# Glendora's New Police Chief Lisa Rosales

**GLENDORA** - The new Glendora Police Chief Lisa Rosales will begin her duties on February 6, 2017. Lisa Rosales will succeed Glendora Police Chief Tim Staab who retired after three years, from the position.

Lisa Rosales was chosen from 33 applicants, who went through two Boards to make their recommendations. The Boards agreed on three individuals, of which Lisa was the main choice. The three candidates were interviewed by Glendora City Manager Chris Jeffers, who chose Lisa Rosales. The Glendora City Council then ratified her as Police Chief, on January 11, 2017.

Lisa Rosales is a 19 year resident of the City of Glendora and has maintained a home in Glendora although she was stationed in other cities in California.

Lisa Rosales has extensive police experience having been with the Pasadena Police Department for 27 years, as Officer; Corporal; Sergeant; Lieutenant and Commander. She then applied and was appointed as Chief of Police in the City of San Pablo (near San Francisco) in 2014.

Lisa Rosales has a Bachelor of Arts from the University of San Diego and a Masters in Public Administration from the Uni-

versity of La Verne. She has received a number of California P.O.S.T. certificates including graduation from the prestigious Command College.

After earning her Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of San Diego in 1986, she was a substitute teacher. Her interest in police work was the result of two friends who in 1977 were kidnapped and murdered around her quiet hometown area. The victims were killed at the hands of the "Hillside Strangler" who terrorized the Los Angeles area in the late 1970's with the killing of 10 women. While in the teaching field, Rosales somehow knew she had to do more to help people and families in the community terrorized by violent crime. She was hired by the Pasadena Police Department who sponsored her to attend Rio Hondo Police Academy.

"Her desire to contribute and live in Glendora has come true, and we are very fortunate to have her wealth of experience and leadership become part of the Glendora Police Department," said City Manager Chris Jeffers.

Glendora Mayor Gene Murabito said that all the members of the Glendora City Council were "very happy with the choice."

## Literacy Garden Breathes Fresh Air into Science for Students in Azusa Unified's Program for the Visually Impaired

**AZUSA** - With shovels, dirty hands and the help of teacher Diana Dennis, Azusa Unified School District's visually impaired and blind students are learning the science of plants with a newly renovated Literacy Garden at Valleydale Elementary School.

Hauling soil, seeds and gloves from her car to the classroom is a routine the first-year Azusa Unified teacher adopted during the fall semester. As a teacher of visually impaired and blind students between first and fifth grade, her goal is to help them be active learners and thinkers through hands-on outdoor activities - specifically through the Literacy Garden.

"I feel that gardening offers a unique hands-on learning experience for my students," Dennis said. "The students need these kinds of learning-by-doing experiences in order to build knowledge and support their concept development."

When Dennis first arrived on campus last summer, the existing garden space was in need of attention after the dry, summer months. Dennis saw it as an opportunity to give the garden new life while creating a living classroom that kinesthetically teaches students about science and gardening simultaneously.

Utilizing lesson plans from the American Printing House for the Blind, Dennis enlists the assistance of sighted peers to work alongside her students in the Literacy Garden. During the fall semester, students focused on learning about the process of plant growth, the maintenance required to produce flourishing plants and the difference in growth based on soil composition.

"For the visually impaired and blind students, it can be difficult to understand what people with sight can see and how things appear from different angles and vice versa," Dennis said. "Listening to the directions and observations of sighted students, the visually impaired and blind students receive a deeper understanding of the lesson."

Dennis was recently recognized by the California Retired

Teachers Association (CalRTA) for her work with the Literacy Garden, receiving a grant for creating a dynamic classroom experience that engages students in creative ways.

"CalRTA reaches out to support current teachers because we've been there," CalRTA Director of Communications Debbie Pate-Newberry said. "We know it can be tough. We support teachers, their students and the entire education community."

Due to increased interest, a waiting list has been created to ensure that all students have the

opportunity to work in the garden. Dennis hopes to host an outdoor library where students will be able to check out books and study in a natural environment.

"Through the literacy garden, Ms. Dennis has created an innovative approach to student learning that is making a significant difference in the lives of our students," Superintendent Linda Kaminski said. "Finding and implementing creative ways for students to learn is what can make all the difference in the growth of a child, and Dennis is doing just that."



# County Votes To Expand “Mental Evaluation Teams” And Establish Mental Health “Triage Help Desk”

**LOS ANGELES COUNTY** – To help prevent use-of-force incidents and improve outcomes for individuals with mental health issues, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved a motion by Supervisors Kathryn Barger and Mark Ridley-Thomas which seeks to expand the number of Mental Evaluation Teams (MET teams) from 10 to 23.

“Proactive and compassionate engagement that includes a mental health expert will reduce confrontations and provide access to treatment for individuals in crisis instead of incarceration,” said Supervisor Barger. “Expanding this vital program will also help law enforcement in its effort to avoid use of deadly force, protect the public, save lives and money.”

“These MET teams provide a proven and effective approach in dealing with individuals suffering from mental illness,” said Supervisor and Board Chairman Mark Ridley-Thomas. “It makes per-

fect sense that we expand this program to ensure success throughout the County.”

MET teams consist of a mental health clinician paired with a Sheriff’s Deputy who respond to emergency calls involving psychiatric crisis or critical incidents and provide immediate assistance to those in need. Los Angeles County was the first in the nation to develop co-response teams as a pilot program in the early 1990s. Since MET service began in January, 1993, the Department of Mental Health has partnered with 35 law enforcement agencies, including the Los Angeles Police Department, to develop more than 80 co-response teams.

MET teams responded to 1,154 calls for service during FY2015-2016. Of these calls, 64% resulted in hospitalizations

for mental health treatment and less than 1% resulted in an arrest proving that these teams reduce adverse outcomes and prioritize treatment over incarceration.

Recent publicized reports describing confrontations between law enforcement personnel and individuals with untreated mental illness reveals the severity of the problem. Although most interactions between law enforcement and those with mental illness end peacefully, it is estimated that 10% of law enforcement calls involve individuals who are mentally ill -- and such interactions carry a high risk. In situations where minor crimes are driven by mental illness, rather than criminal tendencies, diversion into treatment – including psychiatric hospitalization – is a more effective response.

## Homeless Count To Take Place January 24, Volunteers Needed

**COVINA** – To meet federal requirements for funding of housing and services, the homeless are counted every two years in Los Angeles County. In coordination with the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA), local cities will conduct a street count of homeless persons on the night of Tuesday, January 24, 2017, from 7:30 p.m. up to midnight. Counting is usually complete by eleven o’clock.

The City of Covina needs approximately sixty adult volun-

## Man Killed By Azusa Officers After He Points Loaded Gun at Them

**AZUSA** – Azusa Police were involved in an officer involved shooting with an armed suspect late Sunday night, January 15, around 11:30 p.m. Officers were responding to “shots fired”.

Officers had responded to the call and were in the residential neighborhood of Windsong Court and Ranch Road in Azusa. Officers were talking with the suspect’s wife when the unidentified 49-year-old husband showed up pointing the gun at the police officers. The suspect failed to drop his weapon or follow commands and a shooting took place. The suspect was hit at least once. First aid was ad-

ministered as paramedics arrived at the scene.

Residents in the area originally heard the suspect shooting before police arrived. After they arrived, they heard yelling, most likely the officers telling the man to drop his weapon, and then they heard a number of shots being fired.

Paramedics treated the man but he died at the scene.

No other injuries were reported.

This is an ongoing investigation and there has been no motive stated for the shooting. The Los Angeles County Sheriff’s homicide detectives will be investigating the shooting.

# Why Republicans Should Let ObamaCare Self Destruct

Suppose you are a surgeon who is called to see a patient who is bleeding from something in his abdomen. You are to consider an exploratory operation to try to find the bleeding point and stop the hemorrhage.

The problem is that the patient has widely metastatic cancer. He has already mostly depleted the blood bank’s supply of his blood type. His clotting factors have gotten so diluted that it will be hard to control bleeding from surgery. He is already on the brink of multi-organ failure. His cancer is untreatable.

Should you tell the operating room to get ready? You might have a successful operation and keep the patient going a few months longer. Maybe the Obama Cancer Moonshot will have discovered a cure by then.

But almost certainly the patient will either die on the operating table, or a few days or weeks later, during which time some alleged error or complication will have occurred. And the surgeon, without doubt, will be blamed.

The surgeon will most likely decide that the patient is not an operative candidate. If unwilling to say so, he might just send the patient for more tests until the inevitable makes the question of surgery moot.

Now the Trump Administration and the Republican Congress is faced with a crisis in the Affordable Care Act. Most of the co-ops are gone. A large portion of the exchanges have only one plan to “choose” from. The money appropriated for shoring up insurance companies that experience losses is used up, and the Administration’s illegal attempt to take money from other sources such as the Judgment Fund has run into a court challenge.

The patient named ACA has been in trouble since the beginning, but Dr. Obama has intervened unilaterally to save it with exemptions for powerful players (such as some big companies and a “small business” comprised of congressional staffers) and other types of executive finesse.

But now the Republicans are about to take charge. They have been promising, and dithering, and delaying, and gesticulating about using the power of the purse to stop this Democrat-created disaster since 2010. But now the whole health system is in trouble as ACA tentacles are deeply entwined in it, and millions of patients are counting on

ACA health plans. Whatever Congress does will have complications, and if the bipartisan fix or replacement has Republican fingerprints, the Republicans will be blamed.

A number of Republican ideas have been floated, and the differences between them are not trivial. Repeal the new taxes, or keep them but redistribute the takings in a different way? Restore hundreds of billions in Medicare cuts, or keep them in order to stay “revenue neutral”? Get rid of the individual mandate, or admit that without increasingly heavy coercion, young and healthy people will not pay the enormous premiums needed to subsidize the chronically ill? The very popular protection for people with pre-existing conditions will inevitably destroy insurance.

At this point, the Republican Congress might be best advised to continue doing what it does best: keep talking. Send the patient for more tests.

But the nation’s economy, the medical system, and our patients must be freed from the grip of the [Un]affordable Care Act. That monster must die—of its inherent disease, which was created solely by Democrats. Congress, if it can’t do something right, needs to do nothing.

It’s up to the executive branch to embrace its constitutional duty:

- Stop illegal actions that have been resuscitating ACA and permitting its cancer to spread;
  - Stop enforcing unconstitutional law; and
  - Reverse the regulations that are blocking the development of better alternatives.
- Trump could take these actions immediately:
- Withdraw the Administration’s appeal of the lawsuit that prevents funding insurers without congressional appropriations (U.S. House of Representatives v. Burwell);
  - Order the IRS not to enforce the individual mandate;
  - Repeal regulations that require a comprehensive benefits package, and allow insurers to offer low-cost plans;
  - Greatly liberalize requirements for Health Savings Accounts.

Those who like their ObamaC-

are plan could keep it—they just couldn’t force younger, healthier subscribers, or current and yet-unborn taxpayers to pay for it. But once allowed to escape from bureaucratic restraints, most Americans will choose something better.

# Gov Brown's Budget: \$1.6 Billion Short

The California budget has been released with preliminary reports of once again the economy in California under-performing. The Legislative Analyst Office reports the Personal Income Tax revenue, the largest source contributing to the state budget, has slowed and will not meet expectations this upcoming year.

Compounding California's budget issues is the discussion on-going in D.C. about the repeal of Obamacare. Currently the state is looking at \$1.8 billion increased Medi-Cal cost over last year and facing a \$17 billion loss of funding if Obamacare is repealed. Five million Californians are subsidized under the federal health care plan and most within the Medi-Cal program.

Because of fuel efficiency improvements on the vehicles that drive on California roads, gas tax money to the state budget has decreased. In an effort to shore up that fund that maintains highways and roads, SB 1077, DeSaulnier, was approved in 2014 and implemented a study to evaluate a road tax to replace the gas tax. The "road tax" would charge a driver for each mile driven.

State Transportation Commission was charged with creating a simulation with 5,000 drivers agreeing to participate and paying into an account, with no real money charged and collected, to evaluate the cost and income to the state to replace the gas tax. Those agreeing to participate included average citizens within the state, those traveling across state boundaries, and commercial vehicles. The pilot program will end in March 17, 2017 with a final report on the outcome due after that. That report should indicate the full impact on the average driver, state budget and business communities also who are already taking a hit on the mandatory minimum wage increases.

United Van Lines issued their annual report disclosing their findings of those moving in and out of states across the country. Basic finding: People tend to leave high-tax states to areas where the "tithing" to government is lower.

The Tax Foundation, using the United Van Lines statistics, re-

decided to move to Texas after determining housing was more affordable, taxes were lower and they found a community with excellent schools. Paul will have no problem finding a job in Texas.

California has supported boosting the minimum wage levels up to \$15 an hour by 2022. Businesses are evaluating their business plans to be able to afford to stay in business by using lay-offs, importing products at a cheaper cost than manufacturing here and other creative mechanisms. The San Francisco model with support from Gavin Newsom raised their minimum wage prior to the statewide movement and saw many small mom & pops close their doors. You need a job to be able to pay the bills and spend money, not only to enjoy life a bit, but to fuel the economy of the community you live in. No job, you think about going elsewhere.

Incoming President Trump has "rescued" several large corporations that were proposing to relocate their operations out of country because of the environmental hoops they need to jump through and financial demands that put too much pressure on the bottom line of that business. Thanks to President Trump those employees still have jobs and can pay the bills.

Governor Brown needs to take a long, hard look at what is happening in California and why the Personal Income Tax is expected to grow by a mere 3% this next fiscal year. Perhaps his demands on environmental enhancements are too costly and deterring expansion of the business communities; minimum wage increases that are causing stagnation in business hiring practices; explore the reason for local education units supporting so many bond issues that maybe should have been replaced with the billions of dollars being dumped into his fantasy called the "train to nowhere," again billions over-budget; and, the Governor and his legislators should stop trying to solve all the economic woes with another tax or tax increase or a mandate on local governments to patch the holes in policies created by Sacramento liberals.

He welcomed those of other ethnic groups, including Roman soldiers and Samaritans. He consistently befriended the nobodies, the despised, the left out, the "ratted on and spat upon." His ministry was spent building bridges, particularly those that welcomed the nobodies. He gave himself to tearing down walls of bigotry and fear. He practiced radical hospitality. His first sermon at his home synagogue laid out this ethical agenda.

*The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. he has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free....*

He lived out a radical acceptance of the nobodies in his society. And the "poor heard him gladly." He railed against those whose lives were spent in the arrogant accumulation of riches, and the system in which the rich prospered at the expense of everyone else. Many of his parables focused on the need to care for the natural world God gave us.

Take that ethic and place against what Donald Trump described in his own words and in those he has called to execute his promises, and what you will have is the opposite of everything Jesus embraced! It begins by taking the greatest military force in history with a destructive power greater than the rest of the world combined, and spending billions of dollars to make it stronger. In confronting the despised others who might challenge us, there is no torture that is to be disallowed—even beyond water boarding. What is more, guns in everyone's hands are to be welcomed and celebrated. And that is just the beginning of Trump's ethical blasphemy.

# "TIME JOCKEY" - Waterlogged

**RECORD FLOODS ....** The recent heavy storms have brought much needed precipitation to the entire state but most especially to the southland. Green plants and yards have replaced the rusty brownish tint which spread in abundance as a result of our five-year drought. Since October 1, the Los Angeles region has received 8.75 inches of rainfall as compared to last years' 3.75 inches in the same time frame. The normal amount of rain is 5.47 inches so clearly we have received more rain than our usual share. Since history has been recorded in California, rainfall amounts and resulting floods have made its way into the states record books.

Father Juan Crespi who recorded the travels of the early Spanish expeditions wrote of the Los Angeles River overflowing its banks in 1770 and flooding the entire countryside running alongside the river. During the 19th century, at least sixteen major floods were reported throughout the state. The most devastating flood was in 1861-62 when it was reported that the San Joaquin Valley was so swollen with rain water that an area the size of Lake Michigan was filled with enough water that boats would sail over the telegraph

poles which had been installed throughout the Sacramento Valley communication routes. The floods took a large toll on human lives and livestock populations through the 20th century.

In 1916, the San Diego area suffered heavy flood damage caused by over 16 inches of rain falling in a 24-hour period. In 1955, the largest amount of rain was recorded from Santa Barbara north to the Oregon border with over 1 million acres of land inundated with water. The amount of damages exceeded \$200 million with 64 lives lost from the wild floods. More recently, 1969 also provided to be a heavy rainfall year with a 195% of normal rainfall total reported in the northern part of the state and a 550% increase in the southern coastal areas. Forty counties were declared emergency disas-

ter areas including Santa Barbara, Ventura, Los Angeles, Orange, San Bernardino and Riverside.

California has always had a wide range of rainfall throughout its nearly 1,400 mile length. The largest annual amount of rainfall recorded in the state was 153.54 inches in Monumental, Del Norte County in 1909, which was also the same year over 71 inches of rain fell in a single month at Helen's Mine, Lake County. This year's rainfall amount of nearly nine inches pales in comparison to record rainfall years but damages caused by flooding is still a very real possibility. Southern California desperately needs the rainfall but not at the expense of damage to property and lives. ....



AMENDING THE GLENORA MUNICIPAL CODE - 1967, TITLE 21 OFFICIAL ZONING MAP FOR CERTAIN PROPERTIES LOCATED AT 218, 220, 226, 296, 300, 308 AND 320 W. CARROLL AVENUE; 203, 205, 211, 219, 223, 231, AND 255 S. VERMONT AVENUE; AND THE PARKING LOT ADJACENT TO KINDRED TRANSITIONAL CARE AND REHABILITATION FACILITIES ON W. ADA AVE.

WHEREAS, on December 9, 2014, the City Council initiated revisions to the Route 66 Specific Plan, including changing the project area Land Use Designations from Route 66 Specific Plan to High Density Residential and Civic/Institutional to align the different areas with the surrounding residential neighborhood and abutting medical facilities because of the community concerns with new projects in the community and directed the Planning Commission to prepare recommendations; and
WHEREAS, beginning on April 21, 2015, the Planning Commission reviewed each section of the Route 66 Specific Plan over the course of eight monthly meetings;

SECTION 1. Multiple Family Residential (R-3) Zoning is hereby established over the properties located between the west side of S. Vermont Avenue and the railroad right of way on the east, from W. Carroll Avenue on the north and W. Ada Avenue on the south. The properties which are to be rezoned pursuant to this Zone Change are listed in and shown on Exhibit A - Zoning Map Changes (PLN16-0045), attached hereto and made part hereof.

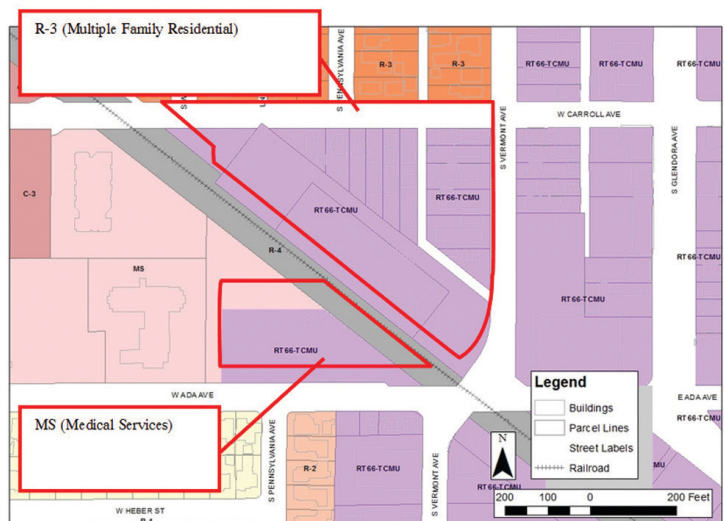

Take care of yourself. Stop all-or-nothing thinking. Remember, it's better to do something than to do nothing. When you make any life change, whether it's going back to school or starting a new job, you need to make sure you're practicing self-care at the same time.

Stay motivated. It's not how many times you get knocked down but how many times you get up. Failure is temporary, so don't beat yourself up. Instead, celebrate milestones of your progress along the way as you reach your goals.

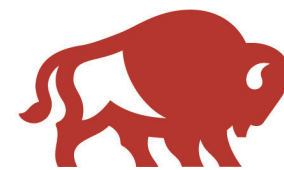
