# Bobcat Fire Continues to Burn

**AZUSA** - The Bobcat Fire is over 105,000 acres with 15% containment.

An update on an Emergency Order that was issued to Camp Williams. The area has been ordered to evacuate. Hwy 39 will remain closed, and Glendora Mountain Road is closed by CHP.

A Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA) message was sent out regarding Camp Williams. There may be residents of Azusa that received this message on their mobile devices as well. There is no imminent threat to the cities of Azusa, Glendora, La Verne, and Claremont as the fire burns away heading northeast. It has reached mountains as high as 9,000 feet. Mt. Wilson area was evacuated and the Crystal Lake recreational area has also been threatened.

This fast-moving wildfire has grown to more than 105,000 acres, making it one of the largest blazes in Los Angeles County's history.

The Bobcat fire, which ignited September 6th in the Angeles National Forest, burned approximately 105,000 acres by Sunday night after being fanned by winds of up to 30 mph during a day of low humidity -- conditions that were to continue overnight and see the blaze grow into Monday morning.

The Angeles National Forest said in a statement that the fire was "threatening all of the values" on the peak of Mt. Wilson, home of the historic Mt. Wilson Observatory in the San Gabriel Mountains after firefighters battled to protect the iconic structure late last week.

The building had been declared safe on Friday after responders deployed strategic firing, said Sam Hale, chairman of the Mt. Wilson Board of Trustees.

To the northeast, the fire destroyed the Los Angeles County Parks' Nature Center in the geological wonder of the Devil's Punchbowl.

None of the park's animals or staff were injured, it said on Facebook, stating it will assess the extent of the damage when they may return.

The blaze, at only 15% contained, was spreading from the foothills into the communities of Juniper Hills, Valyermo and Big

Pine, which are north of Los Angeles.

It is actively flanking and backing against winds or slope and then running, torching, spotting and crowning when fuels, slope and topography align, and it has been feeding on chaparral, brush and tall grass.

The communities of Littlerock and Wrightwood "will be impacted soon," according to reports.

Sheriff Alex Villanueva, toured sites the fire had devoured on Sunday, including the ruins of a man's home in Juniper Hill.

"He showed me his property that he, unfortunately, lost to this wildfire & shared some wonderful memories with me," the sheriff said via Twitter. "Although his home is gone, his spirits were high."

Evacuations have been ordered for communities throughout the area while warnings have

been made for the city of Pasadena and the communities of Altadena and Wrightwood, among others, the Angeles National Forest said.

More than 1,700 personnel were battling the blaze whose cause was still under investigation.

The fire has already grown to become one of the largest in Los Angeles County's history with the 2009 Station fire at some 160,000 acres claiming the title.

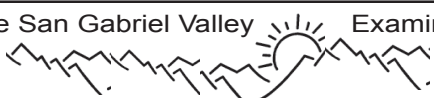

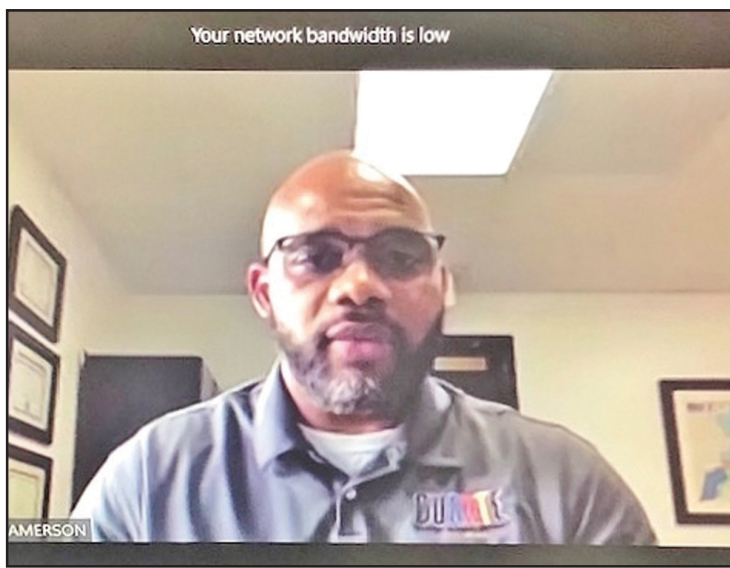


# Dr. Amerson Provides DUSD Update

**AZUSA** - At approximately 4:20 PM, Friday, Sept. 18th, Azusa Police Officers stopped to check a suspicious vehicle in the area of Second St. and Dalton Ave. During their investigation, officers located various types of drugs, drug paraphernalia and a large amount of currency.

The individual detained, Edwin Valenzuela (18 years, Azusa resident) was arrested for various drug related charges, including possession for sales. He was transported to the Azusa Police Department Jail and was held for booking and processing. He was arrested back on May 22, 2020 and has a court date for Monday, Sept. 21 for that arrest.

Bail for the felony arrest was set at \$30,000, however he was released just after midnight, early Saturday morning. Due to the AB109 mandate and the current "COVID zero bail procedure" being in place, he was released with a citation and had no bail paid.

His next court date for this felony is Sept. 22, the day after his other court date (Sept. 21) for his prior arrest.

# Safety is Primary as In-Person Classes Resume for Essential Worker Training at Local Community Colleges

This fall, with campuses closed, nearly all California community college students are pursuing their educational goals online. At the same time, the impact of COVID-19 has increased the need for qualified "essential workers" in fields like healthcare and automotive technology. This leaves students stymied between course requirements for at least some hands-on training for these professions and closed college campuses.

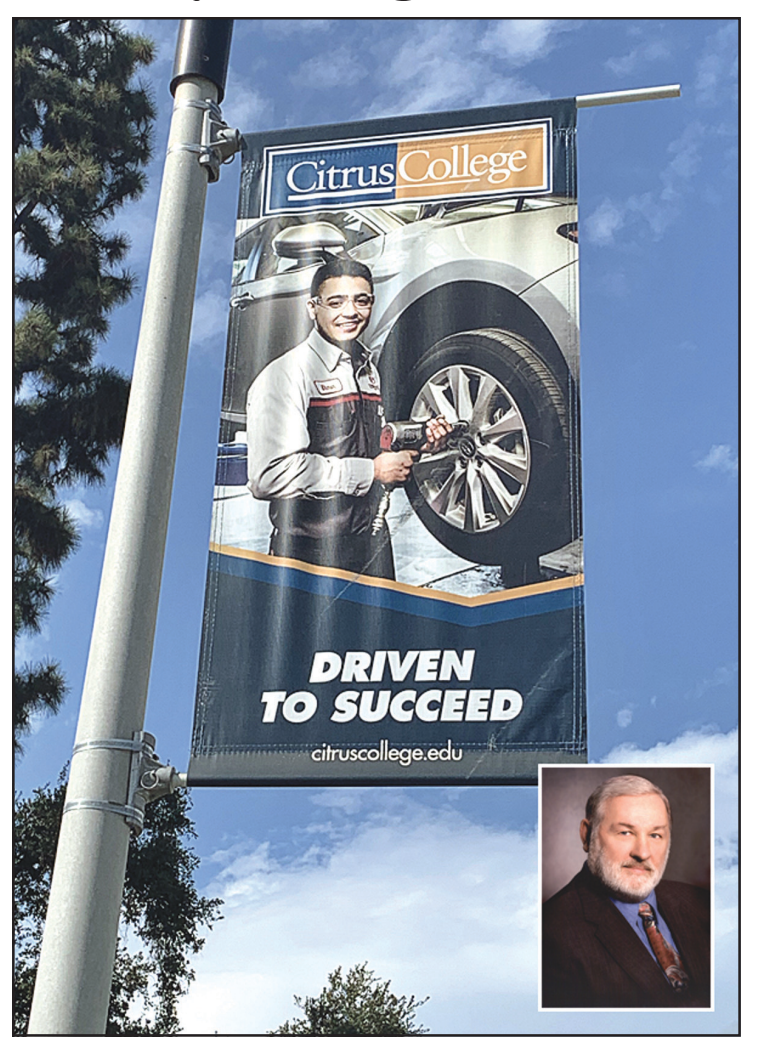
Citrus College has recently reopened labs for students in the Automotive and Diesel Technology programs to train essential workers for the Transportation and Logistics industry. The fact that these qualified professionals are considered "essential" adds an extra sense of urgency to quickly and effectively move students through their programs of study, so they can enter the workplace as soon as possible.

Doing so safely has required the development of myriad protocols and well-choreographed procedures to ensure the learning environment is safe for all participants---a deliberate and painstaking process.

In addition to the basic COVID-19 protections, like temperature checks, mandatory mask-wearing, the use of personal protective equipment, and the distancing of work stations, the college has developed a detailed set of checklists for instructional labs that follow guidelines provided by the Los Angeles Department of Public Health. These include specific protocols for parking, arrival and departure from campus, floor diagrams for standing and walking, the cleaning of classrooms and equipment and a great many other details. The limited number of students who are enrolled in these labs have been informed of the protocols and mandates for participation. They are also reminded of the risk of potential exposure to COVID-19.

Labs and clinical training for several other essential worker programs requiring in-person hours are also available at Citrus College, or will be available soon. Each program is required to meet and abide by every item on detailed checklists.

Studies show online learning is effective, has several unique advantages, and is sufficiently rigorous to satisfy the high standards required by all accredited institutions of higher learning in the state. And during a global pandemic, it is a safe option for students, faculty and staff. Training for some professions, however, requires in-person instruction,

and local community colleges are stepping up to provide a safe environment as students complete the requirements for graduation or certification in their chosen fields.

## Data Shows Los Angeles County Makes Continued Progress against COVID-19

**LOS ANGELES COUNTY** - The number of new cases has steadily decreased through August and September. Last week the average daily number of cases was 800, compared with over 2,000 just a month ago. Public Health will continue to watch this indicator closely because it may be artificially low due to reduced testing numbers seen over the last two weeks.

Our test positivity rate has averaged 3% for the past week. Just a month ago, in mid-August, this rate averaged 5%. A decreased test positivity rate is often a sign of reduced community transmission.

Public Health continues to report data on highly impacted groups that continue to experience disproportionate health outcomes. The data shows that over time our cases are decreasing across all groups and the gaps are starting to close.

At the mid-July peak, the average daily cases among Latino/Latinx residents were 200 cases per 100,000 people. This was four times higher than the rate

for White residents at 50 cases per 100,000 people and five times higher than that of Asian residents' 37 cases per 100,000 people. Case rates among African American/Black residents at 80 per 100,000 people during this time period were also far higher than that of White and Asian residents.

As of early September, the case rate for Latino/Latinx residents dropped to 40 cases per 100,000 people; while still twice that of White residents with a rate of 24 cases per 100,000 people, this is a significant narrowing of the gap. The case rate among African American/Black residents is now only slightly higher than that of White residents at 24 cases per 100,000 people. The case rate among Asian residents continue to be the lowest at about 10 cases per 100,000 people.

Public Health is also seeing decreases in deaths among races and ethnicity groups. During the July peak, the mortality rate among Latino/Latinx residents was 6 deaths per 100,000 people, four times that of White residents who had a mortality rate of 1.4 deaths per 100,000 people. The mortality rate among Black residents was 4 deaths per 100,000, and the mortality rate among Asian residents was 2.7 deaths per 100,000. As of September 6, the mortality rate among Latino/Latinx residents decreased to 2 deaths per 100,000 people, twice that of White residents and Asian residents who both have a mortality rate of 1 death per 100,000. Similarly, the mortality rate among African American/Black resi-

dents decreased to around 1 death per 100,000 people.

We continue to also see higher mortality rates among people living in areas with fewer resources, when compared to mortality rates among people in the areas with the most resources. During the peak, the mortality rate among people living in the areas with the fewest resources was 6.5 per 100,000 people, three times that of people living in high-resource areas. In early September, the mortality rate among people living in areas with the fewest resources was 2.5 per 100,000 people, which is still almost three times that of people living in the highest-resource areas.

These are very important numbers to consider as we make decisions about the path forward over the next few months. We will need to be mindful of the impact of our re-openings and actions both across the county and among the people who are most affected by this pandemic, as we continue to work together to address the inequitable distribution of resources and opportunities that are essential for optimal health and well-being.

Testing results are available for more than 2,477,000 individuals with 10% of all people testing positive.

## Napolitano, LaHood Introduce Legislation to Designate Route 66 as a National Historic Trail

**WASHINGTON, DC** - Reps. Grace F. Napolitano (D-CA-32) and Darin LaHood (R-IL-18) introduced H.R. 8240, legislation to designate Route 66 as a National Historic Trail. The lawmakers previously introduced similar legislation in the 115th Congress.

"Route 66 runs east to west through my entire district and continues to be an integral part of our San Gabriel Valley's culture and economy," Napolitano said. "Historic Trail designation would deliver much needed federal dollars for the rehabilitation and improvement of Route 66, benefiting millions of residents and countless economies in the eight states which proudly claim a portion of the Mother Road. These funds would be used in coordination with cities and stakeholders for the safeguarding of property, artifacts, memorabilia, and other historical items. I am proud to again join Congressman La Hood in introducing this bipartisan legislation to preserve the legacy of Route 66 for future generations of Americans."

"Route 66 is a crucial transportation artery that connects America's heartland to the west," said Rep. LaHood. "The Mother Road provides powerful economic development tools for communities throughout Illinois, creating jobs and opportunity for 18th District residents. Designating Route 66 as a National Historic Trail would provide this highway with a permanent pro-

## Supervisors Approves Emergency Proclamation Declaring Local Emergency In Response To Bobcat Fire

**LOS ANGELES COUNTY** - The Board of Supervisors approved a motion by Supervisor Kathryn Barger and co-authored by Supervisor Hilda Solis to ratify the emergency proclamation signed over the weekend declaring a local emergency as a result of the Bobcat Fire in the San Gabriel Valley.

The Bobcat Fire started on Sept. 6 and is now at 105,345 acres with fifteen percent containment. The fire is located near

the Cogswell Dam and West Fork Day Use area and is burning in heavy fuels and spreading rapidly. Firefighters continue to work diligently and are focused on protecting the foothill communities and Mt. Wilson. An increase in resources has allowed first responders to expand their efforts to reduce further growth of the fire.

"I am grateful for the collaboration of our cities and commu-

nities, including Sierra Madre, Arcadia, Monrovia, Bradbury, Duarte and Azusa, who have shown strong unity in support of our fire personnel to battle the ongoing fire," Supervisor Barger said. "The Los Angeles County Fire Department is working in partnership with U.S. Forest Service Angeles National Forest and American Red Cross to manage this emergency and provide essential support to residents."

## Targeting Venues Where Human Trafficking Persists

**LOS ANGELES COUNTY** - The Board of Supervisors unanimously voted to develop a new ordinance that would help victims break free of their bondage, encourage witnesses to intervene, and crack down on perpetrators.

Leaving no stone unturned, the motion also mandated sports and entertainment venues, as well as motels, hotels, inns, massage parlors, and other establishments to post notices with a hotline for reporting human trafficking. Current State law requires such notices only at locations where trafficking is known to occur, such as adult businesses, and at locations where trafficking victims seek assistance, such as hospitals and urgent care centers. However, the law has been inconsistently applied across jurisdictions.

"Organized criminal enterprises have been known to transport victims - many of them underage - to large-scale athletic competitions in order to sell them for sex," Supervisor Ridley-Thomas said. "With Los Angeles destined to host the Super Bowl in 2022 and the Summer Olympics in 2028, it is not too early to pre-

vent the depraved and often clandestine crime of human trafficking."

In their motion, Supervisors Ridley-Thomas and Hahn noted that state law allows the County to establish an ordinance that would allow routine inspections of establishments where human trafficking is suspected, and provide outreach and education for victims and witnesses. Such an ordinance could also include fines and penalties for violations, with the revenue going towards supporting victims.

The County has been working with the City of Los Angeles to align legal remedies. Earlier this year, the City approved an ordinance based on a motion by City Council President Nury Martinez to add hotels, motels, and bed and breakfast inns to the list of locations required to post notices informing their patrons about human trafficking hotlines.

Human trafficking, which includes both sex and labor trafficking, remains a significant problem worldwide. Traffickers create a climate of fear to control their victims and lure or co-

erce people into various forms of work, including domestic, factory, farm, restaurant, and commercial sex. Due to under-reporting, under-identification, and the tactics of violence, stigmatization, and shame utilized by traffickers and predators, accurate and uniform statistics are difficult to compile, and many instances of victimization go undetected.

Over the last several years, Los Angeles County has taken various measures to help victims and survivors, providing them with a range of services. It also created a First Responder Protocol aimed at preventing them from being re-traumatized when they come into contact with law enforcement. Instead of arresting them for crimes committed by pimps and johns, the Protocol diverts them from incarceration and connects them to safety, stability and hope.

The County has also moved to strengthen enforcement against the perpetrators of modern-day slavery, not only pimps and johns but also unscrupulous businesses and individuals who seek to profit from forced labor.

## Supervisor Instructs County to Prepare Now for Eventual COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution

**LOS ANGELES COUNTY** - The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors approved a motion by Supervisor Janice Hahn to instruct Los Angeles County Departments to act now to prepare for the distribution of a COVID-19 vaccine to residents when one becomes available.

"We are the largest County in the nation, and when the time comes, we will need to fairly and equitably get a vaccine to over 10 million people," said Supervisor Janice Hahn. "We need to start preparing now to receive, store, distribute, and administer a vaccine so we don't waste any time."

In recent weeks, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued guidance to State public health officials, prompting them to prepare for

COVID-19 vaccination distribution. Currently, there are 37 vaccines in clinical trials and 3 vaccines are in the third phase of trials. Some reports indicate that limited COVID-19 vaccine doses in phase 3 may be available by early November 2020, with substantial increases in vaccine supply slated for 2021.

The CDC provided guidance on what is required for the preparation and distribution of a vaccine. The guidance includes ordering, data reporting, and tailoring of CDC-developed public-facing communications; preparing for the delivery, storage, and handling of the vaccine vials; identifying high risk priority groups that need the vaccine first like healthcare professionals and those living in long term care fa-

cilities; and setting up mass vaccination clinics for the general population when more doses of vaccine are available, supply permitting.

With well over ten million residents, Los Angeles County must prepare a vaccination plan that ensures intentional and systematic allocation, with priority given to those in targeted groups and underserved populations who have been disproportionately affected by COVID-19.

Supervisor Hahn's motion, which passed unanimously, instructs the LA County Department of Public Health to work with relevant departments, local cities, and community agencies to develop a vaccination plan and report back to the Board in 45 days.

## Napolitano's Mental Health Services for Students Act Passes Committee

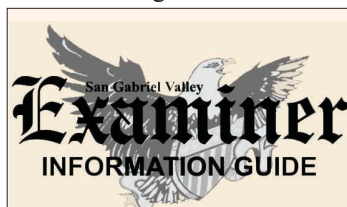
**WASHINGTON, DC** - H.R. 1109, the Mental Health Services for Students Act, which is authored by Rep. Grace F. Napolitano (D-CA-32), unanimously passed the House Energy and Commerce Committee during a full committee markup.

"We are continuing to witness how fear and anxiety about the Coronavirus can be overwhelming and cause strong emotions for our constituents, especially children, as the public health crisis rages on," Napolitano said. "The National Institute of Mental Health reports that one in five youth already experience some type of mental health disorder, which can cause significant challenges at home, school, and in their community. Yet, prior to

this public health emergency, only 10 percent of children and adolescents ages 3 to 17-years-old received any treatment or counseling from a mental health professional. Today's passage of the Mental Health Services for Students Act is a critical step toward addressing these urgent needs."

H.R. 1109, which Napolitano sponsored in the previous six Congresses under the title "Mental Health in Schools Act," is co-authored by Rep. John Katko. The bill creates a total of \$130 million in grant funding for schools across the country to partner with local mental health professionals to establish comprehensive mental health services for students. This proposal educates the

entire school community—from students and their families, to teachers, administrators, and support personnel—on the warning signs and symptoms of mental illness to help identify and treat mental health issues before they escalate. Napolitano secured federal funds in 2001 to establish a mental health services for students pilot program, administered by local nonprofit, Pacific Clinics. The program began in 4 schools and has now expanded to 35 schools throughout Los Angeles County, including much of the San Gabriel Valley, and serves as a model for H.R. 1109. The bill has 134 bipartisan cosponsors and the support of 50 mental health organizations, local governments, and teacher unions.

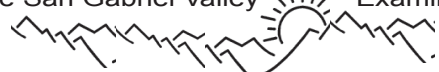

# Warm And Fuzzy Wins 69% of the Vote

Californians will vote November 3rd on twelve initiatives and the title of the initiatives, the first thing the voters see when they start the arduous task of marking up their ballot, has a huge impact on how they end up voting. Sometimes because the voter is rushed, perhaps not done enough reading or research to vote thoroughly informed, makes some uninformed choices because of the titles.

Proposition 15 title, the split roll tax, doesn't tell us the whole truth and has led to lawsuits by businesses and anti-tax advocate groups against Attorney General Xavier Becerra because of his creative and benign title. That title is: INCREASES FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS, COMMUNITY COLLEGES, AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES BY CHANGING TAX ASSESSMENT OF COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY.

Who isn't for giving more money to schools and children's education and putting more money into the coffers of local governments who provide us police services and libraries? When I read that title, it says some adjustments will be made to business taxes ... some little adjustments so our schools can give our kids a better education and our local governments will be able to provide quality of life services.

What the title doesn't say is this is the biggest tax increase in this state's history and begins to erode the safety net of Prop 13 protections, not just for businesses, but for all us. If Prop 15 passes, the Sacramento pro tax people will "smell blood" and decide to try to eliminate Prop 13 completely.

Prop 15 is asking us to approve an \$8 to \$12 billion tax increase on business and industrial properties by taxing them at market value, not assessed value beginning in 2022. And perform that assessment again every three years. Market value is what the property would sell for, if listed, when assessed. Prop 13 taxes all properties at assessed value which is 1% of the purchase price (at the time of purchase), with an

annual adjustment equal to the rate of inflation or 2%, whichever is lower. Big, big difference between Prop 13 tax and what Prop 15 would tax our local businesses.

Non-partisan Legislative Analyst Office (LAO) says: Market values tend to increase faster than Prop 13's 2% per year. If market values increase faster than the Prop 13 assessed values, that gives the pro-tax government people a reason to want to assess commercial properties every three years. Every three years, as property values in California increase, so would the commercial property taxes and generate more revenue for the Sacramento politicians trying to balance the state budget and always with more tax dollars.

LAO says Prop 15 creates significant new administrative responsibilities for county assessors. Their new responsibilities, if Prop 15 passes, would increase the amount of time and personnel needed to initiate the assessment of the business properties and again every three years after. In fact, by hundreds of millions of dollars per year says the LAO.

I find it interesting those proposing Prop 15 knew the increased burden Prop 15 would cause to the assessors, especially small counties, and created a provision requiring the state to make loans to counties to cover these initial, increased costs of assessing until new revenue from the new tax became available. Counties are required to repay those state loans.

So where does this warm and fuzzy revenue increase for schools and local governments

come in. Here's how it works:

First, the state general fund gets enough of that tax to off-set the lost revenue from Personal Income Tax (PIT) due to impacts of COVID and businesses transitioning to other states.

Second, counties would get some of the tax money to cover the costs of implementing the new assessments which the LAO says could be hundreds of millions of dollars.

Prop 15 says 60% of all remaining money will go to cities and special districts; and, 40% of remaining money to school districts and community colleges. Yes, the cities and schools share of Prop 15 new tax money would be what is left over after the state takes their share and the counties get enough to cover costs to implement the new assessments. County Assessors Association (CAA) says this initiative will not deliver the promised revenue to schools and local governments.

The LAO talks about hundreds of millions of dollars needed to implement Prop 15, while the County Assessors Association (CAA) says the property tax measure as written will be impossible for assessors to implement—not just difficult, but impossible and will cost more than \$1 billion during the 3-year phase-in period.

County assessors are a small pool of qualified staff and hiring and training 900 new government workers to implement Prop 15 could take years and lead to salary "bidding wars" for the small number of qualified candidates, driving up costs and leaving smaller counties at a hiring disadvantage. CAA has voted to oppose Prop 15.

Some would like to take the initiative title and summary job away from A.G. Becerra and give it to the non-partisan Legislative Analyst Office including Assembly Member Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) who proposed a constitutional amendment to do that. That died without a hearing.

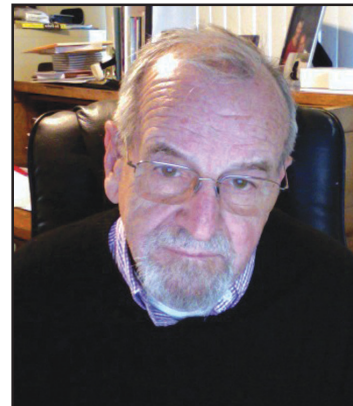

"TIME JOCKEY" - Arizona Mine

By Joe Castillo Superior... Copper is both a mineral and element. It is found within other types of minerals but is rarely found in large quantities. However, it is one of the most popular minerals and is also one of the easiest to mine as it does not take a lot of processing. It is one of the earliest known metals worked by ancient people and was easily found in river beds but today, most copper is found in sulfide ores. Copper is used mostly as a conductor of electricity especially in copper wiring. It is also a conductor of heat and is used in cooking appliances, wares and utensils.

One side opposed the development of the mine which would cause economic and socioeconomic problems for a town that had survived just fine for decades with the same type of operations.

The area around Superior is breathtaking with rock formations not seen anywhere else and a landscape that painters dream about. President Eisenhower declared 760 acres as protected federal land thereby restricting mining in the areas around Superior. But years later, Congress found a way to get around the ban and voted to allow mining through a land deal which included a must-pass military spending bill. The change in protections angered the local environmentalists and Native American Apaches who claimed their sacred land was being destroyed.

Even though Resolution Mining Company's parent company carried a poor environmental record it provided nearly 3,500 jobs in its operation, most of whom were commuters to the area. When the mining industry fell, the Superior economy went backwards but

when mining came back, the economy took off again. The population of the town fluctuated during that period and even the one-stop traffic light was unplugged when no mining was taking place. As the demand for copper became greater than its availability, the development of Resolution Mine became more critical to the advancement of electronic devices and equipment across the world. It was expected that over a billion pounds of copper would be mined each year, which would nearly meet 25% of the total U.S. copper production. Superior, Arizona, may not seem like much when you pass through it but its value lies in the mines surrounding and below it. And hopefully, the environment, landscape and protected wildlife will also continue to be protected to make Superior more than just a copper mining town...

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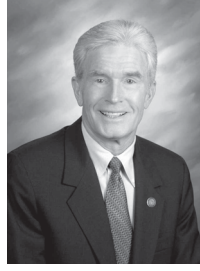


# What Is Your Real Risk Of Dying From COVID-19?

We have read that approximately 200,000 Americans who died during 2020 were infected with the Chinese Communist Party's coronavirus when they died. The obvious conclusion is that the num-

ber of deaths specifically caused by COVID-19 in the USA is unknown, but that reported USA COVID-19 caused death totals are certainly exaggerated.

What is known for certain is that most of the deaths in the USA which have been counted as COVID-19 deaths have been older people. In fact, about 80% of all domestic deaths counted as being COVID related have been people over age 65. And almost 98% of counted US COVID deaths have been people over age 45-year-old. Very few deaths under age 25 has been counted as a COVID death, which obviously begs the question about why schools are not all open again. Is it likely that continued shut-downs are mainly related to politics? That opinion was somewhat confirmed when the LA County Health Director recently stated: "Schools will not reopen until after the election".

Ignoring obviously overstated death rates attributed to COVID-19, statistics still indicate that 8 states (listed below) account for 59% of all reported (possible) Wuhan coronavirus deaths in the USA. The reported deaths per diagnosed case differences between four of these states and the

other 46 states are significant! Seeing the reported death rates below we wonder why some press commentary suggests that New York and nearby states did a good job controlling deaths in those specific states. Counted COVID-19 death rate statistics for those 8 highest total death count states (as of last week) follow. REPORTED COVID DEATHS AS OF 9/12/20 are shown in the middle column. COVID-19 Reported Death Rates (as a percent of reported cases) are shown to the right of each state's COVID-19 death counts.

New Jersey	16,027	- 8.1%
California	14,266	- 1.9%
Texas	14,279	- 2.1%
Florida	12,756	- 1.9%

Even with very high New York area death rates, and admitted under counting of COVID as the primary cause of death, the USA's average reported COVID death rate last week was 2.99%. That remains lower than the entire world's reported death rate of 3.21% (which we now know was counted differently, resulting in who knows how many fewer counted COVID-19 deaths outside of the USA).

# Your Money - Ask Julia

*Because the fires are far enough away that all we've gotten is some of the smoke, we did not see any necessity to do any disaster preparations. Now we're having earthquakes and are thinking we'd better do some planning. We're not interested in becoming survivalists or doomsday preppers, just short-term emergency planning. Where do we start?*

Do an online search for earthquake preparedness. FEMA has some very good information. Discuss your plans of action for minor and major damage to your residence. Will you stay home, or leave the area? What's your plan if there's a 3-day (or longer) power outage? Store a backpack with emergency supplies in your vehicle trunk in case you can't get home. Have some emergency cash on hand, as ATMs might not be an option.

*I lost my job as a restaurant manager. (Owner closed due to Covid, and isn't reopening.) How do I get a forbearance on my mortgage? And what happens when the forbearance ends?*

The CARES Act gives the opportunity for those who lost their job, got ill, or have other financial distress caused by Covid-19, to postpone rent or mortgage payments. Do not just stop making payments! Communicate with your mortgage holder/lender. Request a forbearance. You'll need to supply a hardship letter explaining your situation. If you're approved, your lender will supply an agreement which outlines the terms. Read that carefully to understand your options

for paying. Be aware of the interest rate being charged during that forbearance. Check to make certain the lender is obeying the CARES Act rule of not submitting any negative reports to the credit bureaus.

*Very late last night, I got a call from my grandchild saying they were in the hospital and needed me to get some money to them for treatment. Thankfully, my grandchild had come for a visit and was spending the night, so I knew this was a scam. Are there other scams I need to be aware of?*

Yes. The number of scams, especially against seniors, has escalated recently. Medicare is running ads regarding the scam of a friendly caller who asks for your Medicare number. The call from a grandchild urgently requesting emergency money, online emails and ads, an unsolicited (you did not ask for it) call from tech support regarding your internet or computer or log-in information for your bank, and fraudulent use of your medical benefits, are popular scams. Some have had their entire life savings stolen overnight! Seniors

tend to be more trusting and friendly to strangers, and therefore are easier for scammers to scam. Thank you for sharing your story. I'm so glad you were not scammed!

*We are in our mid-30s, recently married and have two incomes for one household. What are your suggestions as a good place to start our financial planning and saving for retirement?*

Write down a budget (all your income, and all your monthly and annual expenses). Agree on a definition of 'emergency,' and create a savings account just for emergencies. It should cover several month's expenses if there was no income, and unexpected car and home repairs. If you have debt (credit card, car loan, student loans), do whatever you can to pay them off. Then, each of you could look into depositing the maximum annual amount into Roth IRAs. Learn about different kinds of life insurance and get quotes. (That'll cover each of you in case one passes prematurely.) Some life insurance policies include a cash account often used for retirement income.

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## Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors Directs Assistance to Breweries Still Restricted by County Health Orders

*New grant program would help breweries and other small businesses that are closed under County Health Orders despite being allowed to open by the State.*

**LOS ANGELES COUNTY** - The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors approved a new \$10 million grant program to help breweries and other small businesses that have remained closed or restricted by LA County health officer orders despite being allowed to open under the State's health order.

Although breweries in Tier 1 counties have been allowed to open under the State's health order if they can partner with a food service, Los Angeles County's health officer order has kept

many local breweries that do not qualify as restaurants closed for on-site service to slow the spread of the virus.

The new grant program is included in a supplemental coronavirus relief fund spending plan being considered by the Board of Supervisors. The funding comes from Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act funding allocated to Los Angeles County by the federal government.

Small businesses that have remained closed or faced substan-

tial operating restrictions due to health officer orders will be eligible for the grant. Priority will be given to those small businesses subject to LA County health officer order restrictions that are more stringent than those required by State health officer order, such as breweries. These small businesses also include: wineries, family entertainment centers, and card rooms.

Information about how to apply for the grant will be forthcoming through the LA County Development Authority.

## LA County Supervisors Approve Foreclosure Prevention and Mortgage Assistance Program

**LOS ANGELES COUNTY** - The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors passed a proposal by Supervisor Janice Hahn and coauthored by Supervisor Hilda Solis to prevent foreclosures in LA County by connecting struggling homeowners with foreclosure prevention counseling and mortgage assistance.

"We have been able to make progress keeping renters in LA County in their homes during this crisis by implementing an eviction moratorium and putting \$100 million toward rent relief for families struggling to pay rent," said Supervisor Janice Hahn. "But homeowners are struggling too and without a concerted effort on the County's

part, we may be facing a wave of oncoming foreclosures and homelessness."

The program includes a two-pronged approach. The first is \$1.5 million allocated to assist homeowners facing foreclosure by connecting them with foreclosure prevention counselors who can assist with loan modifications, forbearance, and work with their lenders to keep them in their homes. The second is \$4 million allocated to creating a Mortgage Financial Relief Program which will provide deferred and forgivable loans to homeowners to help stabilize their mortgage with their loan servicer. The program will be targeted to assist areas of the County which have experi-

enced high levels of foreclosures.

"Housing is a human right and as a result of the economic fallout of this COVID-19 crisis, many impacted individuals and families are on the brink of experiencing homelessness through no fault of their own," said Los Angeles County Supervisor Hilda L. Solis. "In the midst of this unprecedented global pandemic, many workers in LA County are unemployed indefinitely, and one of the critical steps we can take right now is to keep them in their homes."

When the program is developed, services will be available through the Department of Consumer and Business Affairs.

## Los Angeles County Launches COVID-19 Safety Compliance Certificate Program

**LOS ANGELES COUNTY** - The County of Los Angeles launched the COVID-19 Safety Compliance Certificate Program (CSCCP) to help educate and train business owners to comprehensively implement the LA County Department of Public Health COVID-19 safety directives.

The CSCCP is a no-cost online training course that educates business owners on the essentials of the County Health Officer's Orders and what they need to do


to ensure that their business practices are aligned and in compliance with infection control and physical distancing requirements. After completing the training, businesses will receive a COVID-19 Safety Compliance Certificate that can be posted on storefronts. The training will be available in 13 languages and can be accessed online through the Department of Public Health's COVID-19 website.

This voluntary program offers

business, employees and consumers alike the added reassurance that essential training has been completed to reduce the spread of COVID-19. This training is highly recommended for both business owners and employees. Consumers are urged to look for a posted Safety Compliance Certificate at any businesses they visit. Businesses that do not participate are required to display Public Health COVID-19 Protocols in their storefronts.

**AZUSA** - On Saturday, September 19th, the Azusa Homeless Assistance Liaison Team Officers, along with members of Code Enforcement, and the US Army Corp of Engineers continued the ongoing efforts of cleaning up the San Gabriel Riverbed above Azusa.

During recent operations, several camps were cleared out with large skip loaders and dump trucks. Individuals contacted were again provided with information, resources and assistance.

Azusa Police officers worked with other law enforcement and homeless services, and partnered to assist the Army Corps of Engineers in cleaning a portion of the San Gabriel Riverbed.

This has been a major problem area with a large population of homeless people in the riverbed. They are known for committing many crimes in the area. Everything from car break-ins to home burglaries. They have been known to assault people during their crimes.

The homeless man was responsible for a large fire last month that cause evacuations of residents nearby.

There were some major health concerns with the filthy conditions as well as trash in the area. There are no sanitation facilities so they do their business anywhere they wanted.

Citizens and residents have been complaining for a long time about the conditions and

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# Governor Newsom Signs Bill Eliminating Barriers that Block Former Inmate Fire Crews from Becoming Career Firefighters After Serving their Sentences

**OROVILLE**—On Friday, September 11, at the site of the North Complex Fire, Governor Newsom signed AB 2147, a bill that eliminates barriers that prevent former inmate fire crews from pursuing a career as a firefighter once they served their time. Authored by Assemblymember Eloise Gomez Reyes, the bill allows nonviolent offenders who have fought fires as members of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation’s fire camps to have their records expunged, paving the way for individuals leaving fire camps to seek meaningful

employment and further training. “This legislation rights a historic wrong and recognizes the sacrifice of thousands of incarcerated people who have helped battle wildfires in our state, and I would like to thank the Legislature for passing this bill,” said Governor Newsom. “Signing AB 2147 into law is about giving second chances. To correct is to right a wrong; to rehabilitate is to restore,” said Assemblymember Gomez Reyes. “Rehabilitation without strategies to ensure the formerly incarcerated have a career is a pathway to

recidivism. We must get serious about providing pathways for those that show the determination to turn their lives around.” Despite their experience and qualifications, many formerly incarcerated firefighters struggle to obtain licenses and employment due to their criminal records. Under AB 2147, formerly incarcerated individuals can file a petition in county court to expunge their records and waive parole time, which will open career pathways in emergency response and a variety of other disciplines.

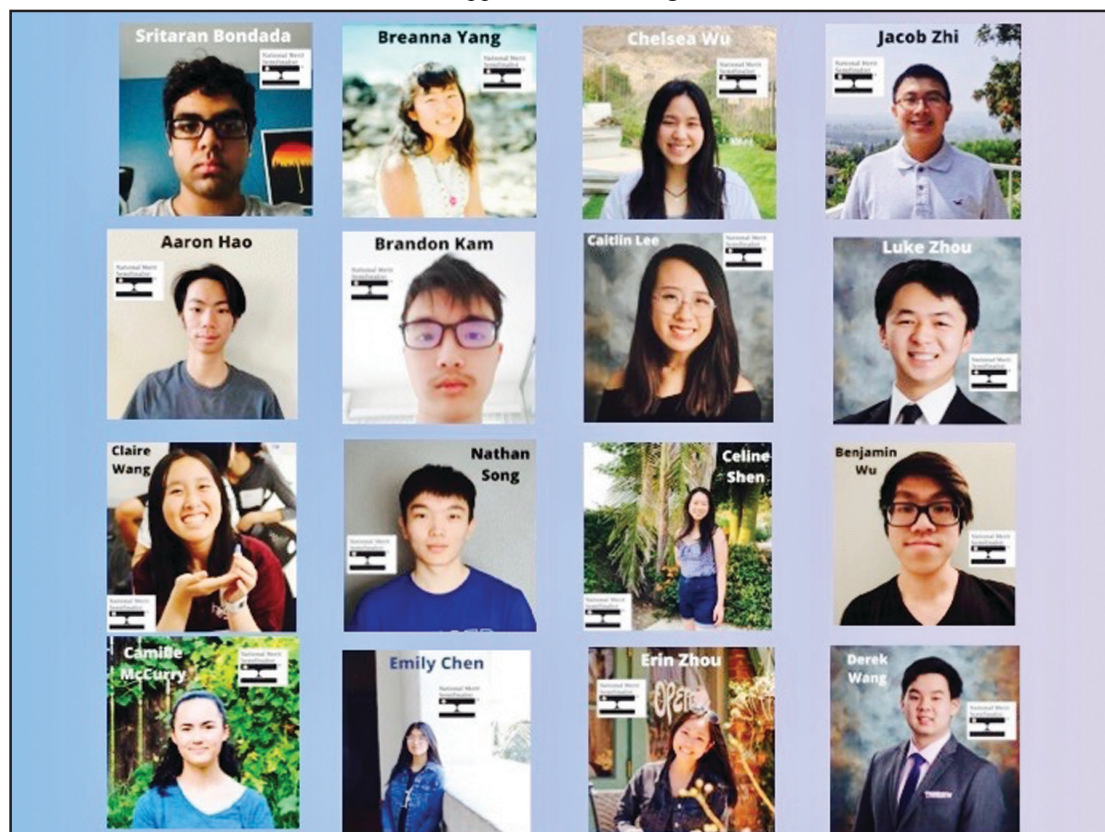
