Mt. SAC's Oldest Grad Fulfills a Lifelong Dream

WALNUT - Blanca Maria Vides of San Dimas will stand out from her classmates this month and fulfill a lifelong dream when she graduates with an Associate of Science Degree in Fashion Design & Technology. At the age of 71, she will become the oldest graduate in Mt. San Antonio College's history.

Her road to fulfilling a childhood dream has been a long one. She and her five brothers were raised by farming parents in El Salvador. Her father worked in the fields and her mother took care of the house and the family, and that included sewing clothes.

"I used to watch my mother crochet, and when I

was six years old, she gave me the hook and some yarn and showed me how to crochet. Then a family friend gave me this little sewing machine and I began making dresses for my dolls, and then I learned embroidery," says Vides. "By eight years old, my mother had taught me how to make my own dresses. I was fascinated with fashion."

Although she was passionate about fashion, her parents didn't want her to have the hard life and long hours of a seamstress, which was the only occupation available to her in El Salvador with her skillset. Instead, Vides earned a degree in accounting and for the next many years worked as an accountant by day, but continued to make dresses at home.

In 1989, El Salvador was in the midst of a civil war when Vides lost her home in a bombing. At the age of 46, she moved to the United States. She came alone and spoke very little English.

She began working as a housekeeper and started taking English classes at Citrus College in Glendora. In 2005, she discovered Mt. SAC's fashion design and technology program, so she slowly began taking one or two courses each semester and continued her education after retiring as a housekeeper in 2007.

Vides says it will be a proud moment for her to walk across the stage on graduation day. And her dreams don't stop there.

"I want to start an online business and make my own clothing designs and crochet patterns, and sell them. I also want to publish a book with all of my crochet patterns," says Vides.

Vides hopes her journey will inspire others who are struggling with the idea of starting or continuing their education. "I love to come to school. I like to learn something new. If you want to learn something, the best thing to do is to stop thinking about it and just do it," she says.

"It's never too late."

GLENDORA - On many occasions we the press writes about the bad guys. Today, the San Gabriel Valley Examiner wants to write about a very special and good person who has passed on due to an extended illness.

Mike Conway dedicated most of his life to his family, community, church, and those who were in need. He was the kind of person who made an impact on a world that needs the attention that he has given to those who needed help.

To mention a few things he accomplished were the mayor of Glendora in 2003, served on the city council from 2001, to 2006, 2016.

He also was president of the Glendora Historical Society, served the Glendora Kiwanis Club, The Glendora Welfare Board, leadership in the former South Hills Little League.

Mike and Marcia were both Glendora Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year for 2007. At Chaffy College he was recognized as an Outstanding Alumnus, working with the Little Leagues. He was the recipient of the "Sportsmanship Award" at Chaffey Junior College wherein he was also freshman president.

Mike was a current member of Loraine Avenue Baptist Church and has served on numerous committees, former member of Glenkirk Presbyterian Church, involved in many activities in the church, including hosting a bi-monthly Bible Study group in his home for the past four years

Mike supervised 14 field agents and 800 cases, was Monterey Park Unit Supervisor, procured, staffed, and opened this new Parole Office. He supervised 9 agents and 550 cases in the Los Angeles District Office. Field Parole Administrator, opened up El Monte and Alhambra Parole Units. He oversaw daily operations of El Monte and Alhambra Parole Offices, and SARD Unit (Intense

drug supervision/diversion program). He was in charge of Work Furlough Center (Los Angeles), Boot Camp Program, and Restitution Center. Employee Relations Officer responsible for overseeing all employee disciplinary actions in the Los Angeles Region. This included presenting the State's case for "adverse action" to the State Personnel Board, in charge of all training in the Los Angeles Region.

Mike retired in June of 1998 following a career of 33 and one half years with the Department of Corrections. He was on dialysis for 5 and half years, including the last four years of his career with Corrections. In September of 1999 he was blessed to have a kidney transplant and was thrilled to be able to return to a more active role in the community and in 2001 he was elected to the Glendora City Council despite his hardship with his illness.

His honor Mike Conway lived a "giving" lifetime of love, passion, hard work, dedication and sacrifice for his community, and mankind itself.

"Evil triumphs when good men do nothing". Mike did make a difference.

The Examiner and its family send condolences to his family and all who will miss him. He will not be forgotten.

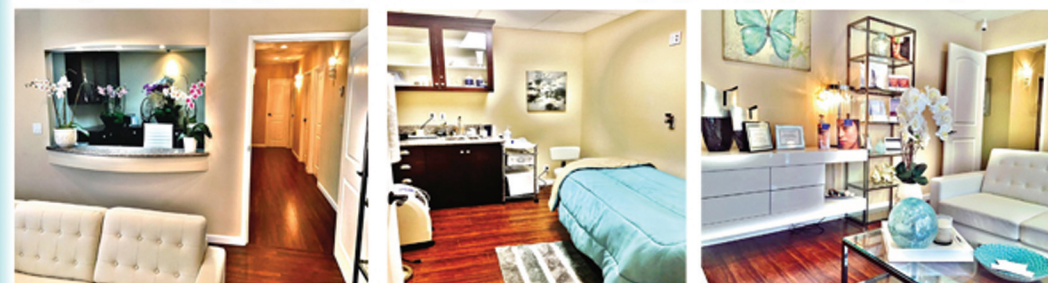

City Offers Free Summer Activities For Kids

SAN GABRIEL – It's summer in San Gabriel, and there is no shortage of free and low-cost city-sponsored activities to keep the kids and family entertained.

Summer Fun Recreation Programs started June 6 at Smith Park and Washington Elementary, and kick off on June 13 at Roosevelt Elementary and Vincent Lugo Park. Parents can drop off the kids during the day to enjoy fun activities supervised by city recreation leaders. Free lunch will be available to children 18 years old and younger from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., provided by the San Gabriel Unified School District. Children under six years old must be accompanied by an adult.

Recreation programs run Monday through Friday. Hours are 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Smith Park through Aug. 5, 12-5:30 p.m. through July 1 at Washington Elementary, 12-5:30 p.m. through July 1 and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. through Aug. 5 at Roosevelt Elementary, and 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. through Aug. 5 at Vincent Lugo

Park. For middle school students, the Community Services Department offers free Bulldog Sports Camp at Jefferson Middle School, Monday through Friday 12:30-3:30 p.m. from June 6 to July 8.

For families looking for some evening fun, the new Parks After Dark program offers free games, arts and crafts and other activities on Tuesdays at Smith Park and Wednesdays at Vincent Lugo Park at 6 p.m. from June 21 through Aug. 3 (no programs the week of July 4).

In addition to the free summer programs, the Community Services Department offers low-cost recreation swim at Smith Park Pool, beginning on June 14. Hours are Wednesday-Saturday 1:00-3:30 p.m. and Tuesday 7-9 p.m. Registration is open for swim lessons, which will begin on June 13. Parents can also register their children, grades one through eight, for Summer Day Camp at Coolidge Elementary through Aug. 12.

Arcadia Transit Launches Expanded Shuttle Service

ARCADIA - Arcadia Transit is making exciting changes to its service. Starting on June 16, Arcadia Transit will introduce an expanded fixed-route, fixed-schedule shuttle service for use by all riders. With three shuttle lines in operation, Red, Green and Blue, Arcadia Transit is able to connect riders with some of Arcadia's most popular destinations such as the Arcadia Gold Line Station, shopping and dining areas, entertainment venues, schools, and hospital and medical facilities. Serving the community since 1975, Arcadia Transit has traditionally operated as a dial-a-ride service. However, to better meet the needs of residents, visitors, and businesses, Arcadia Transit has been enhanced by adding a fixed-route, fixed-schedule shuttle service for the general public while still maintaining a dial-a-ride service strictly for seniors and those with disabili-

ties. This change in service provides more equitable access to transportation options throughout the City.

The addition of the shuttle service allows the general public to access Arcadia Transit, with fixed stops along the three shuttle lines at a cost of 50 cents per ride with one free transfer. Seniors and those with disabilities will be able to benefit from the dual systems, the traditional dial-a-ride, door to door service (50 cents per ride), or the shuttle service (free for seniors and disabled riders). To sign up as a senior or disabled rider, patrons will need to fill out a brief application form available from the City website (www.ArcadiaCA.gov), Arcadia Community Center, Arcadia Library, Arcadia City Hall (Cashier), or by contacting the City at (626) 574-5490. Proof of eligibility will be required with registration.

San Gabriel To Host 'Play Day' Celebration June 25

SAN GABRIEL – The community will celebrate the city's historic La Laguna de San Gabriel Playground at the second annual "Play Day" on June 25 from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Vincent Lugo Park.

Assembly Policy Committee Votes for Powdered Alcohol Ban

Huff Measure Continues to Receive Unanimous Support

SACRAMENTO - Legislation that would ban powdered alcohol, or "Palcohol," in California passed out of the Assembly Committee on Government Organization today with no opposition. SB 819, authored by Senator Bob Huff (R-San Dimas), would make California the 32nd state to ban or restrict the sale of this dangerous product.

Powdered alcohol is a freeze dried version of alcohol which comes in a small pouch and is the equivalent of a shot of alcohol. The crystallized formula becomes a cocktail once mixed with water. Although the product isn't sold in stores yet, labeling was approved by the U.S. Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau in 2014.

"Powdered alcohol is a new product that is coming to market throughout the nation," said Senator Huff during today's hearing. "The ease of using this substance presents an array of potential health problems in California as it can be snorted, added to energy drinks, slipped to unknowing recipients, or even added to beverages already containing alcohol in an attempt to create a danger-

ously potent concoction."

Senator Huff's legislation has earned the support of numerous public safety organizations and government agencies, many of whom sent representatives to testify on behalf of SB 819 during the hearing. The list includes the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors, Placer County Board of Supervisors, Los Angeles Drug and Alcohol Policy Alliance, Alcohol Justice and many others who testified in support of the bill.

According to a national advocacy group, Alcohol Justice, California is the largest alcohol market in the U.S. and suffers the most alcohol-related harm. A 2013 study from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control found that the societal costs for binge drinking are higher in California than in any other state: \$32 billion for one year of excessive alcoholic consumption. Problems caused by binge drinking include lost work productivity, poor health, crime, automobile accidents, property damage and death.

"Powdered alcohol is a bad idea for public health, our com-

munities, our patients and our children," said Dr. Robert Oldham, who serves as the Health Officer for Placer County. "We fear that similar to other unhealthy products like electronic cigarettes, flavored tobacco and flavored alcohol products, that powdered alcohol will end up being marketed to our young people."

Senator Huff is pleased the issue has achieved bipartisan support and is working closely with Assemblymember Jacqui Irwin (D-Thousand Oaks) on a companion measure that has been introduced in the Assembly, AB 1554. Assemblymember Irwin is also a principal coauthor of SB 819.

"Permitting the sale of powdered alcohol in California sends the wrong message to youth and young adults about responsible drinking," said Senator Huff. "Although labeling for this product has already been approved on the federal level, it's now incumbent on each state to decide if this product should be sold in local neighborhood stores. We need to stop this product before it reaches the market."

West Covina Firefighters' to Review Contract Proposal, Looks Promising

WEST COVINA - At the last West Covina City Council meeting, the West Covina Firefighters' Association picketed outside the council chambers before the meeting. Nearly 40 firefighters showed up and joined the meeting with one member talking about trying to get a satisfactory contract with the city. They have gone 2 years without a contract and they are not talking about a

pay raise, but benefits that they feel that they have earned.

The association has attempted to negotiate a contract with the city through formal negotiations with the city manager, and mediation with a mediator with no success.

A representative from the association addressed the council at the beginning of the meeting during oral communications talking about the frustration that the

firefighters are going through while working without a contract.

However, City Manager Chris Freeland responded at the end of the oral communications that he was delighted to report that they have in fact reached a settlement that should satisfy both sides and seems to be a "win, win" situation.

Freeland and the staff worked hard with the association to bring this chapter to a close and with everyone on all sides satisfied.

Assemblyman Gatto's Legislation to Increase Drone Safety Flies Past Assembly

SACRAMENTO – Assemblyman Mike Gatto's (D-Los Angeles) comprehensive solution, The Drone Registration/Omnibus Negligence-prevention Enactment (DRONE) of 2016, passed the Assembly by a 44 to 8 vote. The Act would:

- Require all drone packaging to include safety disclosures and FAA registration requirements.
- Beginning in 2020, it would require insurance policies to ensure that, if a drone hurts some-

one or damages property, the victim can be compensated. This requirement is akin to the auto-insurance requirements under existing law.

• Mandate that drones of a certain size, and equipped with GPS capability, feature automatic shut-off technology that would activate if approaching an airport. This technology already exists, and is critical to protecting commercial passenger flights.

"The DRONE Act will ensure that negligent-drone operators can be held financially responsible, whenever injuries, interference, or property damage occurs," said Assemblyman Gatto. "This is a practical measure that will increase public safety and encourage responsible use of drones in California, without

harming the growth of the industry."

2015 showed that the nation's laws must adapt to the reality that hundreds of thousands of plastic and metal vehicles will be overhead in the years to come. Several fires across the state worsened when drone sightings grounded firefighting aircraft. A drone operator in West Hollywood fled the scene after flying a drone into power lines, causing a power outage and another fell from the sky in Pasadena, onto a mother pushing a baby carriage. And in March, a Lufthansa Airbus A380 reported a near-miss incident when a drone flew passed the aircraft at 5,000 feet as it approached LAX.

The DRONE Act now heads to the Senate.

Fire-Danger Level Elevated to Very High

ARCADIA - Angeles National Forest and San Gabriel Mountains National Monument (ANF/SGMNM) Fire Officials have raised the Fire Danger Level from "High" to "Very High" effective Monday, June 13th. Drought conditions continue for the fifth year in a row adding to already dry vegetation.

The forest has taken this step to enhance public awareness that wildfire probability increases as temperatures rise and brush dries out. The live fuel moisture levels in shrubs and brush have decreased, grasses at lower elevations cured early and recent fire activity has increased around the forest.

Despite the change, there are no new campfire restrictions. Open wood and charcoal fires will still be permitted in approved "developed" campgrounds and picnic areas where a steel ring or stoves are provided. Propane or jelled gas stoves and grills are permitted in non-developed areas with a valid California Campfire Permit. Smoking allowed in enclosed vehicles or developed recreation sites only.

3 Burglars Arrested Burglarizing Pot House

WEST COVINA - Police responded to the 1800 block of David Court about 1 p.m. on Wednesday, June 8, to a report of a burglary in progress. One of the burglars was reported to be armed with a handgun. When officers arrived, they found three subjects in the area and detained them. They were found to be the suspects and they were arrested for burglary.

The suspects broke windows to gain entry into the home. This

caught the attention of the witnesses who called police.

During the investigation, the officers found that the home that suspects were breaking into had an indoor marijuana farm. There were 30 plants presently growing and it appeared that many more had already been harvested.

No names were released on all the subjects as there is still an ongoing investigation.

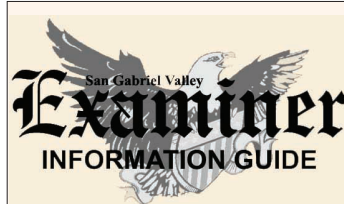
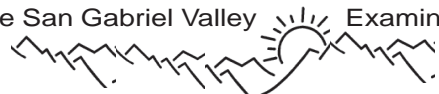

They Are Here, Terrorists Killing Americans Again

I have talked about this before, "it is going to happen here" and it did again. This time it is worse. At least 50 people killed and over 50 injured. A gunman using an assault-type rifle along with a handgun opened fire inside a crowded gay nightclub early Sunday, June 12, in Orlando, FL.

However, U.S. officials said they had seen no immediate evidence linking the militant group to the massacre in the Orlando nightclub.

So, where do these people come from?

Then we have the Santa Monica police arresting James Howell of Indiana this past Sunday morning after they "tripped across him" by accident and

Procedure, Paperwork? Not Necessary for Some Agendas

Until reports in local newspapers this past weekend for health care for illegals, I had never heard of Senator Ricardo Lara (D-33rd Bell Gardens). Out of curiosity, I decided to backtrack a little bit on SB 10 and the senator to see who he is and what he's been up to in Sacramento.

Senator Lara authored SB 10, signed by Gov. Jerry Brown last Friday, to expand health coverage to all Californians, regardless of immigration status. The bill permits the state to apply for a federal 1332 waiver that would allow undocumented immigrants and their non-US born children to buy coverage through Covered California using their own money. The bill specifically prohibits any cost to the state or federal government.

ACA or Affordable Care Act, excludes illegal immigrants from buying health care on the state exchanges like Covered California, however they are not prevented from buying health insurance on their own through any insurance company or broker. To obtain a 1332 waiver, a state must provide benefits at least as comprehensive as the "essential health benefits" all plans in insurance markets cover and not increase the federal deficit.

Covered California, under the Affordable Care Act (Obamacare) is the place Californians can get brand-name health insurance and the only place to get federal premium assistance when you buy private insurance.

What It Takes to Be an Effective Citizen

It's so easy in a presidential election year to forget that our system is not about a single person. This year especially, when the dynamics of the presidential contest have dominated news coverage so thoroughly that even the Senate and House races have largely disappeared from view, the crucial role that citizens play — apart from serving as voters in the presidential drama — isn't even an afterthought.

Yet effective citizenship is the base on which our representative democracy rests. Our vitality as a country depends on the involvement of millions of people in their neighborhoods and communities, in interest groups and civic organizations, in groups agitating for change and groups defending the status quo.

So just what constitutes effective citizenship? I believe it's made up of several elements.

First, a confident belief that change is possible — that the country can indeed make progress over time thanks to the efforts both of ordinary people and of political leaders. In his recent speech at Howard University, President Obama noted that by almost every measure, the country has moved forward over the last three decades. The poverty rate is down, as are the rates for crime and for teenage pregnancy. More Americans are getting college degrees, more women are working and earning more money, many cities are far

The website promotes private insurance at a discount or health insurance through Medi-Cal for those that qualify. If illegals are allowed to buy health insurance on their own, and SB 10 prohibits cost to the state or federal governments, I question the reason they need to be part of Covered California.

California Immigrant Policy Center, October 2015, as part of their promotion for health care for immigrants, presented statistics including the 2015-16 State budget that provided \$40 million to guarantee comprehensive, full scope Medi-Cal coverage to 170,000 undocumented or illegal children until they turn 19. Being proposed is \$132 million to continue expansion of the program. At question, how much of that Medi-Cal increase is a result of Lara's fact-finding mission to visit the Central American unaccompanied minors in Ventura County and their continued stay there. As part of that fact-finding trip, Lara secured \$3 million for non-profit organizations to provide legal representation to these children.

SB 10 had originally proposed a Statewide Director of immigrant Integration working out of the Governor's office. That position was incorporated in the last budget so Lara's bill was rewritten to become strictly a health care bill. Democrat Daniel Torres was appointed director, promoted out of the immigration branch of California Department of Social Services. Compensation is \$127,992 a year.

healthier than they were in the 1980s.

Yes, we've got miles to go on many fronts, but on the whole, I'll take where we stand today over where we stood in the 1980s. Our system is working better for more people than it did then.

The people who helped make this happen understood two things: that progress was possible, and that it required their efforts. This might seem too obvious even to say, but those who were most effective had an impact because they had the skills to make a difference.

I'm talking here about the fundamental ability we should all have as citizens to solve problems in a representative democracy that's filled with people who have different beliefs, perspectives, and experiences. This means knowing how to work together with all kinds of people, being able to find common ground, being forthright about aims and methods, forging connections to key officials and other players who can help advance a cause, building consensus, and communicating ideas effectively.

I use the word "skills," but in the end, good citizenship is as much about temperament as it is about ability. Mutual respect, tolerance, empathy, civility, humility, honesty, resolve — these are the simple virtues that our nation depends on in its citizens, not because they're nice to see, but because in a vibrant and diverse democracy they're crucial for making progress.

So is a willingness to step up to challenges. The people who make a difference in our system are the ones who not only identify a problem, but then plunge into fixing it.

I frequently hear from people

Elected in 2012, Senator Lara has been very active promoting and providing for the illegal community in California. He takes credit for AB 60, allowing illegals to obtain driver's licenses with DMV reporting 605,000 licenses issued the first year - January 2015 to January 2016 - or 50,000 a month during that time frame.

Lara also credits himself with passage of SB 210, the California DREAM Loan Program which helps undocumented students apply for loans to complete their higher education goals and awards up to \$4,000 a year, or \$20,000 total, for tuition, books, living and transportation expenses, and any other student expenses used to calculate a student's financial need for purposes of federal Title IV student aid programs.

SB 1159 authored by the senator allows the use of a Social Security Number or Taxpayer Identification Number to be used to apply for professional licenses circumventing any questions about the applicants legal or illegal status. Under Lara's law there are currently 40 professions listed on his website that allow this process when applying for a license ranging from Automotive Repair, Cosmetology, Acupuncture, and Contractor's License Boards. He does caution, on the website, those making application should review tax laws and perhaps consult with immigrant rights or a legal aid organization.

who are exasperated by the obstacles they have to overcome in order to make a difference: fellow citizens who are ignorant of the system, politicians who are too obtuse or self-interested to see the light, incompetence in the bureaucracy, officials protecting turf.... But here's the thing: those obstacles will always be there. You just have to keep plugging away at overcoming them, whether by casting an informed ballot, sitting down with — or protesting against — political leaders, or finding the myriad ways you can improve the quality of life for your neighbors and fellow Americans.

You may already have picked up on the final quality that makes for effective citizenship, and it's a tough one. For the most part, we're not going to solve our challenges in a single generation. So we have to educate our children and those who come after us in the same skill sets I've been talking about.

That's because, as I said at the start, our representative democracy is not all about the presidency. We — you, me, and our fellow citizens — are responsible for the future of our neighborhoods and our nation. Unless we all shoulder the obligation to learn the skills we need to shepherd it into the future, and then teach those skills to others, our country and our system will struggle.

A Weak Employment Report Financial - Ask Julia

The May employment report was weak, but there were a flurry of unusual factors that may have made it weaker than it should have been; the Verizon strike, weird weather and ongoing changes in the seasonal hiring pattern of retail employees are some of the obvious reasons.

Here's how the slowdown in hiring fits with other key economic concepts and Wall Street's thinking about the Fed.

>According to the Atlanta Fed, economic growth is tracking 2.5% in Q2 and 1.6% in the first half. There is still a great deal of second quarter data we don't know, however. That 2.5% number is an uninformed guess at this point.

>The Fed is eager to raise rates this summer, but officials who have talked about tightening have made clear they don't care if they hike in June or July, or even September for some members.

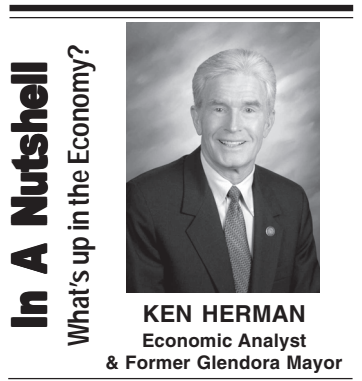
>Wall Street thinks the slowdown in hiring since February reflects slower growth in the first quarter and weaker corporate earnings in the past six quarters. Both reflect a correction in the energy producing economy which is drawing to a close, weakness in the global economy and recent strength in the dollar.

>There is reason for optimism in a recovery, but it is not yet a sure thing.

>For the FOMC, waiting for additional information on June 15 is the most reasonable course.

FALSE OPTIMISM AS THE EMPLOYMENT RATE FALLS

Nearly half of unemployed Americans have quit looking for work, and the numbers are even worse for the long-term jobless that paints a grim picture of the labor market. Some 59 percent of those who have been out of work for two years or more say they have stopped looking. Overall, 43 percent of the jobless said they have given up.



In A Nutshell
What's up in the Economy?

The unemployment rate fell to 4.7 percent in May, but the drop came primarily because of a sharp decline in the labor force participation rate. The number of people of all ages whom the government considers "not in the labor force" swelled by 664,000 to a record 94.7 million Americans, according to Labor Department data.

Job creation, after averaging more than 200,000 for much of the recovery, has slowed considerably this year. May saw just 38,000 new jobs, part of a trend in which payrolls have grown an average of 116,000 over the past three months and less than 150,000 for all of 2016.

YELLEN SPEAKS, MARKETS KEYS AWAY

In a speech at the World Affairs Council of Philadelphia last Monday, Janet Yellen struck a conciliatory and balanced tone as she laid out the case that the US economy is strengthening, yet considerable risks remain to the outlook. After citing several indicators that show a steadily improving labor market over the past year, Chair Yellen said this past Friday's jobs report was 'disappointing' and deserves monitoring. And while acknowledging a relatively weak Q1, she said a significant step-up in consumer spending should boost Q2 GDP. She was not so quick to dismiss slower-than-expected inflation, however, but said she was confident that after the price effects of oil and the dollar wore off inflation would return to the Fed's 2% objective.

Most important take-away:

In the short term, her quote that "we will need to watch labor market developments carefully" implies that a summer rate hike may be off the table without robust economic data between now and the July meeting. Longer term, Yellen said that she believes "we are now close to eliminating the slack that has weighed on the labor market since the recession," which is new coming from her. Labor market slack has been a consistent reason she has cited to keep rates low; the elimination of slack will be cause to raise rates if recent weak data proves transitory.

Bottom Line: June is off the table. July hike only if economic data surprises to the upside over the next two months. The economic projections that accompany the June FOMC meeting will likely contain the most important information with regard to Fed thinking for the next month. If the board views the current slowdown in hiring as a blip on the radar, it will be reflected in an unadjusted forecast, where they still forecast two hikes before year end. Any adjustment down in either inflation projections or the forecast will show the FOMC is taking the recent sneeze as a sign of a potential cold to come.

On balance, the May employment report was a wake-up call which justifies putting rate hikes on hold until after the June meeting. In July, the Fed will have a considerably better idea of spending and employment in the second quarter. Plus, the UK vote on exiting the EU (Brexit) will be behind us and we'll have a better idea of how China is weathering its summer cash squeeze.

Board of Equalization Sets Utility Property Values for Fiscal Year 2016-17

SACRAMENTO—Local governments will receive \$1.412 billion in tax revenue in the upcoming fiscal year because of the California State Board of Equalization's (BOE) assessment of privately owned public utilities and railroads. The values for these properties for Fiscal Year 2016-17 were set at \$102.7 billion by the BOE at its May 24, 2016, meeting in Sacramento by unanimous vote.

Total values are \$2.6 billion more than the \$100.1 billion adopted by the Board last year, and will generate approximately \$36 million more in taxes for local governments than in the current fiscal year. Values were set for 400 companies with property in California. They include telephone (long distance, local, and wireless), gas and electric companies, railroads, and inter-county pipelines.

"Local governments desperately need this revenue," said Board Member Jerome E. Horton. "I am pleased to be in a position to provide and protect it for our schools, public safety, road repairs, and other badly needed services throughout the State of California."

While most properties are assessed by county officials, privately held public utilities are assessed by the BOE statewide. These properties are not subject to Proposition 13, and are reappraised annually at their market value.

A "unitary value" includes improvements, personal property, and land. A unitary valuation applies to properties owned or used by public utilities and railroads which are considered necessary to their operation.

The BOE determines the fair market value on January 1st of each year by considering market conditions, use of the property, income generated by the property, replacement costs and investments in the property, regulatory climate, depreciation, and

other factors.

The values set by the BOE are used by county governments to levy local property taxes, which help support county governments, cities, special districts, and schools. Penalties are assessed for late or incomplete filings, or failure to file with the BOE.

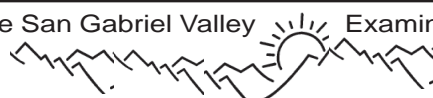

Scout Troop 433 Recognized at Council Meeting

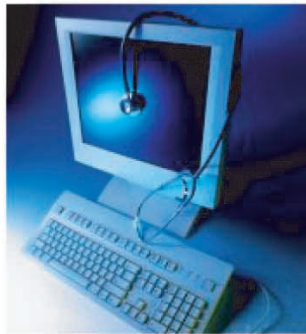

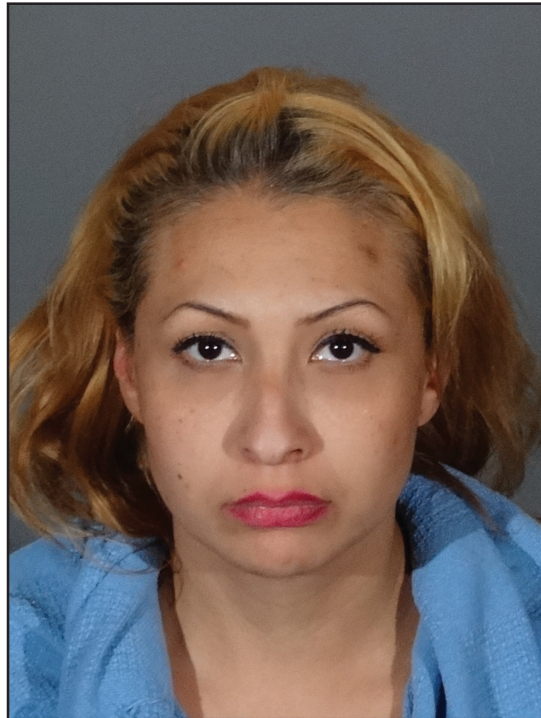

Two Arrested After Committing A Series Of Overnight Vehicle Burglaries
