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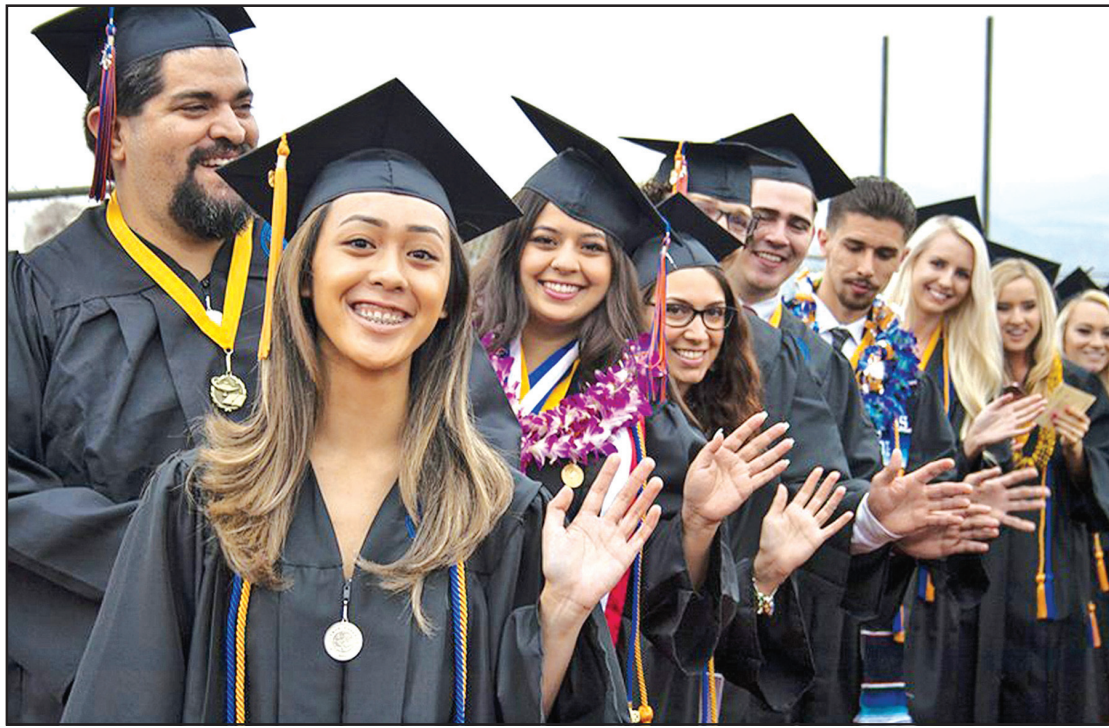
# Citrus College Celebrates Highest Number of Graduates at Annual Ceremony

**GLENDORA** – Citrus College celebrated the academic achievements of 1,425 graduates, the highest number in institutional history, during its annual Commencement Ceremony on Saturday, June 11, 2016.

The Citrus College Class of 2016 is nearly 25 percent larger than that of the previous year and breaks a 100-year record for the total number of students receiving associate degrees. These impressive completion rates mark the continuation of an institutional trend that has resulted in Citrus College being ranked 12th out of more than 1,100 community colleges in the United States in awarding associate degrees to Hispanic students.

Glendora resident Maxime Tondre is a member of this year's graduating class. A player on the Men's Basketball Team, Tondre says he enrolled as an average student who was mainly interested in the college's Athletics Program. However, the 23-year-old business major experienced a transformation during his time at Citrus College and was recently honored for having one of the highest overall academic performances during the 2015-2016 academic year.

Tondre will be transferring to a four-year university in the fall

and hopes to one day empower and educate students in Western Africa.

"I am convinced that Citrus College provided me with the tools I needed to reach my full potential," Tondre said. "I believe that my education will serve as the foundation for my future success, and I hope that it allows me to serve as an example and inspire others to follow a similar path."

Foster was also among those who received their degree during Saturday's ceremony. A veteran of the Army National Guard and a licensed real estate agent, Foster enrolled in classes at Citrus College after falling on difficult times.

"I was single, pregnant and facing eviction. Even after giving birth to my daughter, I had to move back and forth from the homes of various family members to keep a roof over our heads," she remembers. "However, everything changed when I enrolled at Citrus College. Instead of living a nightmare, I was soon pursuing my dream."

The 41-year-old business administration major will be continuing her education at California Polytechnic University, Pomona in the fall. She hopes to become a real estate broker and open her own property management business.

Dr. Geraldine M. Perri, superintendent/president, says that the experiences of these two graduates are representative of many Citrus College students.

"The stories of success and achievement shared by the Class of 2016 are inspirational," she said. "It is an honor for Citrus College to be part of each student's journey toward aca-

dem, professional, and personal growth. On behalf of the entire college community, I congratulate each graduate on reaching the significant milestone of earning an associate degree."

## Antonovich Hosts Police Chiefs Amid Concern Over Prison "Reform" Initiative

**LOS ANGELES COUNTY** – Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich hosted his annual Police Chiefs' Luncheon where a warning was sounded regarding the so-called "Public Safety and Rehabilitation Act" on the November ballot. L.A. County Sheriff Jim McDonnell, police chiefs from across the 5th District and other law enforcement leaders were in attendance.

"This ineptly named initiative would result in the early release of thousands more state prisoners," said Antonovich. "Crime is already on the upswing due to Governor Brown's recent prison reduction program -- the last thing we need is more crime."

"This initiative would make the Three Strikes law meaningless," said Michelle Hanisee, President of the Association of Deputy District Attorneys. "Corrections officials would be required to grant early release

for participating in programs." Although the act supposedly deals with low-level criminals, previous "strikes" would no longer be taken into consideration at parole hearings. The so-called non-violent crimes ineligible for early release include rape of an unconscious person or an assault on a police officer.

Central Division Sheriff's Department Chief Bobby D. Denham gave an update to the more than 40 law enforcement

leaders on the Sheriff's plan to use body-borne cameras. He warned that the complex nature of law enforcement represents bigger challenges. When choosing a vendor, he said the department needs to make sure the devices are durable and have strong batteries. Among other issues, Denham discussed docking stations, as well as software that can be upgraded with new technology, and data that can easily be shared with prosecutors.

## 626 Golden Streets Comes To Duarte June 26; Street Closures Will Occur



**DUARTE** - Starting Sunday, June 26 at 5:00 a.m., the long awaited "626 Golden Streets" Regional Open Streets event will require numerous street closures along the event route including several in the City of Duarte. The City of Duarte's portion of the 626 Golden Streets event includes the following roadway segments; Duarte Road from Mountain Avenue to Highland Avenue, Highland Avenue from Duarte Road to Central Avenue, Central Avenue from Highland Avenue to Crestfield Avenue,

Crestfield Avenue from Central Avenue to Huntington Drive and Huntington Drive from Crestfield Avenue to the San Gabriel River Bridge. The San Gabriel River Bridge will be closed to all traffic. Duarte residents can expect that traffic along Huntington Drive, Buena Vista Ave and Duarte Road will be very heavy during the event and residents should take appropriate measures to plan ahead and use alternative routes.

Modeled after the thousands of other "open streets" or "ciclovia" events across the United States, the "626 Golden Streets" 17 mile event will open stretches of roadway from South Pasadena to Azusa for people to walk, jog, skate, bike and more between the hours of 8:00 am to 2:00 pm. Organizers are excited to bring this concept to 7 San Gabriel Valley cities for the first time. Specifically, the seven City events will close certain city streets to motorists from South Pasadena, San Marino, Arcadia, Monrovia, Duarte and finally Irwindale to Azusa.

Each City will operate a festival "Hub" and Duarte's will be located directly in front of the City of Hope campus on Duarte Road. Duarte's "Hub" will include lots of food trucks, information tables, live demonstra-

## Azusa Senior Center, Memorial Park And City Library Are Official Cooling Centers

**AZUSA** - The National Weather Service is forecasting for hot weather for the next few days. Temperatures are expected to go above 100 degrees Fahrenheit in parts of the desert, mountains, and many San Gabriel Valley areas of Southern California.

The Azusa Senior Center at 740 N. Dalton, Azusa City Library at 729 N. Dalton and Memorial Park at 320 N. Orange are all official "Cooling Centers." The summer plan will be coordinated through the Recreation and Family Services Department of the City with two main objectives: to provide a place to cool off when the temperature rises to 100 degrees Fahrenheit or above, and to provide all persons with water to prevent dehydration, heat stroke and the onset of hyperthermia.

At the Azusa Library, you can catch up on the latest novel or read that magazine article you have been putting off. The Senior Center has a limited library and offers the latest movies shown on their big screen TV in air-conditioned comfort.

The Senior Center will be open and staffed from 8:30 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. Monday through Thursday and from 8:30 A.M. to 1:30 P.M. on Friday's. The Senior Center will be closed on Saturday's; however just across the street the City Library will be open. The Center will open on Sunday's from 10:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. and even later upon staff discretion of temperature.

The Memorial Park gymnasium is staffed Monday through Thursday from 7:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M. and on Friday's from 1:00 to 6:00 P.M. On Saturday's and Sunday's the hours of operation during a 100 degree Fahrenheit or above day will be from 10:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. (or later at the discretion of staff based on

weather conditions).

Memorial Park's gymnasium is air conditioned.

The Library "Cooling Center" will operate during the regular Azusa Library hours, which are Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 10:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M., Thursday from 10:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M., and Friday and Saturday from 10:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.

In conjunction with the Office of Emergency Management, additional hours of operation may be assigned based on weather conditions going above 100 degrees Fahrenheit on an as needed basis.

## Parks Undergo Makeover As Summer Approaches

*Environmentally friendly fountains among new features*

**BALDWIN PARK** - Two of the city's most visited recreation outlets are getting a makeover. By the end of this month, both Barnes Park and Morgan Park will have undergone a complete resurfacing and repainting of their basketball courts, a project officials said has been long overdue.

Maria Moreno, acting operations supervisor for the city's Department of Recreation and Community Services, said the Barnes Park project at 3251 Patriiti Ave. was completed earlier this month. Now, workers are focusing their efforts on giving the two basketball courts at Morgan Park, located at 4100 Baldwin Park Blvd., along with their surrounding area, an upgrade.

By next week, officials with facilities maintenance are expected to put final touches on a project to renew and repaint both full-size courts at Morgan Park. That renovation includes hydro blasting the existing courts, as well as filling cracks and spalls, before a new non-skid surface is put in place. Moreno believes it has been about four years since the basketball courts were updated.

Already completed as part of the Morgan Park project is the replacement of eight light poles, now with LED lighting, along the perimeter of the basketball court area. "The lights were original to when the courts were done, but over time, there was a lot of damage on the actual posts due to weather and corrosion," Moreno said.

Next week, officials will install a new bottle filling station in place of the traditional drinking faucet near the courts. The new station, designed by ELKAY, will provide visitors with filtered water, all with the convenience of keeping their water bottles upright during the filling process. Project organizers hope the new water stations will help save on plastic bottle waste, complementing Baldwin Park's efforts to remain environmentally friendly.

"We currently have some fountains like this indoors, and those are very popular with our visitors," added Moreno. "This is going to be great with our residents because now they can bring their own bottle and just refill it."

Officials hope the recent renovations will continue to draw and accommodate visitors to both Morgan and Barnes parks. Both sites are often bustling with guests who drop in for a game of basketball, or even to practice different forms of exercise, such as yoga, in organized groups.

"It's always busy, and it's busiest in the summer because kids are out of school and they're looking for ways to stay active," Moreno said. "This project is a great way to see that we've completed some renovations, and they're ready for the enjoyment of the residents."

The cost for both renovations is estimated to total about \$30,000, according to officials. Moreno noted that funds from the city's general maintenance and operations budget will cover the expenses.

## Human Trafficking Bill Passes Key Assembly Policy Test

*Huff Legislation Targets the Demand Side of Human Trafficking*

**SACRAMENTO** - Legislation authored by Senator Bob Huff (R-San Dimas) passed a key policy committee test in the Assembly Public Safety Committee today. SB 420 targets the demand side of human trafficking by amending Penal Code Section 647(b) to make a clear distinction between the buyers and sellers of human trafficking and prostitution.

There is no distinction under current law between an adult who is selling, from the adult who is purchasing, or an adult who is purchasing sex from a minor. The Huff measure will collect accurate and verifiable data with a focus on the buyers of sex, which can help shape future public policies, best practices, and provide accurate data necessary to direct existing law enforcement resources.

"By US State Department estimates, sex trafficking is a \$32 billion industry in this country and 50 percent of trafficking victims are minors," said Senator Huff. "Yet according to the 2007

Final Report of the California Alliance to Combat Trafficking and Slavery Task Force, California lacks comprehensive statistics on human trafficking. SB 420 will help collect the statistics that law enforcement needs."

Sponsored by the Alameda County District Attorney's Office, the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office and supported by the California District Attorneys Association, California Against Slavery and Survivors for Solutions, SB 420 would break down Penal Code 647(b) into three sections:

- Adults offering to engage in commercial sex acts with a buyer
- Solicitors of commercial sexual acts from adults
- Solicitors of commercial sexual acts from minors

A letter of support from the Alameda County Board of Supervisors states the following: "In order to create a solution to this human trafficking crisis, we first need to be able to evaluate the problem fully and accurately. SB 420 is a necessary first step

in addressing the demand side of human trafficking by ensuring the collection of accurate and verifiable data with a focus on the purchasers, and information future public policy decisions and best practices."

Recently passed legislation has strengthened the ability to prosecute traffickers but the challenge of putting a stop to human trafficking does not end there. As Senator Huff pointed out during the committee hearing, as long as there is demand, there will be an exploiter to fill it.

"The sad reality is that human trafficking is incredibly lucrative," said Senator Huff. "You can sell a drug only once, but a human being can be used over and over again. Prostitution related crimes ensnare at-risk girls and boys who are enticed on the internet or found trying to survive on the streets. SB 420 is essential for crafting solutions to a disturbing public safety enemy in our communities, especially among at-risk youth."

## Mother Walking Her 10-Year-Old Daughter Across A Street Is Killed By Hit And Run Driver

**COVINA** - On June 19, 2016 at approximately 6:39 PM, Covina Police Officers were dispatched to a vehicle vs. pedestrian hit and run investigation in the 1100 block of W. San Bernardino Road. Upon arriving, officers located two victims in the street that had been struck by a vehicle traveling westbound on San Bernardino Road as they were crossing the street. The adult suffered critical injuries and the juvenile suffered moderate injuries. Both victims were transported to a local trauma center where the adult victim later succumbed to her injuries.

Witnesses at the scene indicated that after the suspect vehicle struck the victims, the vehicle continued westbound on San Bernardino, failing to stop to render aid to the victims. The suspect vehicle is described as a brown Nissan Altima.

The driver of the suspect vehicle, Jose Higareta, a 50-year-old resident of Irwindale, later turned himself in at the Covina Police Department at the encouragement of his wife and child who were passengers in his vehicle when he struck the two victims.

Mr. Higareta was arrested on the felony charge of VC 20001 - (Hit and Run with Injuries) and is being housed at the Covina Police Department on \$50,000 bail pending his arraignment at Citrus Superior Court on June 21, 2016.

## Hernández Bill to Hold Local Governments More Accountable to Taxpayer's Advances

**SACRAMENTO** - Assembly Bill 1505 authored by Assemblyman Roger Hernández (D - West Covina) passed the Senate Public Safety Committee on a bipartisan 5-2 vote.

Assembly Bill 1505 expands the statute of limitations by three years for violating state and local public contracting laws beyond the current one-year statute.

In April of 2014, Assemblyman Hernández and local officials formally requested the Controller's Office conduct an audit of West Covina's finances in response to several complaints from residents. On June 9th 2015, State Controller Betty T. Yee announced the results of a detailed review of the audit which brought to light significant findings, such as awarding large con-

tracts without competitive bidding, settling a breach of contract lawsuit due to the city failing to comply with applicable laws and the city failing in its' responsibility to protect taxpayer dollars.

The audit revealed a deficiency in the statute of limitations in regards to violating the state and local public contracting laws. The current one-year limitation impedes any recourse for justice in the case of West Covina. While this is an outrage the laws must be changed to deter and help in the prosecution in cases where the laws governing competitive bidding are violated.

"Regretfully, West Covina is not alone in cities that have violated the public's trust. Over the years there have been many instances of cities, sanitation dis-

tricts and water districts that have misused taxpayer dollars and have lacked transparency in following state and local processes," said Assemblyman Hernández.

Controller Yee highlighted the need for a statutory change in this area of law as a state wide remedy.

"Unfortunately in the case of West Covina, the violations were not discovered during that one year period. By extending the period of time from one year to three in which charges must be filed, AB 1505 will give prosecutors more time to discover violations of the Public Contract Code and hold local government administrators accountable," stated California State Controller Betty Yee.

## Assembly Passes Mike Gatto's Legislation to Help Usher in a Cleaner Energy Future

**SACRAMENTO** - Assemblyman Mike Gatto's (D-Los Angeles) innovative legislation to deploy clean-energy storage technologies in California, AB 2868, passed the Assembly by a 51 to 27 vote.

To clean our air and eliminate reliance on petroleum, the state has increasingly relied on renewable energy sources, but they have their limitations. The problem with solar and wind energy - and why so many people are hesitant to deploy it - is their availability only at certain times of the day,

when weather permits. The way to overcome these cycles is to store the electrons generated when the sun is at its highest (and people are at work) for use during peak consumption when the sun goes down (and people come home and do things like turn on the TV).

"All of the solar energy in the world means nothing if it can't be stored when the sun isn't shining, and all of the wind energy in the world means nothing if it can't be stored when the wind isn't blowing," said Assemblyman Gatto.

AB 2868 can resolve this by stimulating the industry that can deploy new technologies that will capture excess energy generated by wind or solar, when these resources are readily available, and store it for later use, when demand for energy is highest and reliability is lowest. The benefits of energy-storage technologies are widespread from cost reduction, and environmental protection, to job creation and economic development.

AB 2868 now heads to the Senate for consideration.

# Most Muslims are a Peace Loving People

There were 3.3 million Muslims of all ages living in the United States in 2015, or about 1 percent of the total U.S. population, the Pew Research Center reports (Pew is a family name, not an acronym). The figure is an update to Pew's 2011 estimate of 2.75 million Muslims living in the United States. By 2050, Pew expects the share of Muslims in the U.S. to double to 2 percent.

"Recent political debates in the U.S. over Muslim immigration and related issues have prompted many to ask how many Muslims actually live in the United States," writes Basheer Mohamed, a senior researcher at Pew. "But coming up with an answer is not easy, in part because the U.S. Census Bureau does not ask questions about religion, meaning that there is no official government count of the U.S. Muslim population."

More than half of the increase in the Muslim population between 2010 and 2015 has been due to immigration. Muslim immigrants currently make up about

10 percent of all legal immigration to the United States. But Muslims also tend to have more children than other Americans, which also accounts for part of the community's growth.

Muslims are the fastest-growing religious group in the world. The growth and regional migration of Muslims, combined with the ongoing impact of the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria (ISIS) and other extremist groups that commit acts of violence in the name of Islam, have brought Muslims and the Islamic faith to the forefront of the political debate in many countries. Yet many facts

about Muslims are not well known in some of these places, and most Americans - who live in a country with a relatively small Muslim population - say they know little or nothing about Islam.

One thing we do know, 75% of the Muslims are a peace loving people. However, this is actually irrelevant. It is the other 25% that hate us and want to destroy us and our way of life and basically the western civilization all together. Many of those that have come here to the United States have next to none in the way of background investigations. The history of horrible events over the last 20 plus years in the United States alone is testimony in itself on some of the issues we have had with fail background investigations. We seem to have turned our back on these concerns and the government needs to take responsibility. Otherwise, there will be more history in the making.

# The Keys to Human Prosperity, Individual Liberty, and the Rule of Law

We live at time when the U.S. government operates in arbitrary and discretionary ways. Government regulatory agencies have unrestrained powers over land use, business manufacturing and enterprise, the workplace, and the environment under broad legislative mandates. And proposals are now frequently being made for ad hoc restrictions and prohibitions on the freedoms of speech, press, religion, and association. The principle and practice of individual liberty, therefore, is under serious attack.

The history of liberty and prosperity is inseparable from the practice of free enterprise and respect for the rule of law. Both are products of the spirit of classical liberalism. But a correct understanding of free enterprise, the rule of law, and liberalism (rightly understood) is greatly lacking in the world today.

What classical liberalism has argued is that even the wisest and best men are mere mortals. They lack God's omniscience, omnipresence, and omnipotence. Mortal men look at and understand the world within the confines of their own imperfect knowledge, from the perspective of their own corner of existence, and with extremely limited mental and physical powers compared with those possessed by the Almighty.

As a result, since no man may claim access to an understanding of man and his world equal to God's, no man can claim a right to deny any other person the freedom to follow his conscience in finding answers to profound and ultimate questions.

They are so crucial to man's very being as a spiritual and moral person that they must be removed from the arena of politics and political control. They must be left to the private and personal confines of each man and his conscience.

Classical liberalism has always emphasized the inseparable connection between individual liberty and the right to private property. That has been based partly on the idea of justice: that which a man produces honestly and peacefully through his own efforts, or which he acquires through voluntary acts of exchange with others, should be considered rightfully his. The case for private property has also been made on the basis of utilitarian efficiency: when men know that the rewards from their work belong to them, they have the motive and the incentive to apply their industry in productive and creative ways.

Private property gives a person an arena, or domain, in which he has the ability to shape and design his own life, free from the control of political force. A community of individuals, each of whom owns varieties of property that he is at liberty to apply and use in various ways, provides a network of relationships of production, trade, and association among men outside and independent of the orbit and control of government. Private property gives reality to the ideal of individual freedom.

Where the rule of law is practiced and respected, the creative energies of man are set free. Each man is at liberty to employ his own knowledge for his own purposes, but the very nature of the

free-market economy is that he must apply that knowledge and his abilities in ways that serve the ends of others in society as well.

People form connections, relationships, and associations with those around them as they discover opportunities for mutual improvement. Societal patterns take form; configurations of human interconnection take shape. But these patterns are not planned or designed; they emerge from the relationships that men choose to establish among themselves, with no conscious intention of generating much of the institutional order and structure that result from their market and social interactions.

None of us who cares about liberty can in good conscience avoid his responsibility in this matter. I will close with the words of the Austrian economist Ludwig von Mises, who was one of the greatest voices for liberty in the twentieth century: "Every one carries a part of society on his shoulders; no one is relieved of his share of responsibility by others. And no one can find a safe way for himself if society is sweeping towards destruction.... What is needed to stop the trend towards socialism and despotism is common sense and moral courage."

When I was in college, I had a particularly hard time with one of my math courses. The message was clear. I had to buckle down, study more, and do all my homework!

Perhaps it's also a message that needs to be heard in religious circles in our current society, since a recent Pew Research Center Report on Religion and Public Health concluded that, "Highly religious Americans are happier and more involved with family but are no more likely to exercise, recycle, or make socially conscious choices." What this study suggests is that there is little difference between those who regularly attend worship services and practice religion and those who do not, when it comes to making outward lifestyle choices. And so it makes sense to me that religious attendance and practice is declining in every age group, education level, region, and gender in the US.

What I've found true over the years - just like with my math class - is that I need to study and

And that's why it is possible, perhaps inevitable, that the seemingly downward trend in current religious practice can be reversed - because the deepest life satisfaction comes through learning the value of what Eddy calls "the power of being magnanimous."

Or, as Jesus put it: "Don't hold back - give freely, and you'll have plenty poured back into your lap - a good measure, pressed down, shaken together, brimming over. 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## No Credibility?

Federal Reserve policymakers "don't have a vision" for where the U.S. economy is going, former PIMCO managing director and Chief Economic Advisor for a major bank said Thursday (a day after central bankers decided not to increase interest rates).

As stated on CNBC, "The collateral damage and unintended consequences of this prolonged experiment with very low interest rates [and] very big balance sheets are starting to have a meaningful [negative] effect on the economy."

Wall Street feels that the Fed has no clear idea of how to stimulate future growth and has become "overly data-dependent". Wall Street believes that such an approach has been sending "conflicting signals over time".

Many economists, analysts and traders on Wall Street feel investors are left wondering whether the Fed is being inconsistent or the Fed is being overly sensitive to the markets.

The Fed raised rates in December for the first time in more than nine years. At the time, central bankers projected four more rate hikes in 2016. But the market turmoil, both domestic and internationally, scaled back those expectations.

As the stock market bottomed on Feb. 11 and marched higher, the minutes from the Fed's April meeting put a June or maybe a July hike on the table. But recent concerns about what this week's vote in the U.K. (on whether to exit or stay in the European Union trading block) have hurt stocks and pushed expectations of any future rate increases much further out.

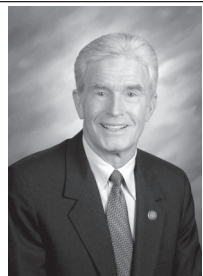
## New Driver License and Identification Card Applicants Required to Prove State Residency

California Residency Requirement Begins July 1, 2016

**SACRAMENTO** - The California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) wants to inform customers applying for a driver license (DL) or identification (ID) card for the first time, beginning July 1, they will be required to provide the DMV with two documents that prove they are California residents.

The California residency requirement under Assembly Bill 1465, applies to all first time California DL and ID card original applicants, including

What's up in the Economy?

The futures market now sees less than a 50 percent chance of even one hike by year-end. And, just this past Friday, St. Louis Fed President Jim Bullard, in a significant shift in his outlook for the economy, now says low growth and a very low fed funds rate of just 63 basis points will likely remain in place through 2018.

Fed Chair Janet Yellen, in her post-meeting news conference Wednesday, even mentioned Brexit, and questioned how a "leave" vote could hurt the U.S. economy, as a reason for not raising interest rates.

The WSJs Fed coverage Thursday morning was excellent. On the front page, the Wary Fed Rethinks Rate Hikes, including a long term-perspective in chart form showing how dot-plot rate forecasts have tumbled year after year since they were first published in 2012. Asked when rates might rise again, Yellen backed away from the strong hints of a summer hike dropped just weeks ago and instead emphasized the committee's uncertainty about not just this year but the rate path through 2018 and beyond.

Bloomberg News weighed in with the observation that Yellen

acknowledged that rates might be depressed by "Factors that are not going to be rapidly disappearing, but are part of the new normal". That's a sentiment that is so central to the market's understanding of the economy that it could easily pass right over your head. But it represents a significant change for the Fed, where denial of secular stagnation has been central to its forecast since 2009.

The Fed has been more than a few steps behind in understanding how the economy changed in the Great Recession, but is slowly catching up. March's acknowledgment of global interconnectedness was a big step, and Wednesday's bow to the possibility secular limits may extend beyond productivity and affect growth and interest rates was another. Still, the Fed has a long way to go before it catches up with the market. In fact, looking ahead, the market is even more skeptical rates will rise at the Fed's predicted pace than it was before the meeting. Traders are looking for one hike or less each year through 2018.

The term "new normal," which was originally mentioned about seven years ago, referred to the time to the probability of prolonged slow economic growth, high unemployment and government debt problems. It appears we will have to live with this for some time.

*We waited through the last 5 years, and we're anxious to sell our home and move closer to our grandchildren. Is now the right time to sell?*

Now is a great time to sell. It's currently a "seller's" market. Homes priced below \$400,000 are being snapped up, many with multiple offers. Homes priced above \$400,000 take a little longer to sell. Right now there are a lot more buyers than sellers. Buyers are anxious to take advantage of the still-low mortgage interest rates, but there's a shortage of homes for them to buy. With this supply-and-demand scenario, housing prices have been driven up. If you'd like me to recommend a Realtor, let me know.

*How can we know the costs involved in selling our house and buying another?*

What you need is a comparative market analysis (CMA) to know what your home is probably worth. In the report, focus on what homes, similar to yours have SOLD recently. Then, it's a matter of doing the math to figure out the costs: paying off your current mortgage, Realtors fees, Title, Escrow, and other costs involved in selling. You'll also need to figure out the cost of purchasing the home where you'd like to live. Nowadays, when submitting an offer on a property, you are almost always required to include a pre-approval letter, (not just a pre-qualification letter), and proof of funds. There are costs involved in obtaining a new mortgage. Property taxes need

*What is a Lease-Option?*

A Lease Option is also known as a Lease with Option to Purchase. It is a lease containing an option which gives the lessee (the tenant) the right to purchase the property. The price and terms of that purchase must be stated in the lease option for the option to be valid. That option may run for the entire lease period, or only a portion.

*Is there a way to have good retirement income and still keep my taxes low?*

Depending on your personal, individual circumstances, you might be able to put your money into a couple of different safe investments that are tax-advantaged. You should learn about different places to put your money based on it being taxed now, taxed later, or never taxed again. California Insurance Code, section 798.8 requires a written advance notice to any person, age 65 or older, when offering to sell a life insurance or annuity product. There's also a Medi-Cal disclosure requirement. That salesperson broke the law and could be reported. Obviously, if you called an insurance agent and requested an appointment to discuss finances, an advance notice would not be required.

## How Drivers Can Keep Their Car's Value High!

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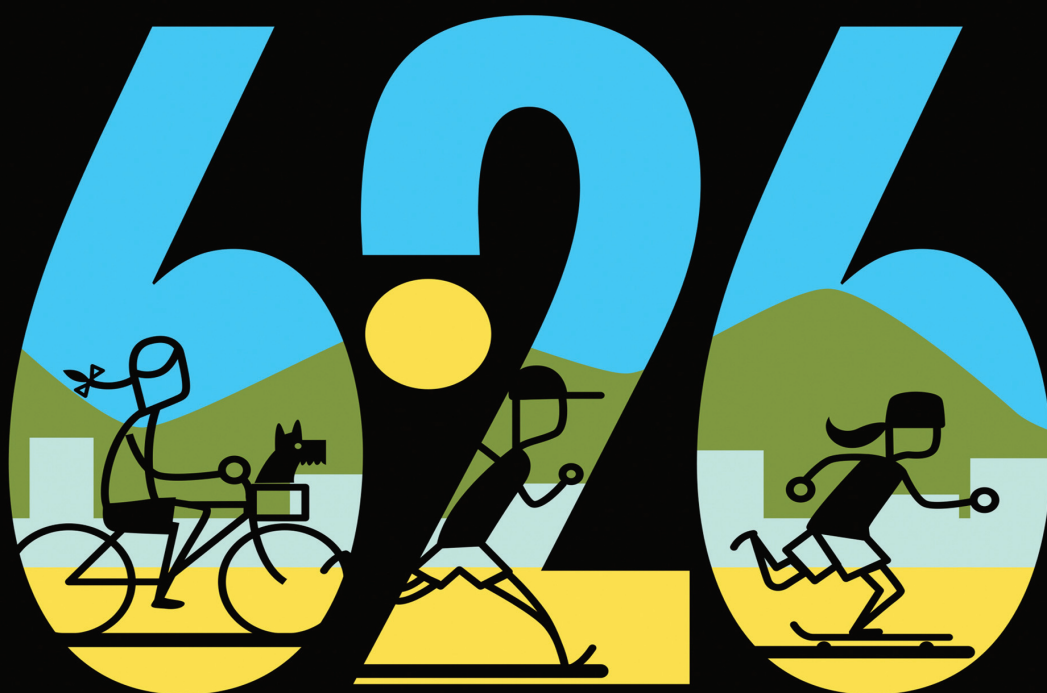
