# Students Partner with Chick-fil-A to Impact Learning Environment for Children with Special Needs

**AZUSA** - A group of Azusa High School students partnered with Chick-fil-A to transform their lunch period into a Luau celebration for special needs classmates, as part of their culminating community Impact Project.

Students involved in the Chick-fil-A Leader Academy, a national high school leadership program focused on impacting communities through action, spent nine months engaging in community projects to build their leadership skills and to make a difference in the lives of others. For their final project, they chose to support their fellow students in Azusa's Life Skills program, a class that helps develop students with special learning needs.

Students were treated to a festive lunchtime celebration that included Hawaiian leis, music, dancing and a free lunch provided by Chick-fil-A. In addition, the Life Skills program was presented with three new iPads to further enhance learning in the classroom.

"Today is the culmination of everything they have learned in making a difference in the lives of others," Azusa High School Principal Ramiro Rubalcaba said. "Our students decided to

As one of 300 schools se-

# Citrus College Honored for Providing Students with Transfer Pathways

**GLENDORA** - The Campaign for College Opportunity, a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization devoted to ensuring that the next generation of college-age students in California has the chance to go to college and succeed, has named Citrus College a "Champion for Higher Education" because of its successful creation and implementation of California's new associate degrees for transfer.

The college was one of 13 of the state's 113 community colleges that will be honored for leading the way in creating strong transfer pathways. The organization will also be honoring three California State Universities. California Secretary of State Alex Padilla and other legislative leaders will present the honorees with a special recognition of their achievements during a ceremony held in Sacramento earlier this month.

Dr. Geraldine M. Perri, superintendent/president; Mrs. Susan M. Keith, president of the Citrus Community College District Board of Trustees; Dr. Martha McDonald, vice president of student services; and Dr. Arvid Spor, vice president of academic affairs; represented Citrus College at the event.

"Citrus College has invested a significant amount of time and effort into creating associate degrees for transfer that will ensure a smooth transition to the California State University (CSU) system. We currently offer 18 transfer degrees, with several more in the planning stages," Dr. Perri said. "Being recognized as one of the state's

top performing community colleges by the Campaign for College Opportunity is a reflection of the institution's commitment to providing students with the academic preparation they need to achieve success."

The state's associate degrees for transfer were implemented four years ago and have been a collaborative effort of the California Community Colleges and CSU system. Otherwise known as "transfer degrees," they provide community college students with guaranteed admission to the CSU system and priority admission to a CSU campus.

According to the California Community College Chancellor's Office, the number of transfer degrees awarded in 2014-2015 was nearly double the number awarded the year before. At Citrus College, a record

693 students transferred to the CSU system during the 2014-2015 academic year. Of these 693 students, 500 transferred with an associate degree for transfer.

"Upon enrolling at Citrus College, the majority of students indicate that transferring to a four-year college or university is their ultimate goal. The entire college community is dedicated to providing these students with the resources needed to make this happen. One way in which we do this is with associate degrees for transfer," said Trustee Keith. "It is an honor to have our efforts recognized by the Campaign for College Opportunity. Being labeled a 'Champion for Higher Education' is a remarkable acknowledgement of institutional progress and inspires us to continue our efforts with even greater enthusiasm."

The VIP Guests were, Senator Bob Margett (Ret.), Glendora Mayor Gene

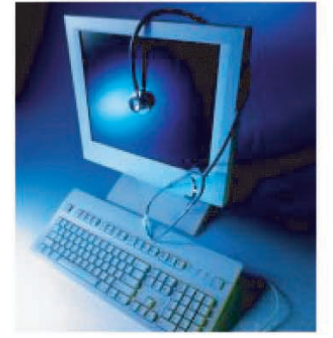

# Fiscal Year 2016-2017 Budget Approved by City Council

**BALDWIN PARK** - Following an overview of the City of Baldwin Park's financial activities, councilmembers unanimously approved a \$60 million budget for the 2016-2017 fiscal year.

The proposed budget was presented to City Council during a special meeting on Monday. The budget presentation outlined expected revenues and expenditures for the coming year. More specific details of the budget were itemized in a 67-page report prepared by Director of Finance Rose Tam and Chief Executive Officer Shannon Yauchzee.

In the report, City staff projected that the City's General Fund revenue would be \$26,974,890, a 2.2% increase from last year's budget, and \$27,034,233 in expenditures, with a small deficit of \$59,343 for the 2016-2017 fiscal year. This is very good news, as previous analysis projected a deficit of \$1.4 million to \$1.8 million for the incoming fiscal year.

City staff said they have worked diligently to make cutbacks within various departments in order to close the gap between the city's revenue and its proposed expenditures.

"There was a lot of time spent on this," said Yauchzee. "We started out at a high deficit, so we're really proud of the work everyone has done."

The recently approved 2016-2017 budget will provide staff with standard increases for the Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA), as well as benefits in accordance to recently approved contracts with various employee groups. It will also account for an increasing cost in retirement contribution and retiree health insurance with CalPERS, as stated in the proposed budget.

Yauchzee shared that he and his staff kept in mind the theme of "Reserve, Conserve, and Revenue" as they made considerations for the proposed budget. "The objective of the budget is to continue to build and conserve a

healthy General Fund reserve balance, continue to pursue ways to increase current revenues and to create new revenue sources," the staff report noted.

Monday's decision came on the heels of a May 26 study session of the proposed budget. Under the 2016-2017 budget, maintaining the current level of public safety personnel will remain a council priority.

"These are projected expenses and revenues, so that's going to fluctuate. There's a lot of factors that show that this deficit may be erased," added Councilman Ricardo Pacheco.

Pacheco noted that money accrued from potential incoming taxes should help eliminate the proposed deficit before June 30, 2017. Staff members intend to monitor the City's expenditures closely and will keep City Council attune to significant changes that may impact the budget. Staff said they also plan to pursue various revenue options for council's approval.

Marshalls will bring the community additional shopping opportunities, offering an assortment of merchandise including fashionable brand name family apparel, footwear, and home décor at reasonable prices.

Champion Real Estate Company, a well-known local developer recently acquired the former Ralphs property. Champion approached the City in 2015 with their redevelopment plans for the center and the plans were approved by the Planning Commission this past March. "We are pleased with the commitment demonstrated by Champion along with their ability to procure two national tenants." City Manager Chris Jeffers continued, "The investment confirms that Glendora continues to be a strong and favorable community to conduct business."



In addition to bringing in national tenants, Sprouts and Marshalls, Champion intends to attract retailers and quick-serve restaurants to the remaining inline shop space and the two new buildings along Route 66 and Grand Ave. Champion and the City are seeing strong interest for these spaces and expect the center to offer the community a diverse selection of eateries and retailers. "The center is well-po-

sitioned with excellent frontage to the dominant retail corridor in the area," commented Parker Champion, Senior Vice President. "We are confident that this value-add repositioning will transform the property into a highly-desired neighborhood center."

Champion has recently begun the initial phase of the project with an expected target completion date of June 2017.

# City Gives Green Light For Green Energy Projects

**BALDWIN PARK** - City Council members gave the green light to move forward with a series of projects to update several community facilities with energy efficient systems. The council also voted unanimously to award a \$3.4 million contract to ConEdison Solutions, a company that specializes in cost-effective energy services, to spearhead the efforts.

Now within the next few months, ConEdison will begin making improvements and installing photovoltaic (solar) panels along the rooftops of various city operations facilities.

Shannon Yauchzee, Chief Executive Officer, said that also delineated in the project is the installation of new transformers and energy efficient lighting at the city yard, as well as at Barnes and Morgan parks. ConEdison will additionally install an energy efficient air conditioning system at the Esther Snyder Community Center gymnasium.

"The gym has never had air conditioning, so this is definitely going to help out," said Manuel Carrillo, director of the city's Department of Recreation and Community Services.

Carrillo added that installing a cooling system at the gym should make the venue more available for the hundreds of visitors who visit daily, especially during the summer months.

Yauchzee said all improve-

ments under the project should be completed within the next six to nine months. Almost immediately, however, officials and residents will begin to see the perks of the upgrades. "There will be a reduction in the city energy costs, and we will be saving the city and tax payers money in the long run," he said.

Yauchzee noted that Baldwin Park will save an additional \$40,464 in operating costs, including maintenance labor, and equipment replacement costs thanks to the upgrades.

The idea for the energy-friendly improvements came from the city's Energy Efficiency and Green Projects committee, which was developed two years ago. This entity was created to help research projects and alternatives to help keep the city eco-friendly. Yauchzee said other firms were originally considered for the project's conceptual designs; however, ConEdison had the best presentation.

A majority of the \$3 million project will be paid through a loan from the California Energy Commission (CEC), according to the officials. The estimated \$450,000 in project costs will also be covered through an internal city loan, at no interest, from the Future Development Fund. City officials will also pursue potential rebates to further offset the cost of the project, they said.

# Public Hearing For Proposed Refuse Rate Adjustment Rescheduled To July 18th

**AZUSA** - Due to an anticipated lack of quorum, the public hearing scheduled for July 5th regarding the Refuse Rate Adjustment has been rescheduled to July 18, 2016, at 7:30 P.M. in the Civic Auditorium, 213 E. Foothill Blvd., Azusa.

At the time of the public hearing, the City Council will hear and consider all protests and objections concerning the proposed refuse rate adjustments. Upon conclusion of the hearing, the City Council will consider, and may adopt, the proposed refuse

rate adjustments. If written protests against the proposed rate adjustments and fee schedule are not presented by a majority of owners of the identified parcels upon which the rates and fee schedule are proposed to be imposed, the City Council will be authorized to impose the rates and fee schedule.

Comments or protests to the proposed refuse rate adjustments must be delivered in writing to the City Clerk, City of Azusa, 213 East Foothill Boulevard, Azusa,

CA 91702, prior to the public hearing on July 18, 2016. Written protests may also be submitted at the public hearing so long as they are received prior to the conclusion of the public hearing. # City Retains Firm To Conduct Citizen Satisfaction Survey

**AZUSA** - The City of Azusa has retained ThinkNow Research to conduct a statistically valid public opinion research survey. Randomly selected residents will have the opportunity to complete the citizen survey and voice their opinion about the level of satisfaction with City services and other quality of life issues.

ThinkNow will use a statistically significant sampling of

Azusa residents to ensure a 95% level of confidence in the accuracy of the survey results. The survey, which consists of 40-50 multiple choice and open-ended questions, will be conducted by telephone and through live intercept interviews at various locations throughout the City. The length of survey is estimated between 20-25 minutes. The sur-

vey will be conducted from June 27th to July 11th.

Once complete, the findings of the survey will help guide the City in its mission to better serve its citizens and the community.

# Tax Rate on Gasoline Reduced on July 1

**SACRAMENTO** - The California State Board of Equalization (BOE) announces that the state excise tax on gasoline will drop by 2.2 cents per gallon on July 1, 2016. This will lower the excise tax rate from 30 cents to 27.8 cents per gallon for the 2016-17 fiscal year, effective July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2017.

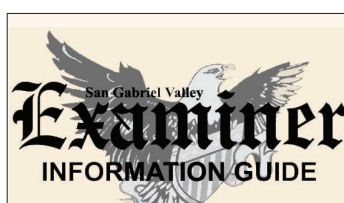
The Board approved the 2.2-cent tax rate reduction at its Feb-

ruary 2016 meeting.

Although Californians will pay less in state excise tax on gasoline starting July 1st, this does not generally translate to lower overall prices at the pump, which are determined by a number of global factors.

The latest issue also highlights the strong relationship between U.S. gas prices and California gas prices, and California's gas price is one of the biggest components

in setting the excise tax rate annually. U.S. gas prices have declined 37 percent from June 2014 to May 2016, and California's gasoline excise tax rate has decreased every year since fiscal year 2013-14. Gasoline purchases in California also have increased, with the latest data showing that gasoline consumption for the fourth quarter of 2015 was the highest since 2007.

# Sen. John Moorlach - One Of A Kind

 Sen. John Moorlach (R-37 SD) Orange County, has the distinction of being the only Certified Public Accountant and Certified Financial Planner in the California State Senate. He predicted the Orange County bankruptcy in 1994 and was then appointed by the Board of Supervisors to serve as the County Treasurer-Tax Collector and using his 5 step plan led Orange County out the largest municipal bankruptcy ever. Moorlach has lots to say about Gov. Jerry Brown's recent state budget.

*"California has a \$170 billion unrestricted net deficit, an increase of \$54 billion since last year, the LARGEST net deficit of all 50 states. This deficit severely threatens California's short and long term financial health. While Governor Brown has been watching the state's spending, he only has two years left in this position. The next governor is going to have an interesting predicament to deal with if the legislature doesn't pay attention now."*

Moorlach points out California has one of the highest income, sales and gas tax rates in the U.S. According to the Tax Foundation that puts California fourth in overall tax burden on a per capita basis. Tax Freedom Day for Californians is April 30th each year. That means you and I are working 4 months of every year to support programs the state majority leaders create, mandate and hand out with a variety of excuses.

Every university and think tank in California expresses concern about providing housing the younger generation can afford, especially young families. So we build massive complexes with units that become smaller and smaller with little or no yards and promote them with a promised smaller price tag.

We've just gone through a huge debate over the increase in the minimum wage with promises of eliminating the poor and poverty stricken but ignoring the reality of lost small businesses and jobs in areas that have already implemented a higher minimum wage.

Maybe it is time to take a look at the tax burden, not only income, sales and gas taxes, but the

on-going and ever increasing push for bonds - particularly the general obligation bonds that are bleeding out the state general fund and in many instances, ones our grandkids will be left to pay-off. I've heard the Senator speak on several occasions and he is very concerned about the unfunded liabilities of pensions and health care for retired state workers. The Legislative Analyst's Office estimates there is a \$340 billion liability facing this state that must be addressed. Incurred debt, deferred payments ... the biggest concern at this point is the CalPERS, CalSTRS and UC unfunded pension debt reaching \$180 billion. CalPERS is the state retirement system for government employees and according to the Legislative Analyst Report, Key Liabilities, the \$140 billion needed to make that system fully funded is being addressed, in part, by the CalPERS board and problem should be resolved in 30 years ... but also suggesting there are more corrections to be made if that deadline is to be met. And, 30 years sounds like a long time to me.

CalSTRS, the teachers' retirement system, could face depleted funds by 2040 if measures are not taken now to begin the process of fully funding this retirement system. The combination of the massive unfunded liability and fast growth rate into the system, will take a combined arrangement of additional contributions from the state, teachers and districts with estimates totaling over \$5 billion per year by the early 2020's.

Health care costs have gone up with the implementation of Obamacare and many see those increased costs registered on their paychecks coming right off the top of the check as charges the employer is no longer picking up.

In addition, funding for retired state employees' health benefits could total \$1.8 billion over 30 years based on 2013-14 estimates. Dan Walters article in the Sacramento Bee reported, " ... the state is spending more than \$2 billion a year on health care for retired state employees - up more than 80% in the last decade according to Gov. Jerry Brown ..." It might be time for government employees to come to

grips with these deficits and recognize the fact they will have to start picking up a larger share of the retirement and health care costs if they want to continue to enjoy those benefits.

We haven't even touched the infrastructure maintenance issues when we talk about these big dollars in the hole. Moorlach's Budget Notes say California has 31,827 miles of major roads and at least 34% are rated in poor condition. American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) shows in their 2012 Report Card for California's Infrastructure we are dealing with:

- 678 high hazard dams
- 2,769 structurally deficient bridges
- Poor road conditions are costing motorists \$703 year
- \$44.5 billion is need for drinking water over the next 20 years
- \$29.9 billion is needed for wastewater

An OpEd piece in the Orange County Register by Reason Foundation's Adrian Moore titled An Infrastructure Crisis commented:

*First, California needs to get far more bang for the bucks already being spent. Texas spends about one-fourth as much as California per mile of highway, but Texas' highways are the 11th best in America, while California's state highways rank 45th in the latest Annual Highway Report. For every mile of highway it has, Texas spends \$3,800 on administrative costs. California spends over \$47,000 on administrative costs for every mile of highway it has. It shouldn't be 12 times more expensive in California than it is Texas.*

There needs to be some serious discussion about these numbers that Senator John Moorlach is bringing forward and serious plausible solutions that our legislators are willing to start implementing ... and I think that should start to occur before the November elections.

And, by the way, I've said since the day I started dabbling a little in politics, what we really needed in government was fewer lawyers and more CPAs and housewives who understand what a budget is and how to balance the checkbook.

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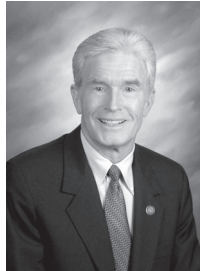
# Should We Stay Or Should We Go?

When the business day came to a close on Thursday, it was almost unanimous on Wall Street that the British vote would be to "stay" in the European Union. Even some of the official proponents to "leave" the EU conceded early in the vote count. But then (based upon results coming late in our evening) the unthinkable happened: Britain voted to leave the European Union. The vote surprised global markets because investors underestimated how people around the world were diverging from the political and business elites. The U.K.'s decision to cut itself from an economic and somewhat political union with Europe may well extend beyond the EU's newly re-defined borders.

Certainly, the global financial markets, after having mistakenly bet on the Brits remaining within the European Union, are flashing monumental warning signals that this breach may lead to the dissolution of the entire experiment we know as the EU. The British pound, as has been widely reported, has suffered its biggest single-session decline in history, while its value against the U.S. dollar has dropped to levels not seen since the fall of 1985.

The fear, of course, is that a dissolution of the EU as a single, unified economic entity, with its own currency, could collapse, leading to the reintroduction of single-nation currencies; the revival of national central banks; competitive currency devaluations across the Continent; and,

quite possibly, the re-awakening of ancient hostilities that dominated the European political landscape for decades, if not centuries.

While that may be taking this moment to an illogical extreme, the sentiment that drove the Britons, led by Nigel Farage, to exit the EU, is quite visible across Europe, whether it's the far-right movement led by Le Pen in France, the AfD in Germany, or even the current movement led by Donald Trump here in the U.S.

In the nearer term, the violent moves in global markets present a clear and present danger to an emerging recovery in the European economy while leading to deepening economic weakness in places already in recession.

As Fed Chair, Janet Yellen, rightly pointed out in her semi-annual economic report to Congress, a "Brexit" would present yet another in a series of global headwinds that will keep the U.S. economy from reaching its true growth potential.

While overseas central banks scramble to insulate their economies from this latest crisis, the

Fed may very well be forced to take back its lone rate hike of this cycle.

Yellen has said that helicopter money, Milton Friedman's concept of dropping money into the economy that would go out as tax rebates, is something the Fed might "legitimately consider" - but only in "a very abnormal, extreme situation." The question is: Will the U.K. vote roil markets so badly that it puts the Fed - and the economy - in an extreme situation?

For its part, the Fed released a statement Friday morning amid the post-Brexit vote fallout, that it "is carefully monitoring developments in global financial markets." They also indicated that it indeed is ready to provide market liquidity through dollar swap lines, which are currency agreements that ensure cash is flowing through the global markets. The Fed took similar measures during the financial crisis.

Traders on Wall Street now believe the already-dovish Federal Reserve won't be raising interest rates at all this year. As the market digested Thursday's U.K. vote to leave the European Union, market participants sharply ratcheted down expectations for the U.S. central bank.

There's now virtually no chance of a rate hike at the July Federal Open Market Committee meeting, according to the Chicago Mercantile Exchange's fed fund futures tracker, which indicates a 7.2 percent chance of a quarter-point rate CUT at the session.

Looking out to December, there's only a 16.3 percent chance of a rate hike, while traders assign an 11.9 percent probability to a cut.

**What do I do now? The stock market dropped like a rock with the news of "Brexit." Is it going to get worse? Should I sell my stocks I have?**

Let the dust settle. You can get a much better look at the big picture by taking the time to look at the stock market charts over a period of, at least, 2 years. You've heard the saying, "Buy low. Sell high." You own a number of shares. Right now, those shares have lost value. At this time, for the same amount of dollars, investors can buy more shares of stock. The stock market took a nosedive because many investors 'panic sold,' afraid of the unknown changes that the British exit ("Brexit") from the EU might cause. The Brexit has been voted on, but will take a couple of years to come to fruition. If more European countries

follow suit, there will be a period of ups and downs in the global stock markets.

This is why I encourage my clients to diversify their investments into different types of investment products. Having all of your investment dollars in stocks makes you vulnerable to all the ups and downs. By having some of your investment dollars in fixed, or fixed-indexed products, you avoid such volatility. My clients, with these types of investment products, are not privy to all the gains of the stock market, and they do not suffer from the losses. Their investment dollars and subsequent gains can be locked in every year on their policy anniversary (date of initial investment).

A bit of good news from the Brexit: Economists are making an educated presumption is that the Fed will delay raising rates this summer. This means that interest rates for mortgage loans could remain low.

**How do economists figure out if our economy is getting better**

or worse?

Economists look at statistics compiled by the Census Bureau, the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the Bureau of Economic Analysis, for example, and conclude whether the economy is in a slowdown or a recovery. The consumer-related indicators are: employment, retail sales, new-home sales, personal income and spending, and the consumer price index (oil and food excluded). Of course, there are un-ending arguments regarding what should be included or excluded in these reports. As we know, resulting reports can be altered by the detailed information sourced. In other words, facts can lie. For example, if they only count full-time employment, what about all the folks who lost their full-time employment and are now working one or two part-time jobs? If they only count those receiving unemployment benefits, what about those who have used up their benefits but are still unemployed?

**WHAT YOU "AUTO" KNOW**

## The Magic Box

Two times today I had calls from customers wanting an estimate and they were concerned because we charge a fee to test before we do any actual repairs. One wanted to know why their car's check engine light was on, especially as the car was running just fine. They said a neighbor came over and offered advice and a diagnosis of what he thought the problem might be.

I appreciate the helpfulness of friends, neighbors and tow truck drivers as they care enough to try to figure out what a car problem might be. Many times they have been right but just as many times they have been wrong. Whatever their diagnosis might be... it is still just a guess! Professionals (whether it is an auto repair shop, home air conditioning repair, the dentist or doctor), would never give a diagnosis or attempt "a repair" without first testing circuits, components or in humans taking temperatures, blood pressure, drawing blood, taking x-rays and more to see what the problem really is.

The customer then asked me to "just plug in that box" that tells you what's wrong with the car. I am to this day puzzled why so

many people believe there is a "magic box" that we plug into a car that tells us what is wrong with the car! If that "magic box" were available, I would buy several and I would not need a staff of expert technicians who have years of experience, training, and over \$20,000 worth of tools and equipment. That would greatly reduce my payroll and operations cost. I could just hire low paid mechanics to replace the parts the "magic box" said were bad. I wish our business was that easy.

Please believe there is no "magic box", but there is a scan tool that gathers information and data to point the technician in the right direction to test the circuits and components that may have failed.

What has happened over the years is many inexperienced shops or mechanics plug in the scan tool and retrieve a code. The code is what lets the technician know what item(s) need to be tested. Here is an example. A P0300 means a random misfire has occurred in the engine. With this code alone many shops will sell you spark plugs, clear the code and hope it is fixed without


any testing fee. Sometimes you get lucky and it fixes the code, other times the light returns in a few days to a week and they sell you more parts (We call these shops "parts replacers" and they keep replacing and charging their customers until they finally get it right).

Most professional shops will charge a fee to test items such as fuel pressure, the fuel injectors, coils, all the sensors, vacuum leaks, fuel trims, spark plugs and other items related to the code. Once testing is complete, an accurate repair can be performed, saving you time and money, because the concern is fixed the first time and there is no need to return for more parts.

As cars become more computerized, the systems are more difficult to test! Please beware of anyone that will just replace parts and not test to identify the concern.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COVINA, CALIFORNIA, DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO LEVY AND COLLECT ASSESSMENTS ON THE "COVINA LIGHTING DISTRICT NO. 1978-1979" FOR THE 2016/2017 FISCAL YEAR AND APPOINTING A TIME AND PLACE FOR HEARING PROTESTS IN RELATION THERETO**

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COVINA DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1.** That the public interest and convenience require, and it is the intention of the City Council of the City of Covina, California, to levy assessment on the Covina Lighting District No. 1978-1979 for furnishing the electrical energy and maintaining street lighting fixtures, appurtenances and appurtenant work thereof, to those certain areas of the city shown on the maps consisting of 81 sheets, which are on file in the office of the City Clerk and made a part hereof, for the fiscal year.

The boundaries of the assessment district and any zones therein and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the district shall be in accordance with the report of the Engineer, dated June 21, 2016, on file in the office of the City Clerk and which is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof (the "Engineer's Report"). Reference is made to the Engineer's Report for a full and detailed description of the improvements, services, the boundaries of said Covina Lighting District No. 1978-1979 and any zones therein, and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within said Covina Lighting District No. 1978-1979.

**SECTION 2.** That said assessment district is all of that portion of the City of Covina shown on maps consisting of 81 sheets on file in the office of the City Clerk, on which said maps the extent of said assessment district is indicated, excepting from said district any portion of any public street or alley which may be included therein. Reference is hereby made to said maps for a complete and detailed description of said Covina Lighting District No. 1978-1979. The said maps so on file shall govern for all details as to the extent of said assessment district.

**SECTION 3.** Any lots or parcels of land known as public property, as the same is defined in Section 22663, Part 2, Division 15, Streets and Highways Code, ("Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972"), hereinafter referred to, which are included in the said assessment district shall be omitted and exempt from the assessment to be made to cover the costs and expenses of said district.

**SECTION 4.** The assessments contemplated by this Resolution of Intention shall be done under the provisions of the "Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972," (Part 2 of Division 15, Section 22500 et seq., of the Streets and Highway Code of the State of California).

**SECTION 5.** The existing improvements are briefly described as follows: The maintenance and operation of streets and sidewalks within the District, including the maintenance and servicing of street lights, traffic signals, and appurtenant facilities located in and along public streets, roadways and rights-of-way in the City. "Maintenance" means the furnishing of services and materials for the ordinary and usual maintenance, operation, and servicing of the street lights, traffic signals, and appurtenant facilities, including repair, removal or replacement of all or part of any street lights, traffic signals, or appurtenant facilities and the cleaning, sandblasting, and painting of street lights, traffic signals, and appurtenant facilities to remove or cover graffiti. "Servicing" means the furnishing of electric current or energy, gas or other illuminating agent for the street lights, traffic signals, and appurtenant facilities.

**SECTION 6.** That the proposed assessment rates are the same as the 2015/2016 fiscal year rates.

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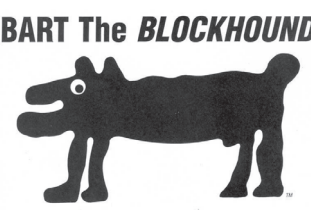
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# MTA Makes Adjustments To Gold Line Schedule To Meet The Demands Of Increased Ridership

LOS ANGELES COUNTY – MTA Director Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich joined and MTA Chief Operating Officer, Jim Gallagher and incoming MTA Chair John Fasana to announce implementation of Gold Line schedule adjustments to reduce overcrowding and to meet the demands of an increasing ridership base in the cities of Arcadia, Monrovia, Duarte, Irwindale and Azusa.



Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich joined MTA Chief Operating Officer, Jim Gallagher and incoming MTA Chair John Fasana to announce implementation of Gold Line schedule adjustments.

“The Gold Line extension from Sierra Madre to Azusa has proven to be extremely successful since opening in March—just in the first month the line performed 40% percent above its anticipated ridership,” said Antonovich. While riders are satisfied with the service, some comments from a recent Metro survey were concerns with crowded cars, infrequent trains and some confusing train schedules to Azusa. “To address these challenges, Metro will make important improvements to week-

day peak-hour service on the Gold Line,” he added.

Trains will now run every seven minutes during the peak commute hours - with every train making all stops to and from Azusa. The previous train schedule was every 12 minutes from Sierra Madre Villa to Azusa station. The new service change simplifies the schedule, reduces customer confusion, and evens

out train loads. It also eliminates the inconvenient transfer for customers traveling to new Foothill Extension stations.

Overall transition from six-minute headways to seven-minute headways also reduces the impact of crossing gates on traffic signals and street operations – making it more efficient, resulting in less train layover time.
