Millions Participating In Great Shakeout Earthquake Drills, Adapting For COVID-19 Pandemic

International ShakeOut Day is October 15, when most hold their drills and other activities

Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drills, a worldwide earthquake safety movement, are involving 17.1 million people throughout 2020 (and counting). Most participate in ShakeOut by registering to practice "Drop, Cover, and Hold On," and many do much more. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, participants are adapting their ShakeOut activities through video-conferencing, choosing staggered or alternative dates, and following local health and safety guidelines.

In a year of uncertainties and challenges, ShakeOut provides the opportunity to increase individual and community resilience. There is still time to join ShakeOut this year: register to participate on any day that works for you at ShakeOut.org. Most take action on International ShakeOut Day each third Thursday of October, this year being October 15. At least 11.1 million people around the world are expected to take action on this day, including 10 million people from the United States and its territories. See ShakeOut.org for current totals.

Also, Earthquake Warning



California is coordinating a statewide test to coincide, for the first time, with ShakeOut on October 15. People who have downloaded the MyShake app to their phone will receive a TEST warning at 10:15am with guidance to Drop, Cover, and Hold On! Learn more at earthquake.ca.gov.

ShakeOut organizers recommend people follow the Seven Steps to Earthquake Safety, which starts with Step 1: Secure Your Space. Most earthquake injuries are entirely preventable and are caused by the furniture and other objects that move or break when shaking occurs, resulting in trips, bruises, cuts, and more. Start

now: move heavy objects down to lower shelves, relocate tall furniture away from entrances and exits, and secure cabinets with latches.

"We have come a long way since ShakeOut began in 2008," said Mark Benthien, Global ShakeOut Coordinator and Outreach Director for the

Southern California Earthquake Center at the University of Southern California. "More people have not only been practicing earthquake safety, but also securing furniture and objects around them, discussing safety plans, and even retrofitting their homes. For 2020, they are also adapting their drill

plans because of COVID-19." Recommended earthquake safety actions for a variety of special situations (in a theater, in a car, etc.) and for people with disabilities are described at EarthquakeCountry.org/step5 as text, graphics and videos.

ESGV Republican Women Support West Covina Police Department

WEST COVINA- Thank You For Your Commitment & Service Baskets were put together by the East San Gabriel Valley Republican Women Federated, with the support from the Covina Republican Center and the 48th Assembly District Republican Central Committee and were presented to the West Covina Police Department Officers and Staff to let them know our groups appreciate them and support fully their efforts each and every day they come to work.

A couple of years ago, West Covina residents became concerned and very vocal about the homeless population in their city and have not been shy about publishing pictures and having ongoing dialogue about the situation. West Covina Take Our Neighborhoods Back Facebook became a "... grassroots effort ... for a clean safe city to live and raise [their] families in." And, part of that aggressive plan included establishing a relationship with West Covina Police Department who stepped up to work cooperatively with those residents by attending neighborhood meetings and establishing an easy workable communication system in each patrol area.

West Covina Police Department has also made an investment in a K-9 program with four dogs and their handlers. December 2013, Reiko, the first police dog purchased and trained exclusively through community-donated funding, became partners with Bryan Rodriguez. Reiko, a Belgian Malinois, according to his bio on the K-9 web page, "... had originally been selected and trained to work with an elite military special operations group. But Reiko was not fond of jumping out of perfectly good aircraft ..." I've heard about Reiko, and jumping out of airplanes is the only thing that makes him nervous.

Reiko and Rodriguez had an excellent record of felony apprehensions the first year together, but in 2014 Reiko was shot while apprehending a murder suspect. Fortunately, he was treated, made a full recovery and was awarded the Medal of Valor for Courage under fire in 2015.

As part of West Covina Police Department's Community Outreach to increase the support for

police officers, the department and the K-9 program, a second unit, Officer Matt Bowman and K-9 'Rec' are part of the K-9's for Kids Program that visits kids in the hospital during the Christmas season. Bowman says, "K9 'Rec' interacts wonderfully with the children and always brings huge smiles each to of their faces."

Officer Rich Foreman and his partner, K-9 Ronan, work patrol together and Ronan is specifically trained in narcotics detection and has been with the department since 2015.

In their effort to continue to expand its K-9 units, the Department relies heavily on Friends of the West Covina Police K-9's to raise money and accept dona-

tions to purchase new Police Service Dogs, equipment and training for those dogs and their handlers, safety equipment and funeral and burial costs for both active and retired Police Service Dogs. This program has had the continued support of the McIntyre family, including Andy McIntyre, former Council Member of West Covina City Council.

CHP Terminates Pursuit, Suspect Crashes Car Injuring Female Passenger

COVINA - On Saturday, Oct. 10th around 9 p.m., the CHP attempted to pull over a black Tesla Model 3 sport sedan. They were west bound on the I-10 freeway driving recklessly and at excessive speed. The vehicle exited the freeway at Azusa Avenue and headed north a short distance and entered a parking lot at Workman Avenue and Azusa. The CHP also entered the parking lot as the driver exited the parking lot at a high rate of speed heading east on Workman Ave. At that time the CHP terminated the pursuit in hopes that it would slow the driver down. The CHP unit headed east on Workman Avenue and the unit crossed Hollenbeck Avenue, the officer notice debris in the roadway. The CHP officer spotted a vehicle that had crashed

into a number of parked cars in a driveway of a home at the corner of Midsize Avenue. It was the Tesla that crashed into the garage of the home and hitting a car inside the garage. It appears that the Tesla hit the dip at Hollenbeck at such a high rate of speed, it damaged the car and caused it to go out of control. The garage suffered extensive damage which also caused damage to the home. The CHP officer observed a male suspect escape from the garage running through the neighborhood. The officer called for backup and a containment area was set up. Meanwhile, the officer knowing that there were two people in the car, returned to the scene to see if that person may be in the vehicle. Much to the officer's surprise there was a female passenger trapped in the car.

She was badly injured and the officer attempted to render whatever first aid that could be done until the fire department could show up and extricate the woman from the car. The woman was transferred to the hospital in serious condition but became critical when she arrived. She is expected to survive. The suspect was able to evade capture and is still outstanding. There was so much damage to the garage that they could not remove the car because they felt the garage would collapse on them. The garage and the home were "red tagged" and the residents were not allowed to stay in the home. Anyone with information on the suspect is urged to call the CHP or the Covina Police Department.

West Covina Facilities Will Get \$3 Million Worth of Improvements

For years, West Covina's fiscal woes have forced officials to defer necessary maintenance at numerous city facilities. City leaders approved an energy system upgrade project that will allow for necessary upgrades and improvements to city facilities. The project will yield over \$4.8 million in energy cost savings over the span of 20 years by replacing failing equipment with efficient equipment and utilizing renewable solar energy. The project will inject \$3.2 million worth of needed equipment improvements into 9 city facilities (Cameron Park & Community Center, City Yard, Civic Center, Fire Stations 2, 3 and 4, Palm View Center, Senior Center and Shadow Oak Recreational Center & Park). The energy systems upgrade project includes lighting, HVAC system upgrades, new controls for energy management as well as solar panel improvements and upgrades. These improvements will reduce maintenance needs over the next several years.

All 9 facilities will be getting lighting improvements, which include interior and exterior LED upgrades as well as sensors. The city will replace 31 HVAC units all over 24 years old, 600 exterior and 7,500 interior lighting fixtures, and 9 transformers. City hall and the Shadow Oak Recreation Center & Park will get new cool roofs. Lastly, a new modular restroom will be installed in the lower field area of Shadow Oak Park. Cameron Park, city hall, and the city yard will get

new solar photovoltaic systems which will be owned, operated, and maintained by a 3rd party under terms of a separate power purchase agreement where the City agrees to purchase the power generated. The city will be working with Alliance Building Solutions, a solar company and a lender to complete the project. A low interest rate loan will provide financing for the project, "We will fund these measures with the energy savings of the project", said David Carmany, City Manager. Mayor Tony Wu said he sees the project as win-win. "I think this is a good vehicle to address the problems caused by the deferred maintenance of a lot of the City's systems, particularly the HVAC systems", he said. "I think this is our only way to do this." The City Council approved the agreements to proceed with the project on October 6th. 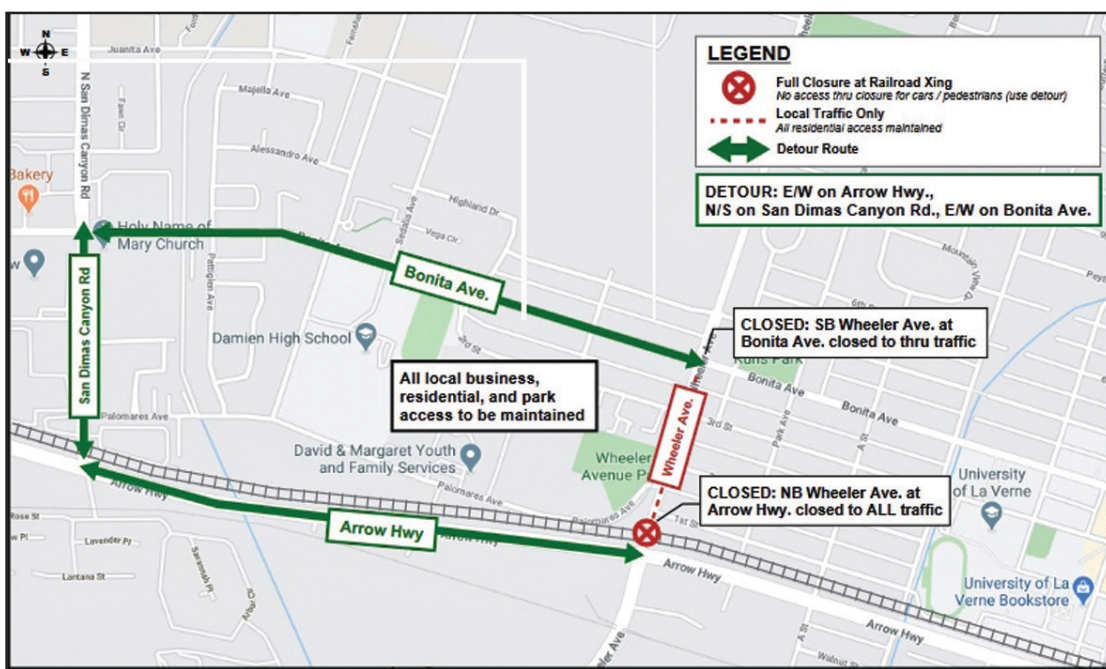
Daughters of the American Revolution Yard Sign Fundraiser

Full Street Closure Of Wheeler Ave. At Railroad Crossing



LA VERNE - Crews will be fully rebuilding the railroad crossing on Wheeler Ave. in the city of La Verne, as part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line light rail project. This work requires a full closure of Wheeler Ave. at the railroad crossing for approximately 21/2 months. Starting Tuesday, October 13th and continuing daily thru Friday, January 1st, Wheeler Ave. will be fully closed to all traffic (vehicular and pedestrian) at the railroad crossing 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Arrow Highway (just south of the crossing) and Bonita Ave. (north of the crossing) will remain open and accessible by way of detour routes, see map below. Crews plan to work daily during double shift hours of 6:00 AM - 11:00 PM. Overnight work and Sunday shifts may also be required.

Traffic Advisories
• Wheeler Ave. will be fully closed to vehicular and pedestrian traffic at the railroad crossing.
• Access to homes and busi-

nesses on Wheeler Ave. within the closure area north and south of the railroad crossing will be maintained at all times, as well as access to Wheeler Park, Palomares Ave., 1st St., 2nd St., and 3rd St.
Plan Your Route And Be Prepared
• A detour route (see map below) will be in place during the closure and signage will be posted to direct motorists and pedestrians. Please follow detour signs. Wheeler Ave. will be fully closed to all traffic at the railroad crossing between Arrow Highway and Bonita Ave. San Dimas Canyon (northbound and southbound) will serve as the main detour route, see details below. Arrow Highway (east-

bound and westbound) will remain open to all traffic. Bonita Ave. (eastbound and westbound) will remain open to all traffic.

City of Duarte to “Pass the Torch of Peace” During 8th Annual Unity March

DUARTE - The City of Duarte will host its 8th Annual Unity March on Saturday, **October 24** from 8:30 to 10:15 a.m. The march, organized by the Duarte Mayor’s Youth Council, brings residents together to promote equity inclusion, unity and peace. The theme for the 2020 march is “Passing the Torch of Peace,” honoring the leading role that youth will continue to play in solving the challenges that face society today.

“This year’s march is an opportunity to reflect on what we can achieve as a community when we come together in peace,” said Mayor’s Youth Councilmember Faith Peoples. “It’s also an opportunity for the Duarte community to hear from members of my generation about our ideas for building a better future. We all have something to learn from one another, and strengthening channels of communication across different groups is one of our biggest goals for this event.”

Two local social justice activists will define the purpose and intention of the march as key-

note speakers. Brandon Lamar is a renowned youth advocate, non-profit leader and public servant with a depth of experience in community education, engagement and action. He has advised brands and community youth groups including Children’s Defense Funds, Red Cross, US Department of Labor, Nike, Los Angeles Sparks and Boys and Girls Club, and has also served on several non-profit executive boards as well as the City of Pasadena Human Relations Commission.

Mr. Lamar will address the march alongside Jose Madera, a local Chicano activist and educator. Guided by his ancestors and the revolutionaries that came before him, Mr. Madera’s organizing is deeply rooted in grassroots coalition building, the amplifying of youth voices and solidarity work with movements and communities committed to social justice. As the Zapatistas say, he envisions “Un mundo donde quepan muchos mundos,” (A World Where Many Worlds Fit).

“We are proud to bring these

youth advocates in as keynote speakers,” said Duarte Teen Center Supervisor Marilyn Mays. “While there are added challenges in organizing the Unity March this year due to health guidelines and other factors, we know how important it is to maintain and grow our sense of community in Duarte.”

Participants must wear face masks and maintain social distancing of at least six (6) feet from other marchers outside their own family or household. Beginning at the steps of Duarte City Hall (1600 Huntington Drive) at 8:30 a.m., the march will proceed to Duarte Park (1344 Bloomdale St) where a brief program will be held on the grass area. Free t-shirts and Duarte face masks will be provided to the first 150 participants, so come early!

Everyone is a Pedestrian: October is National Pedestrian Safety Month

BALDWIN PARK - October is National Pedestrian Safety Month and the Baldwin Park Police Department encourages the public to remember that everyone is a pedestrian.

“Whether in a parking lot, crosswalk, or intersection, we are all pedestrians,” Baldwin Park Police Department, Commander Andrew Velebil said.

“Always be aware and look for pedestrians. We want those who are out walking to be safe and feel safe when traveling.”

In an effort to promote a safe walking environment in our community, the Baldwin Park Police Department will focus on locations with a higher number of incidents of vehicle crashes involving pedestrians. Officers will monitor crosswalks for drivers and pedestrians who fail to yield the right-of-way or other violations that put pedestrians at risk.

The number of pedestrians killed has grown by about 50%

over the past decade, with 6,283 pedestrians killed in traffic crashes nationwide in 2018, or one traffic-related pedestrian death every 84 minutes.

Excess speed, poor lighting, crossing outside crosswalks and impairment are the main factors that lead to a pedestrian being struck by a vehicle.

The Baldwin Park Police Department offers the following tips for drivers and pedestrians:

- Drivers
 - Slow down on busy streets and intersections.
 - Always look for pedestrians in intersections. Stop and allow pedestrians to cross. Pedestrians have the right-of-way at all marked or unmarked crosswalks.
 - Stay off the phone and avoid other distracting behaviors such as eating, grooming, or using in-dash touch screens.
 - Do your best to not block crosswalks making a right-hand

turn.

- Keep headlights on at night and be extra careful when pedestrians are harder to see.

- Obey signs and signals. Try to cross at marked crosswalks, preferably at stop signs or signals where cars expect to see pedestrians.

- Make eye contact and nod or wave at drivers. A quick nod or wave is an easy way to let a driver know you see them, and they see you.

- Get in the habit of walking with a flashlight or wearing a reflective vest at night so it is easier for drivers to spot you.

- If you need to briefly walk into the street to maintain social distancing on sidewalks, look both ways for passing cars.

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

Assessor’s Office Offers Disaster Relief to Property Owners Affected by Wildfires

LOS ANGELES COUNTY – Los Angeles County Assessor Jeff Prang is reminding property owners in the path of the recent wildfires that they may be eligible for tax relief. “The recent spate of wildfires have caused significant damage and devastating losses,” Assessor Prang said. “I want to remind property owners that you may be eligible for property tax relief that could save you money on your taxes as you move forward.”

By filing a claim for Misfortune & Calamity relief within one year of the incident, properties that have sustained a minimum of \$10,000 in damage or destroyed entirely may be eligible for a refund of taxes al-

ready paid and lower annual tax bills until the property is repaired or rebuilt. Assessor office is working proactively in conjunction with fire department officials from various jurisdictions to identify which properties are affected.

LA County Library Offers Free Flu Immunization Clinics at Libraries

Clinics will be Held October through November

LOS ANGELES COUNTY - Flu season is here. To help you stay healthy, LA County Library is partnering with the LA County Department of Public Health for the seventh year in a row to offer free flu immunization clinics at community libraries throughout the county in the months of October and November. No appointment or insurance is required.

Over 2,500 free flu immunizations were given at LA County Library locations in 2019. To continue offering this vital service while prioritizing the safety of customers and staff, the Library will enforce physical distancing and masking requirements and provide additional disinfecting at each free flu clinic location. Drive-through options are available at select locations.

According to the CDC, up to 11% of Americans become ill with the flu each year, leading to thousands of deaths—making it

more important than ever to get a flu immunization to protect yourself and the people around you, and help reduce the strain on healthcare systems responding to the COVID-19 pandemic. Because flu is highly contagious, immunizations not only protect the person who gets the immunization, but also reduce the risk for their family, coworkers, and other close contacts. Flu immunizations are recommended for everyone 6 months of age and older, including healthy adults. Pregnant women, children, adults 50 years of age and older, and immunocompromised individuals are especially susceptible.

“During these unprecedented times, the well-being our staff and customers is always on our minds,” said LA County Library Director Skye Patrick. “Working with Public Health to make flu immunization clinics available to our customers again this year allows us to provide them with a valuable resource to keep them healthy.”

“This year, flu and COVID-19 will be circulating at the same

time in our communities throughout LA County, making it more important than ever that as many people as possible get their flu immunization,” said Barbara Ferrer, PhD, MPH, MEd, Director of Public Health. “Having flu immunizations available at LA County Library locations at no cost and with no insurance requirement will make it easy for residents to protect themselves and their loved ones. We encourage everyone 6 months and older to get immunized and deeply appreciate everyone at LA County Library for collaborating on this effort.”

Grant Funds Available for COVID-19 Impacted Individuals through the Foothill Workforce Development Board

Funds are available through a special grant from the State of California to assist those whose employment is impacted by COVID-19. The Foothill Workforce Development Board (FWDB) provides workplace skills development and employer-specific training to help workers gain skills, education and the credentials that employers value.

If you are unemployed and live in Arcadia, Duarte, Monrovia, Pasadena, Sierra Madre, or South Pasadena, you may qualify for up to \$800 in financial reimbursements for expenses such as utilities, childcare, cell phone bills, rent, and items required to tele-

work including the internet.

These funds are not subject to repayment, and the process for applying is easy and contactless.

To qualify for assistance, an individual must be receiving or have exhausted State of California issued unemployment benefits. In addition, an individual must meet one of the following criteria:

- Laid off due to COVID-19
- Experienced a reduction in hours, and/or pay due to COVID-19,
- Unable to work for any of the following COVID-19 related reasons:
 - Subject to quarantine

- Caregiver for someone who is subject to quarantine

The Real Kamala Harris

Watching talk shows and listening to debates, I come away wondering why we can't get yes or no questions from moderators and yes or no answers from candidates. The big question hitting all venues after the Pence Harris Debate: If elected, are Biden and Harris going to pack the Supreme Court adding more justices taking it from conservative back to a liberal majority. No answers yet.

In the Sacramento Bee fact-check series, Harris said, debating Vice President Mike Pence, "We will decriminalize marijuana and we will expunge the records of those who have been convicted of marijuana." That sounds just like the George Soros Open Society platform and track record of L.A. County District Attorney candidate, George Gascon, who walked away from San Francisco as D.A. leaving her streets littered with the human remnants of that policy.

In 2016, Prop 64, a recreational marijuana initiative on the ballot was supported by then-Lt. Gov. Gavin Newsom who announced the war on drugs was an abject failure. He asked all elected officials in California to announce their position on 64. Most remained non-committal, but Sen. Dianne Feinstein came out in opposition. Sacramento Bee, August 2016, reported then-Attorney General Harris would not take positions on ballot measures, because her office was involved in preparing initiatives' titles and summaries. But a following paragraph reported she was generally supportive of legalization because it "... is inevitable given the current climate."

In 2018, Sen. Kamala Harris co-sponsored Sen. Cory Booker's (D-NJ) Marijuana Justice Act to end the federal prohibition on marijuana, remove it from the list of controlled substances and provide federal funds to incentivize states to change their marijuana laws if the laws had "... a disproportionate effect on low-income individuals and/or people of color." The measure failed.

A second bill, The MORE Act, Marijuana Opportunity Reinvestment and Expungement Act of 2019, would legalize marijuana at the federal level and expunge

marijuana-related criminal records, though it leaves the decision on sale of marijuana up to the states. Congress has not come out fully supportive of any of the bills on marijuana, but appears ready to allow states to set their own policies and enforce those regulations.

Kamala Harris said she is supportive of Medicare for All, and in 2017 co-sponsored Sen. Bernie Sanders Medicare for All proposal. That Medicare for All plan was a single-payer plan abolishing private insurance companies and would have automatically enrolled every citizen in a government run health care plan. Unanswered questions about comprehensive employee private plans through work (Kaiser, PERS, STRS) remain hanging -- would these plans be abolished? People would be allowed to buy a supplemental plan for things not covered like cosmetic surgery, dental care, eye exams, acupuncture and several other items. What's not clear, at least to me, if private insurance companies are abolished, who do we buy those supplemental plans from and at what cost?

NBC News released information on Joe Biden's Plan providing a Medicare-like option for the public to receive health insurance but also able to choose their own private insurance. The Biden campaign says, "... [this] health care plan serves as a transitional piece of legislation that could pave the path to a Medicare-for-All single payer system in the future." That plan would allow undocumented immigrants to buy into the public option, but is not proposed to be subsidized.

Gov. Newsom issued a moratorium on the death penalty even though the voters have approved initiatives twice on the ballot reinstating the death penalty. L.A. Times, December 2019, says, "In 2012 and 2016, there were initiatives on the ballot to repeal capital punishment and move everyone off death row to the general prison population for life without the possibility of parole. Harris declined to take a position on either."

Campaigning for San Francisco District Attorney, Kamala Harris said she would never seek the death penalty. When a gang-banger shot and killed a young police officer, Harris refused to seek the death penalty. At the officer's funeral, Sen. Dianne Feinstein called Harris out on that decision saying, "This is not only the definition of tragedy, it's the special circumstance called for by the death penalty."

October 7th, Gov. Newsom directed state agencies to conserve 30% of state land and water by 2030 using this technique, coupled by removal of gas-powered vehicles by 2035, to remove carbon from the atmosphere to cure climate change. We remember Rep. Judy Chu's efforts to grab control of our San Gabriel Mountains, adjacent residential and commercial areas to create a National Recreation Area (NRA). That effort failed but did create the San Gabriel Mountains National Monument. Recently, Chu came back with Sen. Harris and legislation to expand the Monument and continue the effort to take control of all land from the Channel Islands to San Bernardino down through the Puente Hills. Harris proposed two additional NRAs - one in Northern and one in Central California.

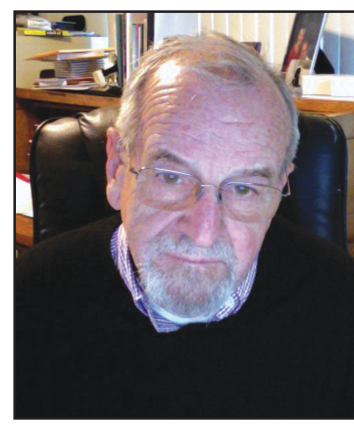
In August, Center for Responsive Politics reported Kamala Harris would bring to the Biden for President campaign much needed funding. Donors who backed Harris' presidential campaign had already given \$19 million to Biden accounting for 7% of his campaign's fundraising. \$11 million came in to Biden in four hours after announcing Harris as the running mate.

cross the mighty Pacific Ocean. On the way, our ship made a slight detour to keep from colliding with a floating island the size of the state of Maryland. It was made up of trash, and grows larger and more deadly every year. You see, we have been using our oceans both as a giant sewer and the town dump.

From the dawn of the industrial age we have burned enough fossil fuels—coal, oil, natural gas, to add more than 365 billion tons of carbon to the air we all breathe. Each year we throw up another nine billion tons. The toxic level of the resulting generation of carbon dioxide is now higher than at any time in the last several million years.

What does this have to do with the oceans? Everywhere that the air comes in contact with water, the water become more acidic.

California Offers \$1,000 Credit to Small Businesses

SACRAMENTO - With millions of people out of work in California, Gov. Gavin Newsom recently signed a law giving tax breaks to small businesses that hire more workers over the next two months.

The law, CA Senate Bill 1447, offers businesses with 100 employees or less a credit of \$1,000 on their state tax bills for each new employee hired between July and the end of November 2020. It only applies to businesses that have lost at least half of their revenue from April to June this year compared to the same time period last year. To qualify, a business must show its gross receipts fell

50 percent in the second quarter of 2020 compared to the same quarter in 2019.

The credit is capped at \$100 million statewide or \$100,000 for each business. Businesses get the credit only if they hire employees, not contractors. Small businesses that are owned by large companies are not eligible.

Unlike most tax breaks, businesses can also use the credit to lower the amount of sales taxes they have to send to the state. The business will have five years to use the credit and can apply it to any taxes owed, including sales and use taxes.

"TIME JOCKEY" - Dodgers Legacy

Thanks for the Memories...
Growing up as fan of the Dodgers in the 1960's, the players, games and events which happened in the game of baseball has stayed with me all this time. The Dodgers have not won a World Championship since 1988, and I remember that year like it was yesterday, but the truth is that I also remember their World Series appearances in 1963, 1965, 1966, 1974, and 1981. And along with the memories of those fantastic teams, I also remember the players on those teams.

Over the past week, three members of those Dodgers teams passed away. Each played a different position and had a different role with the team but they also had a very unique specialty. Ron Perranoski was a left-handed relief pitcher who was acquired by the Dodgers from the Chicago Cubs in 1960. Don Zimmer was sent by the Dodgers to Chicago who in return received Perranoski, John Goryl, Lee Handley and \$25,000. But Perranoski was the most successful of the traded players as he appeared in three World Series, led the team in saves 5 of the 7 years he was with the Dodgers, and finished 4th on their All-Time list of save

leaders.

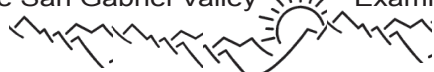
During his reign of success, Perranoski was the ace of the bullpen, and with a starting rotation which included Sandy Koufax, Don Drysdale, Claude Osteen and Johnny Podres, he made sure their stellar performances were completed with a victory. His best year was 1963 when he won 16 games as a reliever and finished 4th in the Most Valuable Player award voting. In 1963, the Dodgers won the World Championship by defeating the New York Yankees in a four-game sweep. One note on Perranoski, was that he was ready to pitch in the final 1962 playoff game when the Dodgers lost to the Giants but was never called into the game even though he had saved 20 games that season. In 1967, Perranoski was traded to the Minnesota Twins along with John Roseboro and Bob Miller for Zolio Versailles and Jim "Mudcat" Grant. Perranoski had the last laugh in the trade as he led the American League in saves with 31 in 1969 and 34 in 1970. He would eventually return to the Dodgers spending 14 years as their pitching coach.

Another special player was "Sweet" Lou Johnson, an outfielder who also passed away in the past week. Johnson had been a career minor leaguer when he was called up to replace the injured Tommy Davis, who had fractured his ankle in a game against the Giants. Johnson was 30-years old in 1965 and he wasn't expected to be much of an impact. But Johnson brought something else which wasn't expected, he brought a big smile,

high energy and a lot of fun into a clubhouse that lacked those qualities. He filled in more than enough for Tommy Davis, and led the team with home runs and slugging percentage playing a vital role in the Dodgers 1965 World Championship. An interesting note on Johnson is that he scored the only run in Sandy Koufax's perfect game when he walked, was sacrificed to second, stole third and scored on an overthrow. He would become a part of the Dodgers' Public Relations Team, working for the Dodgers after retirement and becoming one of the most popular Dodgers ever.

And finally, Jay Johnstone, also passed away over the past few weeks. Johnstone was mostly an outfielder who excelled as a pinch-hitter. He was a part of the Dodgers teams of the late 1970's and early 1980's and played with a number of teams including the California Angels. But Johnstone brought his zany antics into the Dodger clubhouse and could always be seen performing comic routines during television interviews and taking his act onto the field during rain delays. Ron Perranoski, "Sweet" Lou Johnson and Jay Johnstone were all part of the Dodgers Legacy and were vital parts of their successes. Their passing away leaves us with great memories of the joy they brought us playing for the Los Angeles Dodgers....

Los Angeles County Treasurer and Tax Collector Mails Approximately 2.4 Million Annual Secured Property Tax Bills

LOS ANGELES COUNTY - The Los Angeles County Treasurer and Tax Collector office, pursuant to the California Revenue and Taxation Code (R&TC) Sections 2609 and 2610, announces that the Department will mail approximately 2,400,000 2020-21 Annual Secured Property Tax Bills on or before Sunday, November 1, 2020, to all property owners at the addresses shown on the tax roll. The R&TC Section 2610.5 does not relieve a property owner of the responsibility to make timely payments due to failure to receive a property tax bill. Therefore, property owners who have not received a property tax bill by Sunday, November 1, 2020, should call us on our Bill Request Line at 1(213) 893-1103 or visit our website at ttc.lacounty.gov to request a Substitute Secured Property Tax Bill.

"Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our offices are currently closed to the public," Mr. Knox advised. Please visit our website at ttc.lacounty.gov for up-to-date information related to in-person services.

Mr. Knox further said, "As a result of this mailing, property owners may find it difficult to reach us on the telephone. They may obtain answers to the great majority of their questions, including how to request a copy of

a property tax bill, obtain the amount due on any parcel, or find the tax payment history for the past three fiscal tax years from the Los Angeles County Property Tax Portal at propertytax.lacounty.gov. Property owners may also call the toll-free Property Tax Information Line at 1(888) 807-2111, where automated information is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week."

Your property tax bill has two payment stubs. The 1st installment payment is due on Sunday, November 1, 2020, and becomes delinquent on Thursday, December 10, 2020. The 2nd installment payment is due on Monday, February 1, 2021, and becomes delinquent on Saturday, April 10, 2021. Since April 10 falls on a Saturday, by law, the Tax Collector extends the delinquency date to the close of business on Monday, April 12, 2021. If the Tax Collector does not receive your payment by the delinquency date, or if the United States Postal Service (USPS) does not postmark your payment on or before the delinquency date, the Tax Collector will impose a 10 percent penalty on each installment and a \$10 cost on the 2nd installment.

PARTIAL PAYMENTS - We recommend you pay the total

amount due. However, if you are unable to do so, we accept partial payments, which reduce the amount of penalties imposed.

PAY ONLINE - To make payments online, go to propertytax.lacounty.gov and select "Pay Property Taxes Online." You can make online payments 24 hours a day, 7 days a week up to 11:59 p.m. Pacific Time on the delinquency date.

There is no cost to you for electronic check (eCheck) payments. The Annual Secured Property Tax Bill contains your Assessor's Identification Number (AIN) and Personal Identification Number (PIN), which you will need to complete the transaction. Each eCheck transaction is limited to \$999,999.99.

You may view a step-by-step video on how to make an eCheck payment at ttc.lacounty.gov/pay-secured-property-taxes-online.

When paying by eCheck, your bank account must be Automated Clearing House (ACH)-enabled, meaning the transaction can settle through the ACH Network. If your bank account has a debit block to prevent unauthorized organizations from debiting your account via ACH, you must notify your bank to authorize ACH debits from Los Angeles County with a debit filter with the Company Identification Number of 0000079161. Los Angeles County updated its Company Identification Number in September 2018, so you must update this Company Identification Number if you previously had a debit filter on your bank account.

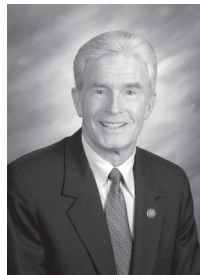

Disney is laying off 28,000 workers in response to the pounding its theme parks have taken during the COVID-19 pandemic. "We've cut expenses, suspended capital projects, furloughed our cast members while still paying benefits, and modified our operations to run as efficiently as possible. However, we simply cannot responsibly stay fully staffed while operating at such limited capacity," Parks chief Josh D'Amaro said recently. D'Amaro also took a shot at California Gov. Newsom, specifically "that State's unwillingness to lift restrictions that would allow Disneyland to reopen". Disney's problems represent just the tip of a state mandated "shutdown" iceberg!

However, many other businesses, such as Amazon and smaller online vendors, are having best ever years! State Governors, to a great extent, have been designating economic and social winners and losers this year, allowing some entities to remain open while others (with similar COVID health risks) are being kept closed. This craziness, such as forcing churches to remain closed while same state casinos are open, has been widespread. Decisions that defy logic or fairness have resulted in many Governors losing credibility during 2020.

"The people of this country don't trust this federal government with this vaccine process," New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo said last week, saying his state would set up its own independent task force to approve a COVID-19 vaccine. If Cuomo had any credibility left after his mishandling of elderly COVID patients and NY riot related disasters he might be listened to. But, why

would anyone believe Cuomo on anything now? More interestingly, President Trump related that the White House may ease FDA guidelines for emergency-use authorization of a vaccine, while HHS Secretary Azar revealed that all six frontrunning vaccines were already being produced in large quantities.

Dr. Anthony Fauci took to Facebook Live last week to offset increasing noise about a politicized approval process for potential coronavirus vaccines. He declared: "People are saying How do I know it's safe? How do I know it's effective? There's a lot of confusion because there are mixed messages. With every vaccine trial, there is an independent group of scientists, vaccinologists, ethicists and statisticians - known as a data and safety monitoring board - that has exclusive access to the data from a vaccine's clinical trial. If a vaccine proves safe and effective, the company can then seek approval from the FDA and the data will eventually become publicly available".

Novartis CEO Vas Narasimhan also questions if vaccines alone will be enough to fight COVID. The first thoroughly tested and FDA approved vaccine, likely from Pfizer, could be available by the end of October, but it would be next year before supplies are adequate to vaccinate everyone. Even then we don't know how well vaccines will work. "At minimum, therapeutics are a bridge

to those high-volume, high-efficacy vaccines." Narasimhan continued "Likely even beyond the point of vaccines being broadly deployed, we will need therapeutics for those patients who still become ill from the virus". President Trump's rapid recovery from COVID-19 can be attributed to the success of these new therapeutics!

The third quarter of 2020 ended with a normally down September (as anticipated). The Market is now beginning its historically powerful fourth quarter. Incidentally, while we don't believe market participants were happy with the first Presidential debate, they seem to agree it was ugly. All three debate participants - President Trump, Vice President Biden, and moderator Chris Wallace - were combative. According to a CBS News poll 69% of viewers were annoyed and 19% were pessimistic. Here's hoping a next debate is both more civil and enlightening. It will likely remain challenging for many voters to understand what is true and what is political BS, especially in television commentary, ads or even in future debates!

It appears that President Trump is rapidly recovering from the Wuhan coronavirus, which should allow his second debate with Joe Biden on October 15th to be held as scheduled. Many voters would like to see a 2nd live debate, so we hope the Democrats will allow that to happen as scheduled for October 15th. Also, hopefully voters will believe their eyes about what has recently been happening in multiple Democratic Party run cities and states!

Your Money - Ask Julia

We've heard horror stories from those who were not prepared for loss of electrical power and impending polluted or no water. Their stores, restaurants, and gas stations shut down. How much should we save for such emergencies?

Although it is important to have money saved for emergencies, it is also important to have emergency supplies on hand. Your emergency fund should be enough to pay your insurance deductibles, three months of rent/mortgage and groceries, and important repairs. Do an online search for Emergency or Earthquake Preparedness. The pandemic has helped people think about what they might need if there's a complete shutdown, or you have to quarantine. Make plans for staying home, for getting out of town, and for getting home if you have to abandon your vehicle and walk home. Think of the basics: food, water, shelter, clothing, and personal safety or defense. Tell your doctor you are building an emergency kit and ask for an extra prescription for important medications. Stock up on bottled water, nutrition bars and batteries. Check flashlights. Buy and fill extra tanks of propane for your grill. Consider some type of generator powerful enough to at least power your refrigerator. Have a well-stocked first-aid kit, and keep a backpack of emergency supplies in your car in case you need to evacuate, or if you must leave your car and walk home. ATM's won't work, and businesses that can open won't accept large-denomination cash, so have some small bills and change for

purchases.

Am I allowed to just stop contributing to my 401k?

Contributing to a 401k is optional. When you take money out of your 401k during your retirement years, you will be required to pay taxes. You will be required to start taking money out when you reach 72 years of age. You do have choices. Instead of contributing to your 401k, you could pay your taxes as you earn the money. Then, take some of that money and invest it into an IRA (Individual Retirement Account). (Check with your CPA about the tax deduction in your specific case.) Although you will still be required to take income payments when you reach 72 years of age, you will only have to pay taxes on the earnings your investment dollars have accumulated over the years. Or, you could invest into a Roth IRA, never be required to take income payments, and pay no further taxes on earnings. Another choice would be to invest in a fixed-indexed universal life insurance policy which could provide not only life insurance benefits, but also living benefits like retirement income. And last, but not least, you could put

your money into a fixed or fixed-indexed annuity. Some annuities offer accelerated income for terminal illness and/or long-term care benefits.

Can I move the funds from my old 401k to a CD so it's safe and easily accessible?

Only if you pay all the income taxes (plus a 10-percent penalty if you are younger than 59 1/2) on the entire 401k balance. The money in your 401k is considered "qualified," meaning that funds went into that account before you paid taxes on them, and any growth was tax-deferred. Again, when you take money from a qualified account, you must pay taxes on every penny plus a 10% penalty if you are younger than 59 1/2. A CD is non-qualified since you already paid taxes on the money before you put it into a CD, and you pay taxes every year on the growth. You do have other options that would allow you to move those funds, not have to pay taxes (and penalties) now, with guarantees that your money would be safe from losses. (Guarantees are based on the strength of the insurance company.)

Situational Leadership

Situational leadership theory is one of the types of leadership model's and leadership styles and believes that different leadership style's suit different situations. A situational leadership model is also associated with situational leadership theory.

The basic idea of this model is that leadership flexibility is necessary for effective leadership. It also believes that different leadership approaches are required for different situations. This model defines four leadership styles. These styles are based on how much guidance or direction the leader can give to his or her followers.

Some Leadership Styles are as follows:

- Directing Leaders- Tasks and roles of the followers are defined by these leaders. Directing leaders also supervise their followers very closely. All decisions are taken and announced by the leader. Here the leader is more focused on completing the task than keeping a good relationship with the follower. Thus, communication is one way.
- Coaching Leaders- Here the leader still defines the tasks of the followers but asks for any suggestions from the follower and tries to keep a good relationship with the follower and the final decision is made by the leader and not the author but communication is two way.
- Supporting- Here the leader frequently takes the help of followers for day-to-day decision. Decisions include pro-

cesses and task allocation. The leader facilitates decisions, but the final decision is taken by the follower.

• Delegating Leaders- Here the leader is too involved in problem solving and taking decisions but the authority to take the final decision is with the follower. Followers also decide how and when the leader should be involved.

Depending on level of development of the employees, colleagues, and others, a particular style will be most effective if chosen correctly. The leadership approach should also match with what is required or needed by the employees, colleagues, and others, but most importantly be yourself otherwise you will never gain the respect of others. By following this simple suggestions, you have a better chance of success!

Repairophobia

What is repairophobia, you ask? It is the fear of auto repair. I read this term just the other day and said to myself, "Yes, it is about time it had a name!" What are the reasons consumers have this dreaded condition?

- Many consumer news reporters love to feature a certain shop or auto repair chain routinely ripping drivers off. They go under cover and take a well-maintained vehicle into the shop and then share with the public the long list of repair items the shop claims are needed. This hurts all auto repair shops, not just the culprit who apparently can't earn enough money being honest. The majority of auto repair shops are honest, hard working individuals. The con artists are few and far between.
- Consumers are worried that they won't have enough

money if they take their vehicle in for routine maintenance and the service advisor informs them they need a repair as well. They hadn't budgeted for more than the routine service. Always ask for a price before you tell any shop to proceed with a repair. If you can't afford to have it done right then, tell them you will have to come back at another time.

- Consumers may be pressed for time and don't want to be without their vehicle for very long. Even if the shop offer rides to and from home or work, they like the convenience of having their ride ready to go when they are.
- Consumers aren't experts in auto repair! They may be highly intelligent individuals, but this isn't their area of expertise. Ask the service advisor to explain what is needed in layman terms. If they start spouting

off phrases you don't understand, tell them. It is up to them to make you feel comfortable. If you are at the shop when they are explaining, tell them to show you. If you are on the telephone, get an explanation you feel good about.

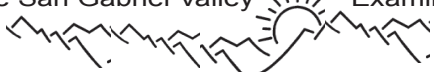

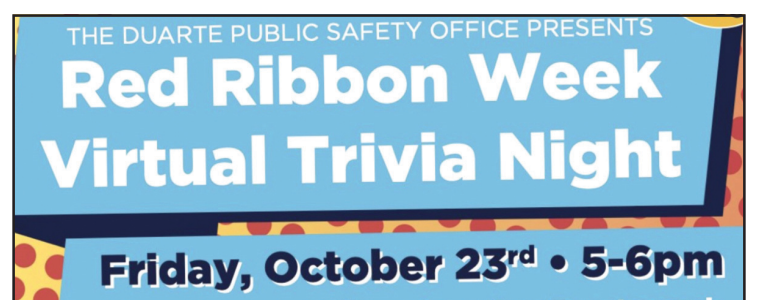

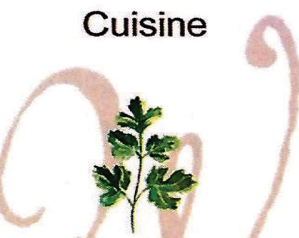
