"Visions of Warriors" enters the minds of four veterans from the Vietnam War era to the Iraq War who are battling against mental illness - Mark Pinto, Homerina "Marina" Bond, Ari Sonnenberg, and Priscila "Peni" Bethel. They participate in the groundbreaking Veteran Photo Recovery Project at the VA Menlo Park and use innovative photography therapy to treat their moral injury, post-traumatic stress disorder, military sexual trauma, and other mental illnesses. The documentary also profiles the Veteran Photo Recovery Project team—founder and nurse practitioner Susan Quaglietti, art therapist Jeff

Stadler, clinical social worker Ryan Gardner, and clinical psychologist Kristen McDonald.

City Offices Closed Down, Police Chief Quarantined

WEST COVINA - The West Covina City Hall and Police Department are shut down once again. It appears that West Covina Police Chief Richard Bell and three other city staff members have tested positive for COVID-19. Although it does not appear that these people have shown any flu symptoms from the virus or have gotten sick. However, this caused city hall to close the police department's lobby and City Hall as of Thursday July 16.

It has been stated that 18 West Covina City employees were ordered to stay home and self-quar-

antine themselves over the past couple of weeks. They believe they have been exposed to people who tested positive for the virus.

The city manager, Dave Carmany, felt it was a good idea just to close everything down. More of a precaution than anything else. The city has about 300 employees including police and fire department employees along with the maintenance department. The employees at City Hall itself are working as a skeleton crew and many are working from home.

It appears that if you attempt to go to City Hall in West Covina it will be closed. If you have any business to do with West Covina, you might want to try to do it online and see what they have available.

As for the police chief, he was placed in a trailer from which he will quarantine himself. The city will also provide him with hotel accommodations if needed.

West Covina police Lt. Ken Plunkett is the acting police chief as of Thursday. Plunkett has been at the department since 2000.

DAV Provides a Century of Care for Disabled Veterans



From WWI through today, America's veterans get help, advice and support from DAV and you can be part of the solution.

From a World War I veteran who lost both legs to a Vietnam vet suffering the effects of Agent Orange to a young Marine with post-traumatic stress disorder finding her way after returning home from Afghanistan—many of America's veterans live with physical, mental and emotional injuries that impact their lives as a result of military service. They often need support with things such as navigating the complex Department of Veterans Affairs system to access veterans benefits, including health care and education benefits or identifying employment opportunities after military service. And because of their service-connected health conditions, they can be particularly vulnerable during health epidemics and economic downturns.

Fortunately, DAV (Disabled American Veterans) has been providing a century of care to help disabled veterans of all generations adjust to life back home. For the last 100 years, this nonprofit organization has offered a range of services from assisting veterans in accessing the benefits earned through their service to finding meaningful employment and supporting their families. DAV has continued to evolve and provide new care as veterans' needs have changed. However, one tradition remains a constant: DAV's services are provided to veterans and their families at no cost or obligation to them.

DAV's benefits advocates are located nationwide to assist veterans with accessing the health care, financial, disabil-

ity and educational benefits they've earned. For those needing guidance on the transition to civilian life, DAV advocates provide benefits counseling at nearly 100 military installations throughout the country. They also assist veterans with filing initial claims for their VA benefits, as well as providing everyday support.

DAV is also committed to ensuring our nation's warriors have the tools, resources and opportunities they need to competitively enter the job market and secure meaningful employment. DAV helps facilitate more than 144 career fairs annually, including virtual and live events to connect veterans with employers who are committed to hiring them. DAV offers advice to job seekers on how to succeed in their careers while educating companies on the value they bring to the workforce. To find a schedule of DAV's career fairs, go to jobs.dav.org.

DAV also helps address the underlying issues of homelessness. Studies show that PTSD is a leading contributor to the homelessness of nearly 40,000 American veterans, with another 1.4 million at risk. DAV's Homeless Veterans Initiative promotes partnership between the organization and federal, state, county and local governments to develop programs to assist homeless veterans in becoming self-sufficient.

When natural disasters strike, from hurricanes to wildfires, the DAV team is on the ground to help our heroes. DAV provides financial assistance to help eligible veterans and their families secure food, warm clothes and shelter and distrib-

utes supply kits with basic comfort items. In the past five years alone, the program has provided more than \$3.6 million to assist nearly 10,000 victims.

Another growing need, particularly for the aging veteran population, is transportation to medical appointments. Since 1987, DAV has organized no-cost rides with volunteer drivers to get veterans to their scheduled care at VA medical facilities. During this time, DAV has donated 3,678 vehicles at a cost of nearly \$85 million to the program and has provided more than 615,000 rides annually.

For those needing a little household assistance or other services, DAV also offers a searchable online database, VolunteerforVeterans.org, where veterans and their caregivers can find the help they need, from local volunteers for basic tasks like doing yardwork or running errands.

Since 1920, DAV has been a leader in strengthening federal programs, benefits, health care and transition services for the men and women who served, their families and survivors. Its advocacy efforts on Capitol Hill are guided by DAV members through the adoption of resolutions at its national convention, and last year, with the strength of more than 1 million members, nearly 40 of these critical priorities were included in legislation or other means, with five becoming law.

Two Arrested in 2-Year Old Kidnap and Murder Case

AZUSA—An Azusa man Alexis Ivan Romero Velez, 24 and a Pasadena man Anthony Valladares, 28 have been arrested in a 2-year-old kidnap and murder case. They were arrested on Tuesday, July 14 on kidnapping charges. They are being held on federal charges and if convicted they could spend the rest of their lives in prison. The kidnapping of Ruochen "Tony" Liao, who was a high-end car dealer in Costa Mesa, occurred on July 16, 2018. He was kidnapped from a parking lot mall in Santa Ana.

A ransom note was sent to Liao's parents in China asking for \$2 million. They were told to deposit the money into a special bank account. The ransom was never paid.

The victim was badly beaten at the time of the kidnapping as well as being tased. It was believed he was taken to a home in Corona and put into a closet. It is believed he died the next day. The suspects then took him to the desert and buried him. His remains were recovered and was identified last year.

Two West Covina men who are Chinese citizens are accused of plotting the kidnapping of the victim. After the kidnapping, they fled to China. They have been identified as Guangyao Yang, 26, and Peicheng Shen, 34, and were taken into custody in China. China actually filed charges related to the kidnapping. It is unknown if China will try the suspects themselves as it involved a Chinese citizen who was the victim. The federal government is hoping that they might be able to get their hands on them, but if there is a conviction in China with due process, they may not pursue the extradition.

As for the 2 recent suspects that were arrested, they are pending court appearances. Valladares told investigators that he was to be paid \$1,000 for his role in the

kidnapping. He went on to say he hired Romero as the driver for the kidnapping.

Valladares and Romero can be charged with kidnapping and as a result of the death of the victim,

they can also be charged with murder. Investigators have not divulged information on how they were able to identify all the suspects.

LOS ANGELES COUNTY - Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) Dean C. Logan announced the kick off to the 2020 Citizens Redistricting Commission (CRC) application period.

The Citizens Redistricting Commission is formed every 10 years following the federal

census to adjust the County's Supervisorial Districts, so each district is reasonably equal in population and geography.

The adjusting, or redrawing, of boundaries is designed to ensure local legislatures are representative of the County's population.

Any L.A. County resident

who is a registered voter and meets the eligibility criteria is encouraged to apply online or by returning a paper application.

Governor Newsom Announces \$600 Million in Homekey Funds Available for Local Governments to Purchase Housing for Homeless Californians

SACRAMENTO - Building on the success of Project Roomkey, Governor Gavin Newsom announced the availability of \$600 million in fund-

ing for Homekey, the next phase in the state's response protecting Californians experiencing homelessness who are at high risk for serious illness from COVID-19.

Administered by the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD), Homekey will be the largest expansion of housing for people experiencing homelessness in recent history, while addressing the continuing health and social service needs of this vulnerable population. The \$600 million in grant funding will be made available to counties, cities, and other government entities to purchase and rehabilitate housing including hotels, motels, vacant apartment buildings, and other types of innovative housing, and convert them into permanent, long-term housing for people experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness.

"Homekey is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to massively expand housing for the homeless in California with federal stimulus funds," said Governor Newsom. "This unique opportunity requires us to move quickly, in close collaboration with our city and county partners, to protect the most vulnerable people in our state."

Geographic and racial equity have been baked into Homekey, with dedicated funding for various regions and a goal of addressing the deeply inequitable impact of homelessness on Black and Latino communities across California.

Of the \$600 million in funding for Homekey, \$550 million will be provided to cities and counties by California's direct allocation of the federal Coronavirus Aid Relief Funds, with an additional \$50 million provided by California's General Fund to supplement the acquisition and provide initial operating funds.

Governor Newsom urged cities and counties to move

quickly. HCD is expected to begin accepting applications on July 22, 2020, and the first tier of projects will be fast tracked for awards during the first 30 days. Any awards cities and counties receive must be spent by December 30, 2020.

HCD and the Department of General Services will provide robust technical assistance to help cities and counties quickly and successfully apply for this critical funding

In addition to Homekey funding, additional funding for cities and counties will also be available from federal, state, local and philanthropic sources.

To further support speedy implementation of Homekey, Governor Newsom recently signed new legislation providing a California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) exemption and automatic zoning compliance for converted hotels, motels, and other housing types that utilize Homekey funding.

"Homekey builds upon the strong collaboration between the state and local governments that led to the success of Project Roomkey," said Lourdes Castro Ramirez, Secretary of the Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency, which oversees HCD and which includes the Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council. "We must use this momentum to build permanent housing solutions for individuals experiencing homelessness."

"HCD is thrilled to administer this historical program to help the most vulnerable amongst us, while also protecting the public health of all," said HCD Director Gustavo Velasquez. "HCD is putting forth dedicated resources to ensure cities and counties receive the assistance they need and these funds are distributed quickly so those most in need are served as soon as possible."

at lmorales@baldwinpark.com to schedule an appointment if you wish to review the candidate handbook via a virtual meeting. Additionally, a separate appointment must be scheduled to pick up nomination papers.

Deadline Fast Approaching for Disaster Assistance Loans for Small Business Owners Affected by Civil Unrest

LOS ANGELES COUNTY - Only one month remains for Los Angeles County business owners to apply for a disaster recovery loan from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) if their business suffered physical or property damage due to the civil unrest incidents that began on May 26, 2020.

Businesses of all sizes and private nonprofit organizations may borrow up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory and other business assets. SBA low interest loans can also help businesses with the cost of improvements to protect, prevent or minimize the same type of disaster damage from occurring in the future.

There are two important deadlines to apply for assistance from SBA. Business owners must file an application by August 17, 2020 for property damage applications and by March 17, 2021

for economic injury applications. There are several ways to apply:

- Complete an application online at disasterloanassistance.sba.gov
- Call SBA's Customer Service Center at (800) 659-2955 or email disastercustomerservice@sba.gov for more information on SBA disaster assistance.
- Individuals who are deaf or hard-of-hearing may call (800) 877-8339.

If you need assistance with your application, visit the Los Angeles County Disaster Help Center at lacountyhelpcenter.org. Interested applicants who do not have access to the internet, have limited computer proficiency or speak languages other than English may instead contact LA County's Disaster Help Center at (833) 238-4450. Multilingual business counselors are standing by to assist business owners in completing applications Monday

through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

The SBA is also offering assistance through their Virtual Disaster Loan Outreach Center at FOCWAassistance@sba.gov. SBA disaster loans are only available for damages and losses due to the civil unrest that began May 26, 2020, and not for COVID-19 related losses.

Economic injury disaster loans help meet working capital needs such as purchasing inventory, supplies and covering day-to-day expenses like rent and payroll. Economic injury assistance is available regardless of whether the business has suffered any property damage or not.

Interest rates can be as low as 3 percent for businesses, and 2.75 percent for private nonprofit organizations with terms up to 30 years. Loan amounts and terms are set by SBA and are based on each applicant's financial condition.

L.A. County to Adhere to State School Directive

LOS ANGELES COUNTY - Los Angeles County issued a new Health Officer Order to adhere to the California Department of Public Health's directive that schools in 32 counties on the State's monitoring list, including Los Angeles County, cannot resume in-person learning next month.

The state order allows superintendents to submit school district waiver requests to re-open elementary schools for approval by the local health officer only after review of local epidemiological data and intervention strategies, and in consultation with CDPH.

"While it is disheartening and unfortunate that Los Angeles County students can't plan for a normal first day back at school, we respect the Governor's decision to insist that counties reduce the rate of community transmission before schools re-open for in-person classroom learning," said Dr. Barbara Ferrer, the Director of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health.

"This week, Los Angeles County has unfortunately reached grim milestones every day. We have reported the most cases in a single day, the most hospitalizations and tragically high death numbers. If we work together to do what is needed to slow the spread of the virus, this will help protect our children, our teachers and the many people who make a school function and who educate our children. I know this is difficult news for the children and families of Los Angeles County, and we will need to work together as a county to support quality distance learning opportunities for families and all children until students can get back to in-person instruction at their schools. The Governor has made it clear that the path to re-opening schools is to get back to flattening the curve so that we can resume our recovery journey."

In order for schools to reopen their campuses, Los Angeles County will have to remain off the monitoring list for 14 consecutive days. Counties are on the monitoring list because they have not achieved more than 150 tests per day per 100,000 people, or have more than 100 cases per 100,000 residents, or have case positivity rates greater than 8%, or have a 10% or more increase in hospitalizations over the past 3 days compared to the prior three days, or less than 20% of ICU beds are open, or less than 25% of ventilators are available.

At this time, Los Angeles County is on the monitoring list because it has a positivity rate of 9 percent and case rate of 307 positive cases per 100,000 residents. However, testing and hospital capacity remain adequate with almost 20,000 people tested daily. Both ICU bed and ventilator capacity remain adequate with 29% of ICU beds open and 64% of ventilator capacity available. More details can be found on the Recovery Dashboard.

The L.A. County reopening protocols were modified to reflect the state's directives.

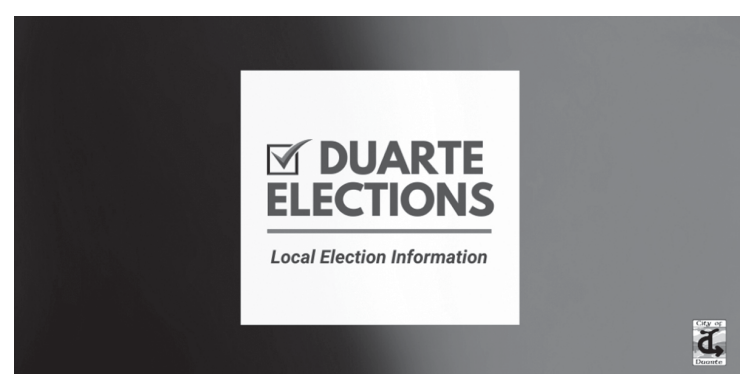
DUARTE - In 2020, elections for members of the Duarte City Council will be conducted in Districts 2, 3, and 7. One City Councilmember will be elected for each district, for a term of four years. Incumbents currently representing Districts 2, 3, and 7 are:

- District 2 – John Fasana
- District 3 – Liz Reilly
- District 7 – Toney Lewis

Residents living in Districts 1, 4, 5, and 6 will not be voting for a City Council representative at the November 3, 2020, election. They will each vote for their respective City Councilmember in 2022, when the current incumbents' terms expire.

The following general information is provided for those who may be interested in becoming a candidate in the upcoming election. Should you decide to become a candidate, a detailed Candidate's Election Handbook will be provided to you by the City Clerk's Office when you are issued your Nomination Paper and other documents. In order to qualify as a City Council candidate for the November 3, 2020, election, you must be:

- A citizen of the United States
- At least 18 years of age or older
- A registered voter and a resident within the district you



seek to represent at the time the Nomination Paper is issued

The nomination period closes on Friday, August 7, 2020, at 5:00 p.m. If an incumbent who is eligible to run in his or her district does not file by August 7, 2020, at 5:00 p.m., the deadline for filing for that district will be extended to Wednesday, August 12, 2020, at 5:00 p.m. for candidates other than incumbents.

Nomination Papers may only be obtained from the Office of the City Clerk by the candidate, as the Nomination Paper must be prepared/signed by the City Clerk or Deputy City Clerk. There is no fee to receive nomination papers and candidate information. A non-refundable \$25 fee applies upon the filing of the Nomination Paper. Should candidates wish to have a Candidate Statement printed in the voter pamphlet, a deposit is required at the time the Nomination Paper is filed. That amount is determined by

the County and included in the Candidate's Election Handbook.

Due to the restrictions pertaining to the pandemic, City Hall is not open to the public on a walk-in basis. Call or email the City Clerk's office to set up an appointment to pick up and/or file your election documents.

A Candidate's Election Handbook will be provided to each person who takes out Nomination Papers. The handbook includes all the documents required to be filed, as well as detailed explanations and reference materials about becoming a candidate for the election.

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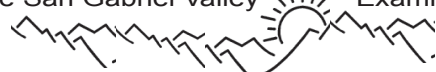

Trump Wades In On CV Water Mixed Motives

Summer is here and the heat that comes with it necessitates more water to sustain our gardens which means we will be reminded about taking conservation efforts either when we get our water bills or through water agency ads. When we talk water, we naturally turn our attention to Northern California, the area provider of that life-sustaining substance that seems to always bring out that age-old battle of farmer versus suburban water user versus the environmentalist.

Former Mayor of Glendora and all interlaced with a continuum of lawsuits over every proposal and many times complicated by more laws created by anxious legislators.

California's water system is a complex one woven together with state and federal money but always guarded by the doctrine of water rights that goes back to statehood and the gold rush days. The rules for water, established in Northern California, were, first, if your property touched water, you owned a piece of that flow; and, second rule was established when the gold miners flooded the state diverting water to pan for that make-rich-rock and established the first in, first rights doctrine.

And the water wars began. The miners, known as appropriators, began diverting water to serve their needs, and as long as they registered their diversions with the county recorder, it was legal. The riparian rights sector came back with a Supreme Court decision ruling in their favor - land touches that water, it's your water. And one lady farmer took that ruling to heart and claimed almost all of the San Joaquin River for use on her farmland in Madera and Fresno Counties.

Outraged over that water grab, the legislature created Assembly Constitutional Amendment 27 and it was approved by the voters in 1928. The ACA said both riparians and appropriators were entitled to water resources for their beneficial use, but could not waste or use that water unreasonably; and, conservation was required for the public welfare.

Fighting over water has gone on between the farmers versus the miners, Southern Californians versus Northern Californians, the environmentalists versus the farmers and recently California's Gov. Gavin Newsom versus President Donald Trump

as their reason.

In 2015, the Obama administration attempted to enhance the power of the U.S. EPA by expanding the definition of the Waters of the U.S. (WOTUS) and giving jurisdictional authority to regulators who could monitor and restrict water to canals, irrigation ditches, and even puddles as one disgruntled legislator noted. Trump has revised that and returned U.S.E.P.A.'s roll in the Clean Water Act to its original intent - protect navigable waters of the U.S. Western state farming and ranching communities are now free from those restrictive regulations of the Obama era.

Two projects on the horizon are the expansion of Shasta Dam and Gov. Newsom's revised version of former Gov. Jerry Brown's WaterFix project now called the Delta Conveyance Plan.

Shasta Dam and Reservoir are federally owned and the largest reservoir in the state. Construction on the dam began in August 1938, with the Shasta Power Plant added to supply power to manufacturing operations during the war. The entire project was completed in 1945 - 22 months ahead of schedule. Current proposal is to raise the dam up 18 1/2 feet increasing water capacity to 630,000 acre-feet of stored water to meet water needs in times of drought. Reclamation has to find a non-government partner to pick up 50% of the \$1.4 billion cost. President Trump has proposed \$1.1 billion to Bureau of Reclamation's budget and \$92.8 million of that for dam safety.

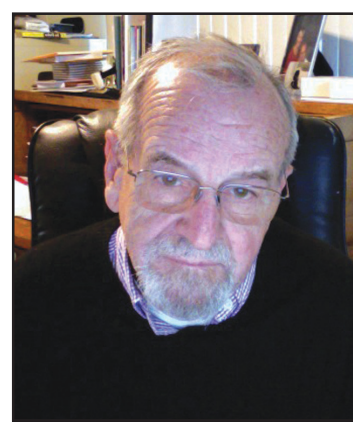
The Delta Conveyance Plan is proposed to become part of the State Water Project to move water through the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta to Southern California and the Bay Area residential and business communities. The project, initially proposed as WaterFix in 2006 went through a number of lawsuits and a state audit. Both President Trump and one of the largest irrigation districts refused to support it financially. Under Gov. Newsom it has been scaled down and has just completed the Environmental Impact Scoping process.

Any of us who believe we are operating with pure motives need to step back and have another look. I am not referring to Trump and his coalition. They will have to answer for themselves. I'm rather referring to anti-Trump political liberals who are committed to making him a discredited one-term President.

Consider what currently gives us attacks of anxiety, and what fills us with optimistic delight.

Let's begin with the economy. Obviously a robust economy in which unemployment is at an all-time low and everyone is sharing in the nation's prosperity is universally to be welcomed. When the pie gets larger and everyone has a bigger slice, we all rejoice. That reality may be signaled by a euphoric rise in the stock market, lower unemployment rates, small businesses open and their owners thriving. Consider the pandemic ravaging the nation. While our retirement community has been an almost unscathed sanctuary, a recent report that tests produced two positive cases, both from our faithful employees, had us unnerved. When this deadly monster is finally silenced and life can return to some sense of normalcy we will ALL sleep better. The reduction in new cases and deaths is universally good news, and the rise in new cases very bad news.

Wait a minute! Trump's desperate call for America to open up again was under the assumption that it would not increase the spread of the virus. "TIME JOCKEY" - Cobb Seal

Baseball in California...

Even in the year of Corona Virus 19, professional sports continue to be played throughout the world. Even though many games will not be played with fans watching in person, they will be played and televised for those watching from their homes. Major League Baseball is scheduled to start playing next week with precautions for players and sportswriters covering the game. Baseball has been a part of the sports scene in California long before the New York Giants and Brooklyn Dodgers moved to San Francisco and Los Angeles respectively in 1958.

Ty Cobb, one of the greatest players of all-time and one of the only players who could rival Babe Ruth in popularity and performance, frequently visited California during the off-season and even starred in a movie which was filmed in Hollywood and was based on his playing professional career. Eventually Cobb purchased a vacation home in the San Francisco Bay Area and spent his leisure time there. When his

playing career completed, Cobb moved on a more permanent basis to California but still stayed active in baseball, though it was the West Coast version of the game.

In 1931, Seals Stadium opened in San Francisco as the home of the minor league baseball team, the San Francisco Seals. In attendance, on opening day was the great Ty Cobb, as if to announce his presence at the ballpark would legitimize baseball being played in California. Cobb would attend a number of games at Seals Stadium in the years to follow, but in 1933 he was invited by the team owner to watch the try-out of another future Hall of Fame player named Joe DiMaggio. Cobb was impressed with the play of DiMaggio and the Seals signed him to a contract. DiMaggio played the next couple of years with the Seals and when the Yankees wanted to sign him to a contract, Cobb was asked to help negotiate the contract offer.

Even in his playing days, Cobb had a way to get as much as he could from the owner and

his experience was needed in the DiMaggio deal. Seals Manager Left O'Doul believed in Cobb's negotiation tactics so much that he was used during contract discussions over the next few years. As Cobb's involvement in minor league baseball continued in his post retirement, he made himself available to manage All-Star teams and traveling teams from Japan. When baseball decided to move to the West Coast, Cobb was there to see it happen. When the Dodgers and Giants played the first professional baseball game on the West Coast in Seals Stadium, Ty Cobb was one of the dignitaries in attendance. The professional game of baseball had come to California and Cobb was there to witness history, just like so many other historical baseball events he had witnessed in his long professional baseball career....

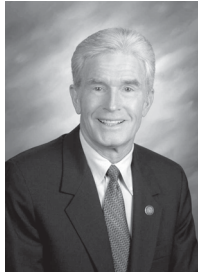
Expect Some Market Consolidation As COVID-19 Spreads

A question that many on Wall Street are asking is why a full recovery from the Covid-19 created recession could take five years, even if everything goes right. While that is not likely assuming Trump is reelected in November, it could take even longer if less business-friendly candidates take control of the USA. Other concerns (about recovery time) include months of lost income that will leave people in debt, and businesses with eroded balance sheets or even bankruptcy, resulting in permanent job losses. But, most recent economic news has been positive, indicating an ongoing recovery. Nevertheless, recent state reversals in movement toward normalcy carry a sense of foreboding about America's ongoing recovery timing.

Now that a smooth, instant recovery appears to be out of reach, and with some federal aid dollars running out, is a new round of layoffs coming? As a dozen or so Southern and Western states cope with what is, for most, an acceleration in their first significant wave of Covid-19 infections, a second wave of layoffs could be coming. Workers caught up in new lockdowns - restaurants, bars, and retailers - as well as employees of bigger companies with an international presence may be at risk. Also, how many people work for employers who retained employees believing that the reopening, once begun, would be a smooth transition toward full employment in a matter of months?

The economic "dashboard," as former Fed Chair Janet Yellen used to call the array of economic statistics, is looking more positive every week. However, the current Fed Chairman does not foresee a V-shaped economic recovery - which some recent economic data indicated. Instead,

Fed Chairman Jerome Powell's testimony before Congress last week appears to suggest more economic uncertainty.

The Fed recently released its latest Federal Open Market Committee minutes, which confirmed that they will be "highly accommodative," fearing a possible longer recession. They also held an extensive discussion about capping bond yields. Coincidentally, the 3, 5, and 7-year Treasury yields all hit record lows early last week, so the Fed is clearly continuing to minimize interest rates to stimulate economic growth. Naturally, these ultra-low interest rates also help stimulate the stock market, especially for high dividend stocks which continue to attract the capital that previously may have been invested in the bond market.

Combined, state and local governments are one of the biggest employers in the country. Many states are faced with "agonizing" budget decisions, as widespread (even temporary) job losses and closed businesses have reduced revenue from sales and income taxes. Many state fiscal years start on July 1, meaning they are probably cutting spending now. Budgets for schools, universities and other services are likely being slashed. Many government jobs have been eliminated since March, and there likely will be many more. Many states are constitutionally mandated to balance their budgets. Because many

states followed the Federal government's lead and extended tax filing deadlines from April to July, those states expect a surge in revenue this month, but they don't know how much.

New York City may not have been the epicenter of what New York Magazine called the worst and deadliest outbreak of COVID in the world. With all of the bad decisions made by the Mayor and Governor, resulting in a death rate from Covid-19 exceeding 8% in New York, only New Jersey and Connecticut death rates are comparable in this country. However, hot spots in Iran and Brazil were worse. Nevertheless, 28 states in the USA now have Covid-19 death rates below 2.8%, so over 8% is extreme.

The deaths and ongoing damage in New York City is already evident in Bloomberg commercial real estate data. There are US cities with a higher percentage of loans in trouble (than NY), but the \$20.5 bn in loans on Bloomberg's watchlist is two-and-a-half times the \$8.6 bn watch listed in Los Angeles, which is the second highest in dollar terms. Extended lockdowns and rioting severely damage all impacted economies. Not surprisingly, given the number of people not paying rent in New York, the CRE watchlist (for NY) is dominated by multifamily housing.

Good people in New York need our prayers! Our entire Country could use divine intervention as anti-American forces have joined with the Wuhan coronavirus to damage America.

Your Money - Ask Julia

What's a simple way to start a budget?

Start by looking at each statement. Add up all those purchases (including ATM withdrawals) for the last three months. Also add in the monthly amount required to be able to pay quarterly, semi-annual, or annual bills. (Make sure you are putting that amount into a savings account, so you have the funds to pay those irregular bills.) Now divide by 3. That amount is how much, on average, you are spending each month. Reality is, if you don't earn the amount of money you need each month, you are going into debt. If you earn more than that, the extra should be put into a savings account. If you are making just enough to get by, see where you can reduce your expenses or increase your income so that you can save for emergencies.

Can you help us figure out the real cost of being homeowners vs. continuing to rent?

It's a really good time to get out of renting and into owning your own property. Housing prices are slightly fluctuating, and mortgage loan interest rates are historically LOW. Get a basic answer to your question by using an online Rent vs. Own calculator. Then, contact an independent loan originator (FindAMortgageBroker.com) who will explain the process, and shop many different loan programs on your behalf to find the best loan program for you. (Your bank loan originator is limited to the loans offered by that bank. Internet lenders sometimes

quote great rates, but the fine print disqualifies most borrowers.)

Is there a way for us to set up some sort of an account for our granddaughter?

There are several investment accounts you could establish for your grandchild, but one that my clients fall in love with is a cash-value life insurance policy. Starting while your granddaughter is young, and paying less than \$100 per month into a \$100,000 life insurance policy, the cash-value could be enough to pay for college or enough to put a sizeable down-payment on a house. If he waited even longer to access the cash value, he might have more than a million dollars for his retirement.

In regard to financial planning, what are the important ages, and why?

At age 59 1/2, as long as certain conditions are met, you can start taking withdrawals from qualified retirement plans and IRAs without incurring a penalty. Since these have been growing tax-deferred, you'll now have

to pay ordinary income taxes. At age 62, you could start collecting reduced Social Security benefits. Depending on what year you were born, you could take full Social Security benefits when you reach "full retirement age" (usually ranging from 65 to 67). At age 65, you're eligible to enroll in Medicare. (Enroll 3 months before turning 65.) (For those eligible for SS, if you do not get Part D (prescription drugs), you will be charged a higher premium for the rest of your life. Part B is basically for doctor visits. Parts F or G have similarities, each reducing your out-of-pocket expenses for Parts A and B. Also, look at the different Medicare Supplement plans (HMO). Although there is a temporary change because of Covid-19, usually at age 70 1/2, you are required to take minimum distributions (as determined by the federal government life expectancy chart) from most tax-deferred retirement plans if you want to avoid a 50% penalty on the amount that should have been withdrawn.

Homelessness in Glendora

A report titled Survey about Homelessness (Summary Report), dated January 8, 2020, was prepared for the City of Glendora by True North Research of Encinitas, California, apparently to help the local leadership cope with the seemingly growing problem of the homeless population in the city's midst... A few of the findings in the long report will be shared in this article, and the link to the report will be provided so that anyone who has not yet seen it and wishes to do so, may peruse it at their convenience... The writer's purpose here is not to do a complete analysis of the findings nor to do a critique of the long paper, but merely to point out a few results, as he understands them, and to encourage the citizenry to review the report...

In 2018, according to respondents surveyed, about 8% thought that homelessness and poverty in the city were problems, but one year later in 2019 the problematic assessment had increased to 27%... During the period when True North was doing the study, approximately 60% of the respondents reported that several times a week they were experiencing encounters with homeless people in town...

About 55% of those surveyed considered the target group as being dangerous, and significant numbers of them thought that the reason for their homeless predicament was their drug and alcohol abuse, mental illness and the bad de-

isions they had made in their lives... Approximately 75% believed that those living in the streets presented a health problem for the community, and about 66% of all respondents believed the state and county should bear the responsibility for dealing with the problem -- of the remaining respondents, about 50% thought it was the city of Glendora's responsibility to solve the homeless problem and the other 50% held the federal government responsible for the resolution of the issue...

Of the ones who thought the residents of Glendora should resolve the homeless problem in the city, about 37% thought the churches should lead the effort while about 16% thought business should solve the plight.

During the period of the study (apparently 2018-2019), the homeless population in Los Angeles County was approximately 50,000, which comprised about 38% of the homeless population in California and about 10% of homelessness in the United States.

A section of the report was titled From Where do Glendora's Homeless Originate, but this writer either overlooked the answer or the answer was not in the findings of the survey... Also not found by this writer or not in the report was an actual census count of the number of homeless folks in the City of Glendora - homeless people are often seen around town at parking lots, for example, and also have been seen apparently living in makeshift

campsites in the wooded areas of the mountains and highlands within the city limits...

A significant point mentioned in this Survey was that court rulings that bear on this and surrounding communities, have declared that the homeless have a right to camp out in public property, if there are no public shelters for them to access, but what was either overlooked by this writer or not included in the report prepared for the City of Glendora is that municipalities are not totally powerless to deal with the homeless, even if they do not have accessible fixed shelters for them - some cities in southern California, reportedly, have been more pro-active and have found legal ways of dealing with the problem of the homeless, while others have let the problem fester...

Again, the purpose of this writing was not to go through every inch of this commissioned study so as to critique it in various ways - the intent was to bring it to people's attention because sometimes the general public is not aware of information being sought by their elected representatives in order to help them do a better job of managing the city... This writer found the Survey of Homelessness prepared for the City of Glendora quite informative.

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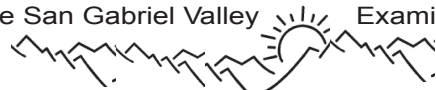
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The Republican Center In Covina Vandalized

COVINA - In the early morning hours of July 15, a person or persons unknown threw a brick through the front window of the Republican Center located on Rowland St. in Covina. The Center, was unoccupied at the time so there were no injuries.

Darrell Shimel, the President of the Board of Directors for the Center was awakened at 2am by a call from the security company informing him that the alarm had been activated and that the Covina Police had been dispatched to the Center.

Upon arriving at the Center Mr. Shimel was greeted by two officers. When they entered the facility a 4" by 8" paver style brick was found inside. Other than the window no other damage was evident. The window was not completely broken, subsequently no one made entry into the facility and nothing was taken. A formal complaint has been filed with the Covina Police Department.

Mr. Shimel provides the following "The Center does have surveillance cameras covering the entire interior, front and back exterior of the facility. Video footage from these cameras is being reviewed to determine if there is video evidence of the in-

dividual responsible."

"The brick was thrown through the window at a point where the Recall Newsom banner had been located (since the incident the banner has been moved to the other window). It is impossible to accurately determine if the brick was intended as a message against the recall effort or as an assault on the Republican Party. If the intent was the latter the irony of the situation is that the Republican Center is not affiliated with the Republican Party or any other political group. All the

expenses of maintaining the Center is provided by the volunteers who staff the facility and from donations from individuals not organizations."

Mr. Shimel concludes, "Even though the window has been broken our commitment to our community, our country, the Constitution, the rule of law and law enforcement has not been shaken. We remain open to provide voter registration and information to the public during this period of instability."

What L.A. County Residents and Employers Need to Know About COVID-19 Testing Now

New County Testing Sites Opening Soon to Meet Demand, But Health Officials Seek Support from the Public to Prioritize Tests For Those At Highest Risk

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LOS ANGELES COUNTY - As cases and hospitalizations rise, many residents believe they need to get tested for COVID-19. However, Los Angeles County health officials stress that not everyone needs to be tested and emphasize the basic ways individuals and businesses can and should protect themselves from this virus.

Here are 10 tips to keep in mind as we navigate this dynamic situation together:

1. At this point in this rapidly-evolving crisis, it is important to reserve testing for those who have a medical or public health reason for it. While Los Angeles County currently has enough testing supplies to meet the needs of those who need to be tested, the number of COVID-19 cases are on the rise here and throughout the country. Let's work together to reserve testing for those with a medical or public health need.
2. The common-sense rules still apply. Here are the most important things we as individuals and community members can do to slow the spread of COVID-19.
 - Stay home as much as possible.
 - Leave home only for essential activities like work, medical appointments and grocery shopping.
 - Wear a cloth face covering when you're out in public.
 - Stay at least six feet apart from people you don't live with.
 - Wash your hands thoroughly and often, and don't touch your face.
3. Check with a health care provider if you think you need to get tested. It's always best to work with your health care professional to determine the kind of care you need—just as you would with any other health care concern. Unless you have specific symptoms, exposures or risk factors, you may not need to be tested, and your health care provider can talk with you about your concerns and help determine if you need to be tested. If you don't have a doctor, call 211 to get a referral.
4. Know your risk level. According to the latest Public Health guidance, highest priority for testing should go to people with symptoms—including hospitalized patients, healthcare workers, first responders, employees and residents in group living settings, and people over 65 years old or with underlying health conditions that place them at higher risk of serious compli-

5. Employers should not require a negative COVID-19 test result before employees return to work, and employees do not need to present a certificate saying they have tested negative, under the current guidance from the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health.
6. Employers can offer and pay for COVID-19 testing as an occupational health and safety measure if an employer wishes to have its workforce get tested before returning to a work site. These employees should not seek a test at the City/County/State testing sites, which should be reserved for those who meet the medical or public health criteria for testing, and who do not have access to testing through their regular provider or health plan.
7. Healthcare providers are required by a recent L.A. County Health Officer Order to provide their patients with access to COVID testing if they are symptomatic, are part of a public health investigation, or have been in close contact with a confirmed COVID-19 infected person. The Health Officer order also encourages providers to bill private insurance plans for these services whenever possible. Patients are not allowed to be charged by their plan or provider for COVID-19 tests. Obtaining testing through a patient's regular provider network helps to assure tailored clinical advice and facilitates good follow-up in the case of positive results.
8. A COVID-19 test does not protect you from the virus, and a negative result should not be seen

9. Don't panic. Although rising case numbers and hospitalizations are cause for concern, we can still turn this around by following the common-sense steps listed above. Los Angeles County came together to flatten the curve earlier in this pandemic, even when testing was much more limited than it is today, and we can do it again. We are still in a phased reopening, with many more options for safe recreation available, and it's up to all of us to behave in ways that enable us to move forward, instead of taking a step back.
 10. More testing capacity is on the way. Appointments may be limited at testing sites due to increased demand. The County and the City of Los Angeles are adding capacity at existing sites, as well as standing up new County- and City-funded sites in high-need communities in the weeks to come. Learn more here.
- Remember: Regardless of test results, you still need to follow quarantine and isolation orders from Public Health or your provider. If you have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, you need to self-quarantine for 14 days, even if you test negative during that time. If you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, you should self-isolate in order to prevent spread of the virus to others and follow these steps:
- Keep your physician informed of your symptoms and consult with your provider about getting tested.
 - If you are elderly or have an underlying health condition, seek medical care.
 - If you don't have a physician, call 211 to get connected to one.
 - If you are having trouble breathing or have other severe symptoms, dial 911 or go to the nearest hospital emergency department immediately.

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
