# North Park Continuation High Principal Honored as Educator of the Month

**BALDWIN PARK** – North Park Continuation High School Principal H. Vincent Pratt has been honored as a January Educator of the Month by the Los Angeles Lakers for his dedication to his students.

Pratt, who has been with Baldwin Park Unified for eight years, is a 20-year educator who focuses on building relationships with students and collaborations with the community to help students achieve their potential. Pratt was nominated by North Park health clerk Jeremiah I. Urista.

Urista praised Pratt's ability to connect with students, noting how the principal greets every student with a handshake each morning and never ceases his efforts to create a fun, inspiring environment for learning.

"I'm just blessed to be able to serve," said Pratt, 45. "If people see any good in me, it's just a reflection of the great students we have, this great community and the amazing support I get from our awesome staff, parents and District. It's really an honor for the community."

North Park, an alternative

school for juniors and seniors who face significant life challenges, has been designated a Model Continuation School by California. The school provides a host of special services, including teen parent support program Cal-SAFE, anger management and substance counseling.

Still, North Park boasts a superior graduation rate, has slashed suspensions and has strong attendance, Pratt said.

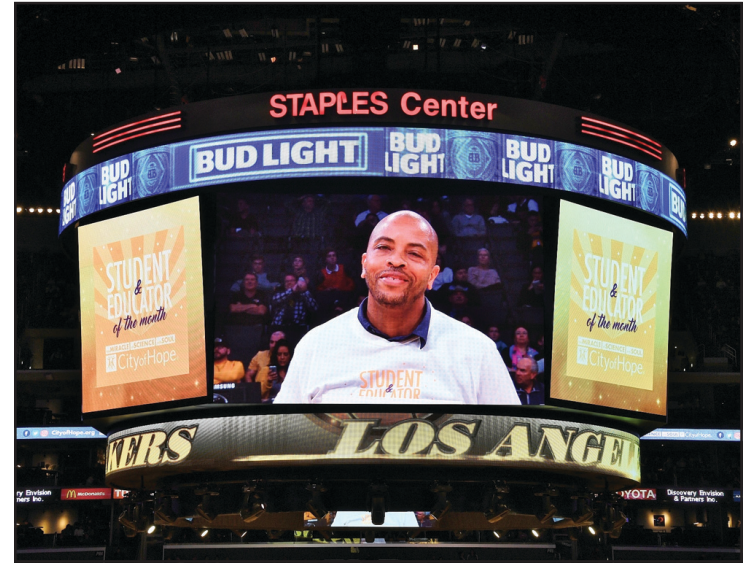
"Our students are motivated

and passionate about their future," Pratt said. "It all centers around relationships."

Pratt has forged partnerships with community counseling programs and helped launch a fatherhood program. Pratt's monthly coffee meetings regularly draw up to 40 parents. Parent education classes also offer guidance on social media and recognizing substance abuse, and offer steps parents can take to help their children.

"We have to meet the students where they are. If I'm homeless, hungry and I just got to school late, that's not a reason I should be punished. It's our goal to connect. We've got to meet the physical needs, the social-emotional needs; that way we can make sure we get them with the academics," he said.

In addition, North Park has

created leadership programs, such as an Associated Student Body, and clubs to keep students engaged. In 2014, the school held its first prom, now an annual tradition.

"We're an alternative environment, but we don't have to feel like that," Pratt said. "Our goal is to connect our students to the opportunities the world has for them, to get them career and college ready."

Counselor Jim Orick said Pratt's leadership is responsible for inspiring success.

"During the 34 years I have been working with students, I have never had the pleasure of working with a more caring and hard-working principal. He will jump in to help anyone, with any task, and he treats all of our students as if they were his own children," Orick said. "Last year, we posted the highest graduation rate

in the school's history, 93.4 percent, under his leadership."

Pratt was honored by the Lakers at the team's Jan. 17 home game. Lakers staff gave Pratt and his family a tour during the second quarter – and Pratt got a chance to take a photo of Laker great Magic Johnson. The team then honored Pratt, two other Los Angeles area educators and three students during halftime.

That's when he received another surprise.

"When they brought me out on the floor and called my name, there was a huge crowd screaming," Pratt said.

He learned that members of his staff, district Superintendent Froilan N. Mendoza and members of the Board of Education arranged to attend the game so they could help celebrate his award. "I was at a loss for words," Pratt said. "It was truly an honor."

# Dominic Bottencino's Troop 491 Eagle Scout Project helps Santa Teresita Care Center in Duarte

**DUARTE** - Eagle Scout candidate Dominic Bottencino, age 16, from Troop 491 in Glendora, recently completed his Eagle Scout Project for the Santa Teresita senior care center in Duarte. Dominic and his crew of fellow Scouts and Scout parents refurbished and repaired two 8' wooden planters, fabricated two more identical planters from scratch, painted a large metal entry gate, replaced a tennis court net, and provided solar powered landscaping lights.

The Santa Teresita facility provides long and short-term care with support of comprehensive rehabilitation services, pastoral care and intergenerational activities for seniors.

Dominic learned from a friend's mother that the nuns at Santa Teresita needed work done at the facility but couldn't afford the costs. After making contact, Dominic decided his Eagle Scout Project could help and together they identified where and what work was needed. Supplies for the project where considerable, consisting of fourteen pieces of 8' redwood, gallons of paint, brushes, hardware, twenty cubic feet of soil for the planters, and a new tennis court net.

A fundraiser at Chili's in Glendora and a few private donations helped raise the needed resources for the project. LeMar Hardwood of Glendora routed the planter boards free of charge. The planters were assembled at

Dominic's house by his fellow Scouts and moved to the facility.

The biggest lesson Dominic learned was "consistency" he said. "Staying on top" of the project proved the biggest challenge as access to the secure facility relied on communications made far in advance. The coordination other Scouts and parents required constant communication and planning as well.

Dominic has been in Scouting since he started in Cub Scouts ten years ago. Since his time in Troop 491 he has held the role of Patrol Leader, Assistant Patrol Leader, Chaplin Aide and Troop Guide. A Junior at Damien High School, Dominic plans to attend an out of state college after graduation.

The Eagle Scout Service Project, or more simply the Eagle Scout Project, is the opportunity for a Boy Scout in the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) to demonstrate leadership skills while performing a project for the benefit of his community. This is the culmination of the Eagle Scout candidate's leadership training, and it requires a significant effort on his part.

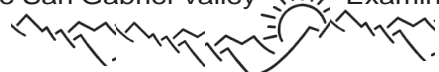

Our community is blessed to



# Hiker Dies and Four Injured in Angeles National Forest

**ANGELES NATIONAL FOREST** - A group of hikers in their 60's were enjoying their adventure when it went horribly wrong around 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, February 4th. It was reported that while they were hiking in the Angeles National Forest, they fell through an "ice shoot". The accident was north of the San Gabriel Valley near Islip Saddle, which is where San Gabriel Canyon Road and Angeles Crest Highway come together north of Crystal Lake. This is a popular hiking area with a parking area for about 40 vehicles at

that spot. Things went bad when one hiker fell and another tried to rescue that hiker. As the result, 5 hikers became involve in the accident.

Calls were made for assistance just after 11:00 a.m. and it just so happened that the Ventura County Search and Rescue Team were in training nearby. This training exercise turned into the real thing. The Los Angeles County Search and Rescue also joined in the rescue along with a helicopter response.

Despite the heroic efforts of

all the deputies, one hiker was pronounced dead at the scene. Three others were rescued and flown by helicopter to the hospital. The other injured hiker had only minor injuries and was able to hike out of the area with the assistance of the rescue teams.

The response was compromised by a landslide on San Gabriel Canyon Road as the rescue teams had to work their way around this blockage to get to the scene.

The remaining hikers, 3 men and a woman are all expected to survive their injuries.

# Foothill Gold Line Board Approves New Project Schedule

**MONROVIA** - At their January meeting on January 25th, the Foothill Gold Line Construction Authority (Construction Authority) Board of Directors approved an updated workplan and schedule for the 12.3-mile, six-station Foothill Gold Line light rail extension from Glendora to Montclair. The updated schedule, which assumes ground breaking in October 2017 and substantial completion in late-2025 to early-2026, is based on detailed constructability reviews completed late last year on the project's draft advanced conceptual engineering (ACE) documents.

"We have a more detailed understanding of this project and how we will build it," explained Habib F. Balian, CEO of the Foothill Gold Line Construction Authority. "It is really two major projects in one - the freight and Metrolink relocation/reconstruction will have to be completed first, followed by construction of the light rail system. And to reduce risk for the future design-build contractor, the first year of the project will be used

to relocate utilities and conduct pre-construction activities."

The previously approved schedule, approved in 2015, had estimated completion in 2023; however, since then the Construction Authority refined the project scope through the ACE process and also put in place Master Cooperative Agreements (MCAs) with each of the project's corridor cities, Metrolink and other third parties that provide more details on the project and how it will be built. The agency integrated this new information, including new constraints agreed to through the MCAs (such as constraints for grade crossing construction and Metrolink station and track relocation, and requirements to build several temporary rail detours), resulting in two years of construction being added to the project schedule.

"This is an important step in our project development process and a natural part of the progression of a major infrastructure project like the Foothill Gold Line as it advances through planning and design," added Balian. "Our estimators and scheduling

experts were given much more detailed information about the project and construction constraints and created a 7,000-activity construction phasing plan. This is the best information we have to work with until a design-build contractor is hired and provides their plan for the work."

Based on this new schedule, the Construction Authority Board also approved an updated financial plan for the agency that incorporated a new project estimate for the Glendora to Montclair extension. The latest estimate confirmed that the construction costs in the previously approved 2015 estimate for the project remain accurate; however, costs associated with the additional two years of work, along with new prevailing and minimum wage increases that will take effect during construction, add about \$118 million to the overall budget estimate for the project. The latest project estimate totals \$1,374 million for the six-station Glendora to Montclair extension (including Los Angeles and San Bernardino County construction).

# County And City Of El Monte Partner On A Second Affordable Housing Development For Homeless Veterans

**LOS ANGELES COUNTY** - The Community Development Commission of the County of Los Angeles (CDC) joined Los Angeles County Supervisor Hilda L. Solis, City of El Monte elected officials, and Hollywood Community Housing Corporation to celebrate the groundbreaking of Palo Verde Apartments, a 49-unit multifamily affordable housing development that will provide permanent sup-

portive housing for low- and very low-income households as well as homeless Veterans.

Palo Verde Apartments will feature onsite parking, a laundry room, multiple community rooms, including a ground floor club house, computer lab, property management offices, private meeting room, and an outdoor courtyard. The four-story residential building is designed to be compatible within its City of El Monte neighborhood.

The CDC is providing \$3.3 million in Affordable Housing Trust Funds for acquisition and permanent financing towards the construction of this housing development. Additionally, the Housing Authority of the County of Los Angeles is providing 16 project-based Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (VASH) vouchers and nine project-based vouchers to assist homeless veterans.

Sean Rogan, CDC Executive Director said, "In 2014, we partnered with the City of El Monte

to build and subsidize Veterans Village. We are proud to once again come together to offer more supportive housing for Veterans, and dedicate vouchers to ensure that the units remain affordable for each tenant."

To help tenants gain the skills they need to adapt to, and thrive, in their new home and community, each special needs resident will have a comprehensive case management plan tailored to his or her basic health and mental health care, as well as education and employment assistance. On-site service providers will outline steps toward meeting resident goals; and stipulate specific responsibilities of the resident and for implementation.

# Sanctuary State - Necessity or Political Hype?

City after city, some in the San Gabriel Valley, are taking votes at their council meetings to become sanctuary cities. That is their statement to protect illegal immigrants from what they feel will be massive deportation under the Trump administration.

Trump, in document after document that I've seen, is ready to deport the violent criminal and repeat offenders that are costing American lives and the state a huge amount of money incarcerating and re-incarcerating these threats to public safety. Last number I heard was \$6,000 per year per inmate to keep them incarcerated.

Senator Kevin De Leon, as reported is the son of illegal immigrants, and has authored SB 54 which according to the analysis by Senate Committee on Public Safety ... "limits state and local law enforcement agencies involvement in immigration enforcement to ensure eligible individuals are able to seek services from and engage with state agencies without regard to their immigration status."

The bill goes on to say that no police agency or vendor contracted by a police agency may share their information / data base with

federal immigration authorities ... "for the purposes of immigration enforcement or detain an individual at the request of federal immigration authorities ... absent a judicial warrant."

While California is on the warpath with Washington D.C. and the Republican Administration over what might be non-issues and willing to accept cancellation of grants and other federal funding, Texas has taken a different stance on the immigration issue.

As reported in The Intercept, Texas Governor Greg Abbott has taken the opposite approach. He has taken on Travis County Sheriff Sally Hernandez who issued a directive to her officers forbid-

ding any cooperation with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). Abbott told Hernandez her policy "betrays her oath of office and the residents of Travis County." He yanked \$1.5 million in criminal justice-related grants to Hernandez and Travis County Sheriff Department according to The Intercept.

Law enforcement has spent a lot of time learning how to cooperate with each other and share information for the benefit of the people they have taken an oath of office to serve. Not only law enforcement but other agencies throughout Los Angeles County and other counties in the state have had to go through a process to learn to share and cooperate.

It would be a very sad day to spend all this time, energy and communication hype for something that was never intended to happen or will never happen and especially if it is all for a political purpose of self-promotion and re-election. Question: How much money is all this costing the taxpayers that may not be necessary? Question: How much damage overall will be done by agencies statewide withdrawing any and all cooperation on this and other issues?

As Republicans contemplate repealing the Affordable Care Act (ACA or "ObamaCare")—seriously, not just as a political gesture—alarms are sounding about millions of individuals losing coverage.

So soon we have forgotten about the millions who lost coverage they had had for years because ObamaCare outlawed it.

ObamaCare resulted in perhaps five times as many losers as winners—even counting just those who ended up with more expensive or less desirable coverage. If you count the taxpayers, the tally of losers is much higher. But with government largesse, the losers—the ones who have their earnings taken away—are "forgotten men."

Anyone who has government-funded benefits taken away, on the other hand, becomes a victim.

The best poster children are cancer victims. They face a premature, particularly nasty death. Who would deny someone's mother or 4-year-old daughter the chance of a cure, even if the chemotherapy costs more than \$100,000?

ObamaCare would. Exchange plans have excluded the best cancer hospitals from their narrow networks. Medicaid would. It might call the treatment "experimental" or "not cost-effective." Medicare would, possibly just because the patient is "too old" or "too young." Unless the particular victim can be featured in a PR campaign to "save ObamaCare," she might be "better off with the pain pill," as President Obama put it.

And let's not forget how the FDA has driven the costs of drug approval sky-high, suppresses therapies that have no prospect of turning billion-dollar profits, and protects manufacturers against competition when the drug is about to go off patent. The anti-leukemia drug Gleevec, for example, cost \$26,000 per year in 2001, a price called "high but fair," considering the cost of research and the need for profits. It is \$146,000 a year today, but the introduction of cheaper generics in the U.S. is being delayed.

Why can such prices be sustained? Because third parties sometimes pay them. One ObamaCare plan reportedly pays \$10,488 per month for Gleevec, from a pharmacy with which it apparently has an arrangement, although it might be available from Walgreen's for \$4,400, and from other pharmacies for still less. What would the hapless patient do if her Exchange plan went out of business (maybe because Republicans took away its subsidies or maybe because it just failed)? One option would be to go to India and buy a year's supply of a generic version of Gleevec for \$400. (The cost of manufacture is \$159.) In fact, the manufacturer might well give her the drug to buff up its image. But drug companies really love the third-party payment schemes, just like big hospitals do.

Do the designers of ACA—which would be more aptly named the Unaffordable Care Act—really care about cancer patients? Such patients may be useful props for lobbying, but they don't help achieve the reformers' stated goal of maximizing "population health." Prolonging the lives of sick people reduces the average health score.

Money spent on Gleevec is diverted from reducing disparities, achieving "quality" quotas, and paying for the information technology and administrators to "document" all that (and sell the data).

The current "healthcare delivery" system, including entitlement programs (e.g. Medicare and Medicaid), is about the redistribution of wealth and the control of medical care, which enables control of the population. The idea of comprehensive third-party payment for all medical care (all that is allowed) destroys medicine—the care of the sick—while placing unsustainable burdens on the economy.

The people who are terrified about losing their ObamaCare "coverage" are the very ones at greatest risk of losing their lives if ObamaCare is perpetuated.

Real reform would put patients back at the center and demote insurance companies to their proper function of reimbursing subscribers for the costs of unexpected catastrophes. Costs would plummet, and innovation would soar.

While the free market is building much better facilities, some patients will be caught in the transition. But we should be concerned about their actual care, not their coverage. They can be helped in many ways, without destroying arrangements that work for the 99 percent. Perhaps a dollar-for-dollar tax credit for those helping to pay for their treatment?

What if we said that those who like their government medicine can keep it? Just let the rest of us go.

# Can Trump Deliver 4% GDP Growth

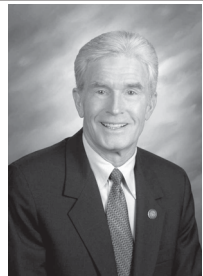
Last week, I asked, "Will We Ever See 4% GDP Growth Again?" That was the standard set by Reagan in the 1980s and Clinton in the 1990s, as well as several other Presidents before them.

Manufacturing jobs as a share of overall jobs declined under all 11 Presidents since Eisenhower. Many Americans believe that is an unstoppable trend, as cheap overseas labor continues to be available to perform the unsatisfying and repetitive drudgery of slapping new products together. However, America has ample unemployed people who could do that work if they had the opportunity and if they can be motivated to do so. America will also need more (and better) education for higher-level jobs in order to move more jobs back to America.

The "first 100 days" was somewhat of a mythical measuring period for a new administration. Only Franklin Delano Roosevelt tried (and succeeded) in changing the direction of a nation in so short a time. The U.S. economy is now such a huge ocean liner that it may take many months to turn around, and years to turn those trends into measurable growth. Although sentiment can change on a dime, actual results usually take longer than 100 days.

The stock market has risen in the first 100 days (January 21st to April 20th) under four of the last five Presidents, averaging +2.34% in that sliver of time. Only George W. Bush suffered a falling market in his first 100 days. Barack Obama's first 50 days were down, but then the market bottomed on March 9, 2009 and kept rising (due primarily to the depth of the fall prior to then) over nearly eight years. Ronald Reagan's first 100 days saw the Dow rise less than 1%,

but it fell sharply until August 1982, when a massive 18-year bull market began.

Like Trump, Reagan inherited a sub-par economy struggling in a slow-growth mode, unable to recover after that generation's recession (1973-74). But the similarities end there. Reagan also had to combat double-digit unemployment and interest rates, plus high inflation amid stagflation (stagflation).

Let's compare Trumponomics to Reaganomics, under three broad headings:

#1: Tax reform: Our corporate tax rate is the highest in the developed world, at 39.6%. Trump wants to cut the top federal corporate rate to 15%. Since U.S. businesses currently hold \$2.6 trillion in cash offshore, the President might raise revenue while promoting growth if he taxes that cash at just 10%.

As for personal tax rates, back in Reagan's day, the Kemp-Roth tax cuts (the Economic Recovery Act of 1981) cut rates across the board by 25% in three years. The top rate was cut from 70% to 50%. In his second term, the Tax Reform Act of 1986 cut rates down to two - 15% for the middle class and 28% for the rich. Today, Trump and House Speaker Paul Ryan favor just three brackets (12%, 25%, and 33%).

Reagan's policies did not significantly reduce the tax burden on higher-income individuals. Nor should Trump's policies. In

fact, Trump's Treasury Secretary choice Steve Mnuchin told CNBC on November 30, 2016 that "there will be no absolute tax cut for the upper class."

#2-Deregulation. The best statistical indicator of the volume of red tape binding businesses in America is the annual number of pages added to The Federal Register, the official record of government regulations. The number of new pages peaked under Jimmy Carter with 73,258 pages in 1980. Reagan's most lenient year was 1986, with 44,812 pages. By contrast, President Obama added a record 97,110 pages in 2016.

#3-Trade. This comparison is more cautionary than the first two. Back in 1988, the last full year under Reagan, The Cato Institute published an analysis of Reagan's trade policies, saying: "The Reagan administration has failed to promote free trade. Ronald Reagan by his actions has become the most protectionist president since Herbert Hoover, the heavyweight champion of protectionists."

Trump has promised to "trump" Hoover and Reagan as a protectionist. But he might be backing off from his most extreme positions. He has plenty of good people advising if he listens. Let us hope that he is just a good negotiator making threats to bring the other side to the negotiating table.

By learning from history - especially the pros and cons of Reaganomics - Trump's team could return us to 3% per year GDP growth, on average, and maybe 4%. If he doesn't, he may not be re-elected.

# Your Money - Ask Julia

*How can I stick to my goal of paying off my credit cards, not look like a cheapskate, and still treat my Valentine special?*

It's the thought that counts, not the price of the gift(s). It should mean more to your Valentine that you took the time to think about, and plan a fun, memorable, yet inexpensive way to show your love. Look for a community concert, take a hike, enjoy a romantic picnic, write a love letter and read it out loud in a romantic location. Start saving a little each month for the next event.

*My long-time domestic partner recently retired (no other income than Social Security) and can no longer afford the mortgage payments. I'm the sole bread-winner now, and am taking over these payments. Will I be able to deduct the mortgage interest on my income taxes?*

You should check with your CPA or the IRS. Ask if you can claim your partner as a dependent. If you are not on the Title (Deed), you can contact an Escrow company or attorney to get that done. For information on different ways to hold Title (right of survivorship, etc.) you could contact a title company rep (Bob Mello 818-240-4912, StanTitleMan.com, Kim Fanucchi (626) 675-1008). It seems logical that if you are paying the mortgage, you should be able to take the tax deduction. However, logic and legal are not always the same.

*We decided that we can afford life insurance OR long-term care insurance, but not both. We're leaning toward life insurance, but what do you recommend?*

I recommend a life insurance policy that can also cover your long-term care needs in the future. Often these policies not only leave your heirs an inheritance upon your death, but also give you access to some of the money while you are alive.

*I'm 53 years old, and am the only employee in my own business. I pay myself \$150,000 per year. Is there a retirement plan for me?*

What you might want to look at is a one-person defined benefit plan. There are pro's and con's to this type of plan. It allows the individual to build a retirement account fast, and can be a tax deduction for the business. However, it is expensive to make any changes in the plan. This is a problem if there is a lack of funds due to a down year in business. Instead, you might consider buying a life insurance policy with living benefits. The cash account of this type of life insurance can be used by you for anything, and does not have the government RMD (required minimum distribution) rule that hits at age 70-1/2.

*My husband has told me that he will take care of me when I*

*get old rather than sending me to a nursing home. But, what happens if he dies before me?*

And, what if he needs care first, and is alive and unable to care for you? Talk to him about these concerns. Good idea to do some planning, just in case. Call around and find out the costs for Assisted Living and Nursing Homes. Learn the rules for Medicare, specifically with regard to assets. (Look for 5-year look-back rule.) And, get quotes on long-term-care insurance.

*In 1997, when we were 20, we each bought a 30-year term life insurance policy. We're still in good health. Could we save money by buying a new life insurance policy now, or should we just wait until the 30-year policy runs out?*

Do not let your current life insurance policy run out. It's usually not a good idea to wait. Once you have life insurance in place, you'll have it for the full term of that insurance policy, regardless of changes in your health. When you get a good quote, apply to see if you qualify. If you decide to buy a new policy, cancel your old policy only after the new policy is fully active.

# Assessor Jeffrey Prang And Board Of Supervisors Promote Tax Savings For Nearly 400,000 Homeowners

LOS ANGELES - Los Angeles County Assessor Jeffrey Prang and the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors have proclaimed January as Homeowners' Exemption Awareness Month. Today, the Board of Supervisors supported Assessor Prang's countywide effort to promote the Homeowners' Exemption, part of a broader campaign by the Assessor to raise awareness about property tax savings available for

homeowners. It is estimated that nearly 400,000 homeowners have yet to take advantage of the Homeowners' Exemption in Los Angeles County.

The Homeowners' Exemption lowers a home's assessed value by \$7,000, thereby reducing the property tax bill by about \$70 annually. Although an annual savings of \$70 dollars seems small, a little often goes a long way for many homeowners. For example,

an annual savings of \$70 dollars over ten years is \$700, the price of a new water heater - which often need to be replaced every ten years.

"Thank you for the Board of Supervisors for joining us in declaring January as Homeowners' Exemption Month," said Assessor Jeffrey Prang. "I am making every effort to inform taxpayers about this important tax savings available for homeowners. This exemption can be especially beneficial to low-income homeowners and those on fixed incomes. Every homeowner should apply for this free tax benefit."

Once qualified for the Exemption, a homeowner does not have to reapply, meaning the savings will be applied until a change of ownership or reassessment. To qualify for the exemption, the home must be the owners' principal residence.

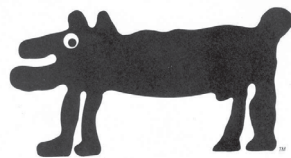
