically, 30 people in the bar may have had a CCW permit—but all of them were defenseless, by law.

They were not safe from most threats. Not from infectious disease. A gay nightclub is a breeding ground for sexually transmitted disease. Not from fire. It was a crowded place with loud music, many inebriated people, and the main exit blocked. And not from something Orlando Mayor Buddy Dyer called "unimaginable."

The mayor doesn't have much imagination. Authorities who are supposed to protect us are in deep denial about the really big threats. Orlando was "horrific," we are repeatedly told. But there are far worse possibilities that have happened in the 20th century, are happening now in places like Syria, and are being planned by the sworn enemies of America, including the soulmates of the Orlando gunman.

And what are our rulers doing? They are trying to indoctrinate kindergartners with the idea that all (or almost all) manifestations of sexuality are equally fine. But as homosexuals have just learned, multiculturalism has priorities. The shooter's ideology came before gay lives: the radical ideology that not only teaches that gays should be executed, but that lone jihadis have the duty to act as judge, jury, and executioner.

Vigilant authorities subject toddlers to very intrusive screening before letting them board a flight for a family vacation in the Bahamas, if they happen to be on a special "selectee" list. But the Orlando shooter got a pass despite suspicious behavior. He made two trips to Saudi Arabia in recent years—perhaps, it is suggested, to learn how to turn an AR-15 into a fully automatic weapon. He transferred the deed to his house to his brother-in-law and sister for \$10. Allegedly, the government willfully deleted or disregarded information that might have linked him to Islamic terror groups and the San Bernardino attack.

Will the authorities investigate and charge likely accomplices? What about officials who may be protecting terrorists, either deliberately or through politically correct policy? And will the federal government continue to import large numbers of migrants from countries that harbor both jihadists and deadly infectious diseases, and then rapidly disperse them to American cities?

Is the Obama Administration

creating "safe space" throughout America for those who intend to harm our people?

Recognizing the threat, more Americans are taking steps to protect themselves. Homosexuals are buying guns, and membership in the Pink Pistols is soaring.

And what are our supposed protectors doing? The American Medical Association and Democrat politicians are calling for federal research on "gun violence," blaming the NRA and Republicans for Orlando. Guns, not imported jihad or tuberculosis, are a "public health crisis."

Assemblyman to Name Stretch of I-210 After Dodgers Legend Jackie Robinson

SACRAMENTO—Assemblyman Mike Gatto (D-Los Angeles) introduced ACR 197 to name a stretch of Interstate 210 after Brooklyn Dodgers Hall of Famer second baseman Jackie Robinson, who was raised in the City of Pasadena. The measure, joint authored by Assemblyman Chris Holden (D-Pasadena), would create the "Jackie Robinson Memorial Highway," on Interstate 210 between State Route 2 and Orange Grove Blvd, a commonly used route to Dodger Stadium for fans coming from the Eastern Los Angeles County.

"Jackie Robinson is not only

an inspiring figure to us for his accomplishments in athletics, but also as a civil-rights-era trailblazer who advocated for social change," said Assemblyman Gatto. "His contributions to baseball and society have made an everlasting impression on our nation."

Jackie Robinson is best known for breaking the color barrier in baseball when he debuted with the Brooklyn Dodgers in 1947 and for having his number, "42" retired by all of Major League baseball. But before becoming a big-leaguer, Robinson excelled in basketball, football, baseball, and

track at John Muir (Pasadena) High School and Pasadena City College. He then transferred to the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA) in 1939, where he became the first Bruin to letter in four sports: baseball, basketball, football, and track.

"It's only fitting to honor Jackie Robinson by naming this stretch of highway near the home he grew up and lived in," said Gatto, whose father and uncles were present at Dodger Stadium in 1972 when Robinson had his number retired. "The sacrifices and differences he made will always be remembered."

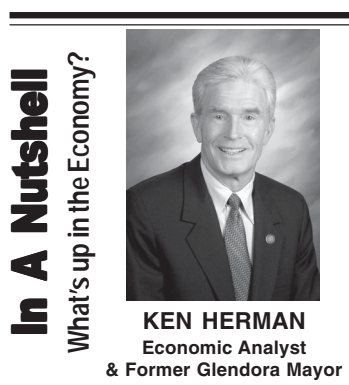

As The Dust Settle's

Last week, the British voted to leave the European Union in Thursday's referendum, a surprising result to a lengthy campaign. Stocks plummeted, the pound plunged, and yields dropped as reverberations rippled through global markets. Investors are just starting to learn the intricacies of EU governing principles on dissolution and new trade agreements and the world's capital markets have almost inexplicably all but recovered. With this latest likely change in the European Union's profile, what are the changes analysts are incorporating into their future thinking when it comes to economic forecasting?

The economy is in a holding pattern. After almost seven years of expansion, there is less volatility in growth and what volatility there is seems to be following a predictable seasonal pattern. Over the next couple of years, expect economic growth to continue to slow modestly, the governments preferred unemployment rate to stabilize near 5%, inflation to make a run toward 2%, but fall back after a couple of quarters, and interest rates to remain low. Several indicators are flashing recession warnings, but none are definitive. The odds of an official recession are about 50% over the next two years. The economy is not behaving the way it has in the past. Relationships between growth, inflation, unemployment and interest rates are different than in prior cycles. Eight and a half years after the 2001-07 business cycle ended, a new economic regime is painfully obvious. Standard econometric models make predictions based on the way the economy behaved in prior business cycles. Worldwide change after the Great Recession renders these models useless. The FOMC's insistence on using old models despite their consistent failure is destroying the Fed's credibility.

A critical element in orthodox Fed methodology is the long-run natural rate of interest. The natural rate-also confusingly known as the neutral rate-is the starting point for any interest rate decision, the rate of interest consis-

tent with trend growth at full employment. In other words, it is the interest rate that should prevail to keep inflation at 2% when labor force slack is fully removed from the economy.

We know the natural rate is currently low because interest rates are very low and credit is barely growing. Wall Street argues the natural rate could stay low for a long time. As Yellen noted, the FOMC's neutral rate forecast, including the longer-run forecast, has been falling for some time. Britain probably leaving the EU enforces this theory even greater than before. After years of error, the Fed is beginning to think reality might be right and the model might be wrong.

For years, Yellen has maintained that the natural rate is low due to temporary headwinds including economic uncertainty, a strong dollar, slow productivity growth and low labor force participation.

Recently, she has acknowledged the possibility of structural impediments caused by demographics, increased reliance on the US as an investor safe haven and other factors that could keep productivity growth and the natural interest rate low for years.

But the most likely candidate for the downward acceleration in the natural rate since 2009, not just in the US but around the world, is the significant tightening of financial regulation. After all, when both lending and borrowing criteria are dramatically tightened, how could the relationship between interest rates and economic growth not change? Yet, while Yellen has been pressed to admit a connection between regulation and the economy, she is resistant, prob-

ably because she believes regulatory changes since 2009 are beneficial and she does not want to see them rolled back.

Since last week's vote for Britain to leave the EU, Wall Street feels that what we have experienced in weaker growth will continue for a longer period of time. Wall Street's inflation forecast is higher, but not materially so. Oil's rise from \$25 to \$50 will boost headline inflation until the second quarter of 2017 even if it rises no further. Some of that will flow through to the core, too, just as some of the drop in oil did. Headline and core inflation are likely to approach 2% before dropping back toward 1.5% in ensuing quarters.

Rents are critical to the Personal Consumption Expenditure Index and even more so to the CPI. Relief is coming, but it could be months before it shows up in the indices. Without question, rents are the biggest inflation wildcard. With rents in the biggest cities already rising more slowly than last year, this trend should soon slow.

The risk of recession has abated a bit since the first quarter, but is still considerable. Several generally reliable indicators including corporate profits, temporary hiring, business investment, industrial production and business sales are flashing warnings.

Britain leaving the EU (assuming it occurs) is just the latest in a series of international upheavals. There will be more to come. The common denominator is inadequate growth. A rising tide lifts all boats, but the tide just isn't rising fast enough to keep everyone happy anymore.

While there is uncertainty at any given Fed meeting, an investor with a horizon spanning several meetings can rest assured that something will keep the Fed at bay at most of them. The list of acceptable reasons to leave rates unchanged seems to be growing.

Why do you recommend annuities?

The SEC warns people about the dangers of Variable annuities due to their costs, expenses, and

risk to principal. I recommend Fixed and Fixed-Index annuities, with very little or no cost nor expense, 100-percent participation (all of your money has potential growth, not just a percentage of it), and guarantees that you cannot lose your principal, locking in any growth each contract anniversary. (Some 'Riders,' added for additional benefits, can have an annual fee, but this is clearly disclosed to you before you invest; it's something you decide to include or not.)

My financial advisor told me I should buy an annuity from him because the insurance companies he represents are members of some California guarantee company that would assure my protection if the company went bankrupt. Is this true?

Your financial advisor has crossed a legal line. Here's a quote from the California Life and Health Insurance Guarantee Association Act Summary Docu-

ment and Disclaimer, "Insurance companies and their agents are prohibited by law from using the existence of the California Life and Health Insurance Guarantee Association (CLHIGA) to induce you to purchase any kind of insurance policy." The existence of this Association cannot be used by an agent or advisor to induce you to buy. Annuities are policies issued by insurance companies.

Will my heirs have access to the money in my CDs when I die, or does this money have to go through probate?

Proceeds from a non-IRA bank CD go through probate and may be subject to expenses, delays, and lack of privacy. You have choices. The right life insurance policy, and/or the right annuity, with properly designated beneficiaries (not an estate or trust) can be passed on to heirs without the expense and delay of probate.

Driver License and ID Card Applicants Required to Prove State Residency

SACRAMENTO - The California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) wants to remind customers applying for a driver license (DL) or identification (ID) card for the first time, beginning July 1, they will be required to provide the DMV with two documents that prove they are California residents.

The California residency requirement under Assembly Bill 1465, applies to all first time

California DL and ID card original applicants, including commercial, motorcycle, and Class C. The law does not apply to applicants who are renewing, applying for a duplicate, or a correction to their current DL or ID card.

Currently, applicants under Assembly Bill 60 are already required to provide proof of California residency.

A few examples of acceptable

documents to prove California residency are:

- Rental or lease agreement with the signature of the owner/landlord and the tenant/resident
- Deed or title to residential real property
- Mortgage bill
- Home utility bills (including cellular phone)
- Medical documents
- Employee documents

L.A. County Opposes High Speed Rail Alignment

LOS ANGELES COUNTY — The Board of Supervisors unanimously approved a joint motion by Supervisors Michael D. Antonovich and Sheila Kuehl to send a five-signature letter to the California High Speed Rail Authority Board and the County's elected state officials opposing the Refined E-2 High Speed Rail alignment, as currently proposed - due to serious impacts to homes, quality of life and sensitive environmental areas in local communities.

The letter will detail efforts to date by Supervisors Antonovich and Kuehl and call upon the Authority to expedite scientific studies related to the high speed rail project. The motion also directs County departments to assess project impacts on their operations.

In 2013, Supervisor Antonovich requested that the Authority find alternatives to the

SR-14 corridor due to its severe impacts on communities in the North County, including the Santa Clarita Valley, Agua Dulce and Acton. "The resulting alternative routes still carry significant impacts," said Antonovich. "Today's decision was an important next step in our ongoing effort to protect these communities."

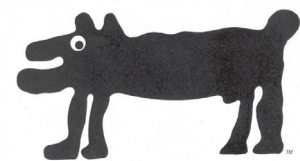

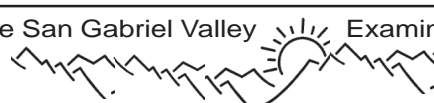
